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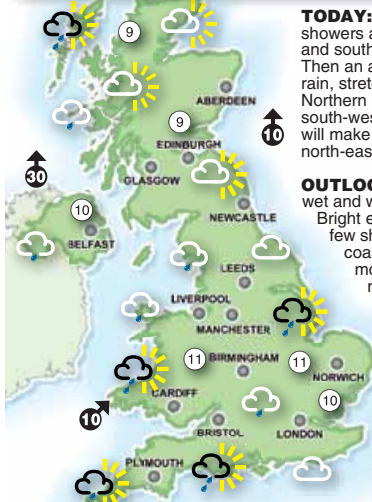

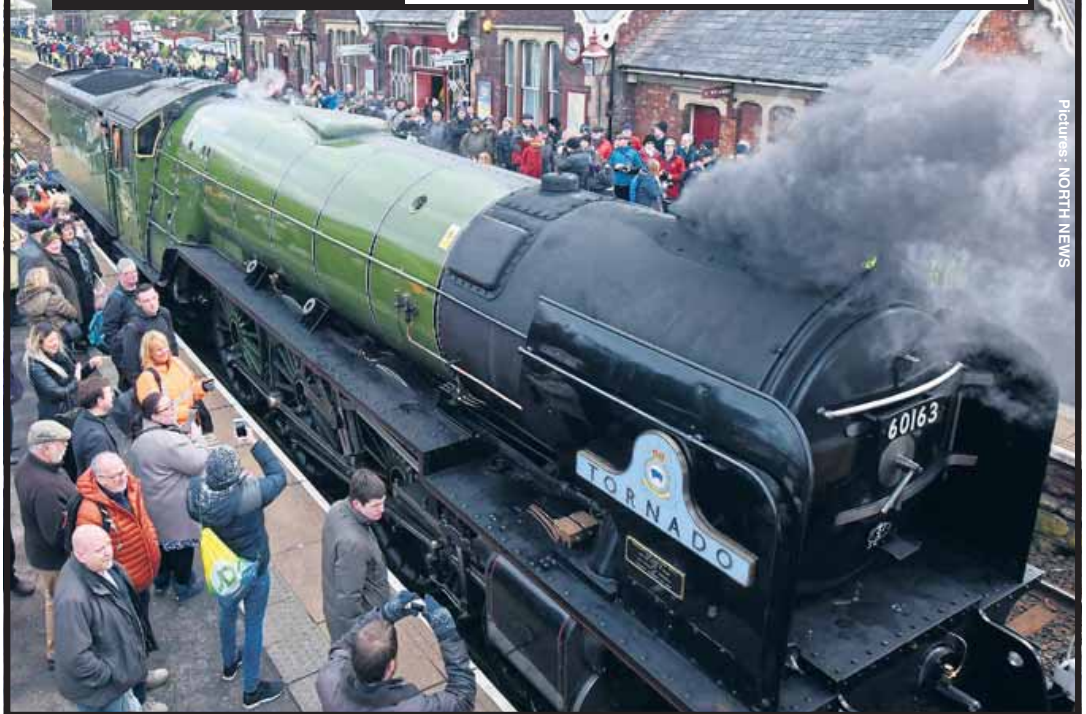

## Free hol plan to help our welfare

FREE holidays would save the NHS cash and help mental health, a conference heard.

Professor Scott McCabe said the UK Government should follow the lead of Spain and Scotland in helping people take breaks.

He said it would "reduce UK health and social care spending as well as boosting the industry off-season".

Prof McCabe told delegates at the Derby University tourism conference: "In Europe there is this idea that there is a right to have a holiday."

"We don't share that view in the UK but maybe we should start talking about that."

The professor added that research showed breaks "increased mental and physical health as well as self-esteem".

## Military shortfall

THE UK's spending on defence has dipped below Nato's target.

The International Institute for Strategic Studies said military spending was 1.98% of GDP in 2016, due to fast economic growth.

The target is 2% and the UK has previously urged other Nato members to meet that amount.

# MORE CASH? EU MUST BE KIDDING US

## UK's £18bn bill

**THE amount of cash Britain pays into the EU will rocket by a third before our Brexit deal goes through.**

Europrats have warned we will be hit with a £18billion bill before we cut our ties with Brussels in two years' time.

Britain's current £7.9bn membership bill will rise to £10.2billion by 2018/19 - a 29% rise. We are already due to pay £8.1bn in 2017/18.

As PM Theresa May continues to negotiate the terms of our exit, Tory MP Peter Bone called for the leaving process to be brought forward to avoid the "perverse" charges.

He added: "There is no reason why we should not be able to get out in a year and save £10billion."

Former Ukip leader Nigel Farage said: "The government's motto ought to be 'time is money' but no one seems to be in any hurry."

Meanwhile, the EU backed down from its previous Brexit forecast, admitting the UK's economy will continue to improve this year.

Branding the decision "truly shameful", more than 200 figures including Gary Lineker, Keira Knightley and Ralph Fiennes have signed an open letter to Theresa May. The letter has been backed by Help Refugees and Citizen UK's Safe Passage programme.

## Towie lover's baby turmoil

TOWIE star Cara Kilbey's partner told yesterday how he was arrested for being the alleged leader of a drugs gang two weeks after she gave birth to his child.

Daniel Harris, 33, said he decided to "settle down" with the reality TV star when she fell pregnant two months after they met.

He moved back from Spain to be with her.

But a fortnight after she had their baby daughter in March 2015 police arrested him.

They claimed he was the boss of a moped gang which distributed £500,000 a week of drugs across London over four years.

## Guilty of chopping off finger

A DJ is facing a jail term for chopping off a man's finger with a meat cleaver and posting it live on Snapchat.

Malachi Halstead, 35, drove Teerath Mann, 23, to a graveyard to hack off his finger off because he suspected he was stealing from him.

Cardiff Crown Court heard Halstead, known as DJ Madskie, then broadcast the finger on Snapchat saying: "See that? I chopped that off."

Heath Edwards, prosecuting, said Mr Mann was selling drugs for Halstead and lured him into his car before telling him: "Tonight you're losing something."

Halstead, of Newport, south Wales, was found guilty of wounding with intent and will be sentenced today.

**THE 10-year-old boy who was crushed to death by falling furniture in Topshop was last night named as Kaden Reddick.**

Kaden, of Reading, suffered a fatal head injury after an accident involving a store barrier, Thames Valley Police said.

The incident happened at Topshop in the town's Oracle shopping centre on Monday, leaving onlookers horrified.

Kaden's parents, Lisa Cooper Mallett and Ian Reddick, were being comforted by family and friends last night.

It is understood that Ian works at a funeral directors while Lisa is employed in HR for the RAF.

Kaden's aunt Chantelle said: "Kaden only ever made me laugh and smile. He had an infectious personality and the world is now truly missing the sweetest boy it could have asked for."

Tributes poured in on Facebook with dad Ian writing: "Love you my little man, it's hurting so much xx"

Lisa replied: "I feel you xxx"

Topshop at the time, said the store was evacuated and "the people that were inside were all crying".

Paramedics tried to treat Kaden in the store but he died later in hospital.

Police were treating his death as unexplained but not suspicious and a post-mortem was due to take place.

Reading Borough Council are also investigating and a spokesman described the death as a "tragic incident".

## Top cop fires off

OFFICERS in Britain's largest police force think more of them should be armed with Tasers.

But outgoing Met Police Commissioner Sir Bernard Hogan-Howe said officers were not "trigger-happy". He said armed police were deployed 3,300 times last year without firing a shot.

Sir Bernard spoke after a survey showed 75% of Met police think Tasers should be issued to all officers.

In his final speech, Sir Bernard said: "The public should be reassured that our police are well-trained and cautious in their use of force."

## Families e-chaos

MODERN technology is stopping families from spending time together, says a poll of 2,000 adults.

Around nine in 10 parents said the widespread use of mobile phones and laptops causes rifts in the home.

On a typical weekday, families spend just 36 minutes together. But adults spend almost two hours a day watching TV or going online.

The poll was carried out for Discover Ferries. A spokesman said: "Families who struggle to find time together face competition from modern technology and social media."

## Santa's ad OK'd

A TV ad showing Santa suffering from dementia has been cleared by advertising chiefs - after 36 viewers complained that it had upset their children.

The animated ad for Alzheimer's Research UK shows a little girl called Freya asking her dad why Santa Claus has stopped delivering presents.

A voice-over says: "He began to mix up presents and muddle names."

Alzheimer's Research UK said before the ad was made it polled 1,000 people, of whom 76% said it was 'acceptable' to show Santa suffering from dementia.

## George vice hell

BOY George claimed he was in the grip of a "psychotic episode" when he chained a male escort to a wall and beat him.

The Culture Club singer was sent to prison in 2009 for false imprisonment.

He spoke to Piers Morgan on his Life Stories show about the 2007 incident, saying: "In hindsight I was having a psychotic episode."

"I was a drug addict so I can't sit here and say my reasons for doing it were founded in any way."

"But I told the truth. I said: 'This is why I did it. I was having a paranoid episode.'"

**SHANNON Matthews' pervert former stepdad has been beaten up for the second time in a fortnight.**

Craig Meehan, Karen Matthews' ex-lover, was reportedly tracked down by an angry mob and battered outside his safe house.

Two weeks ago he was allegedly attacked by an angry parent after he moved less than 100 yards from a primary school.

It is the fifth time since vile Meehan was jailed for child porn possession in 2008 that his true identity has been unmasked.

The 30-year-old played no

part in Shannon's abduction, but a police search of his computer found sick graphic sex images of young children.

Meehan was only jailed for 20 weeks but, like Karen and accomplice Michael Donovan, has been in and out of hiding ever since his release.

He had been pictured earlier in the week

buying beer and scratch cards before he became a target for more angry locals.

And he was also recently spotted walking near shops accompanied by a woman near to where Shannon was found.

But now he may have to find yet another home.

A family friend said: "He was just getting used to coming out

again, going to the shops and the bookies, he was starting to get confident.

"Now that he's had a thumping at one of the places he felt safe, he feels scared and he's gone reclusive again."

The BBC's gripping drama The Moorside starring Sheridan Smith, about the faked abduction, has brought the story back into the public eye in recent weeks.

More than seven million people watched the first episode in which Meehan was portrayed as a strange loner obsessed with computers.

And despite Karen's attempt to paint Meehan as a violent rapist in court, the sick pervert has continued to declare his love for the evil mum.

## Troops compo curbs 'unfair'

THE father of a soldier killed by a roadside bomb in Iraq has branded Government proposals to cut legal protections for British troops "unfair".

The changes would prevent service personnel from suing the Ministry of Defence for negligence, leaving decisions about compensation to an MoD-appointed assessor.

Colin Redpath fought to sue the MoD over the 2007 death of his son, L/Cpl Kirk Redpath, 22, who died in Iraq when a bomb exploded next to his poorly-armoured Snatch Land Rover.

The dad told BBC Radio: "At the end of the day they [the MoD] are an employer. "The fire brigade, the police, the ambulance service, they all have to go out with equipment that works. And the right equipment. That should be the same for a soldier."

"If not, then what the MoD are saying is that we could send our boys and girls out with broomsticks. It wouldn't matter. There's no comeback."

Plans include a "no fault" compensation scheme for injured troops and family members of those killed.

## Tot shock for Emily

A CARE worker thought she had put on weight over Christmas - only to go into labour.

Emily Wackett, 21, had no idea she was pregnant and believed she had piled on the pounds due to festive over-indulgence.

She had stomach pains at work and her family dialled 999. But her baby boy was born in the back of the ambulance.

Emily, of Welborne, near Dereham, Norfolk, said: "I didn't know what was wrong."

## Rescuers shipshape

A COASTGUARD team that resigned over red tape returned to duty yesterday after a row with the Maritime and Coastguard Agency was resolved.

Members of Durness Coastguard search, in the Scottish Highlands, quit two weeks ago. "All issues have been resolved," said a MCA statement.

# Trump facing 'biggest demo ever' in Britain

## PM IGNORES 2M PETITION

**PROTESTERS have promised the "biggest demonstration in history" when President Trump makes his state visit to the UK.**

Yesterday, the Government dismissed a petition signed by nearly two million Brits calling for the invitation to be withdrawn.

MPs will discuss the document, as well as a rival 300,000-name petition in support, on February 20 as both reached the number of signatures to force debate.

But a statement from the Foreign Office said: "HM Government believes the president of the United States should be extended the full courtesy of a state visit."

"We look forward to welcoming President Trump once dates and arrangements are finalised."

"HM Government recognises the strong views expressed by the many signatories of this petition, but does not support this petition."

The Stop Trump campaign has called for massive protest rallies across the UK for the visit.

A spokesman said: "Nearly two million called on their Government not to roll out the red carpet for a man who has instigated a travel ban on Muslims and whose bigoted racist and sexist statements are well known."

"Theresa May has shown her contempt for people asking her to make a stand against racism and sided with a megalomaniac instead."

The Prime Minister has been criticised for offering Mr Trump a state visit just a week after his inauguration.

Barack Obama received an invitation after 758 days, while George W Bush got his after 978 days.

Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby waded into the debate by linking President Trump with fascism.

In a speech to the General Synod, he

said: "There are a thousand ways to explain Brexit or the election of President Trump or in France of Madame Le Pen and many others in a nationalist, populist or even fascist tradition of politics."

Meanwhile, Mr Trump's administration was plunged into further chaos as US national security adviser Michael Flynn resigned over allegations he discussed US sanctions with Russia before the new president took office. Mr

Flynn is said to have misled officials over his call with Russia's ambassador.

Lawyer Susan Hennessey said: "The resignation validates the suspicions something is seriously amiss with regards to Trump's ties to Russia."

But there was better news for Mr Trump as his new Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin, a former Goldman Sachs banker, was sworn in.

## Nuttall's error on tragedy

UKIP leader Paul Nuttall has admitted claims he lost close pals in the Hillsborough disaster are false.

On Liverpool's Radio City Talk yesterday, he was asked about a statement on his website that he had lost "close personal friends" in the 1989 tragedy.

He replied: "I haven't lost a close personal friend, I've lost someone who I know."

Mr Nuttall said he did not know who had written the claims which appeared on his website in 2011 when he joined calls for the release of government files.

He said: "I haven't put that out - that is wrong."

The Guardian has said a childhood pal and a former teacher could not recall Mr Nuttall ever saying he had been at the game where 96 Liverpool fans died. He was 12 at the time.

The Ukip candidate in next week's Stoke by-election, Mr Nuttall has said he was at the match with his father and two uncles.

He has accused The Guardian of having "twisted" the story.

## Suspect held in Isis raid

A SUSPECTED Islamic State terrorist has been arrested in Gran Canaria. Police claim he was ready to carry out an attack.

The 33-year-old illegal Moroccan immigrant was detained after what authorities described as a "significant increase in his level of radicalisation in a short space of time."

He had been under surveillance since 2012 and was held in Las Palmas.

A Spain interior ministry spokesman said: "He constituted a potential threat to national security, having expressed his clear intention to carry out a sizeable terrorist act."

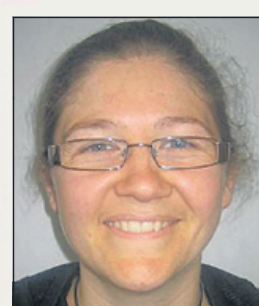

**ONE-EYED killer Dale Cregan claimed his third police victim when an officer who witnessed the aftermath of his crimes hanged himself.**

PC Andrew Summerscales, 46, plunged into a "dark place" after being one of the first on the scene of Cregan's gun and grenade murders of policewomen Fiona Bone, 32, and Nicola Hughes, 23.

The bobby, who as a Liverpool fan survived the Hillsborough disaster, sought counselling over the horror he witnessed.

But he became disillusioned with his job, quit the force after 14 years and was found hanging from a children's climbing frame at a park near his home in Stalybridge, Gtr Manchester, on August 30 last year. He had sent

several goodbye texts and emails to friends.

The officer had found another man hanging at the same spot a year earlier. Recording a suicide verdict, coroner Joanne Kearsley told an inquest in Stockport there was "no doubt" PC Sum-

merscales had 'suffered tragedies throughout his life' including Cregan's murder of his two colleagues in 2012.

The inquest heard the dad-of-one, a former butcher, joined Greater Manchester Police in 2001. But his girlfriend Carly

Weston, who had dated him since 2005, said he changed following the murders of WPCs Bone and Hughes.

Cregan, 33, who was already on the run for two other murders, lured them to his hideout in Mottram in Longdendale, Gtr

Manchester, with a bogus 999 call about a burglary.

He then gunned them down in cold blood and threw a grenade on to their bodies.

The drug dealer, who lost his left eye in a fight in Thailand, is serving a whole-life sentence in Ashworth psychiatric hospital in Merseyside for four murders and three attempted murders.

Ms Weston said PC Summerscales "was in a dark place and struggled to cope with what had happened. He spent 12 months on sick leave.

"I did try to get him to engage with a mental health team but he wouldn't go and we separated eight months later. When he returned to work he was very disillusioned and said he didn't like the job any more."

## Officer filled own death report

**BEFORE killing himself PC Summerscales filled in his own death report on official police paperwork found in his pocket.**

He also wrote out a body identity tag. There were no drugs or alcohol in his system.

GP Marie Ellis said PC Summerscales had no history of low moods until the Cregan murders, following which he was prescribed anti-depressants for post traumatic stress

disorder. "He was adjusting to a very difficult situation that he found himself in," she said.

Police psychiatrist Dr Michael Rogerson said PC Summerscales had told him he had "too much time to ruminate on events" and admitted having suicidal thoughts.

When re-examined he was 'improved', wanted to return to work and told the psychiatrist he was 'feeling like he had turned a corner'.

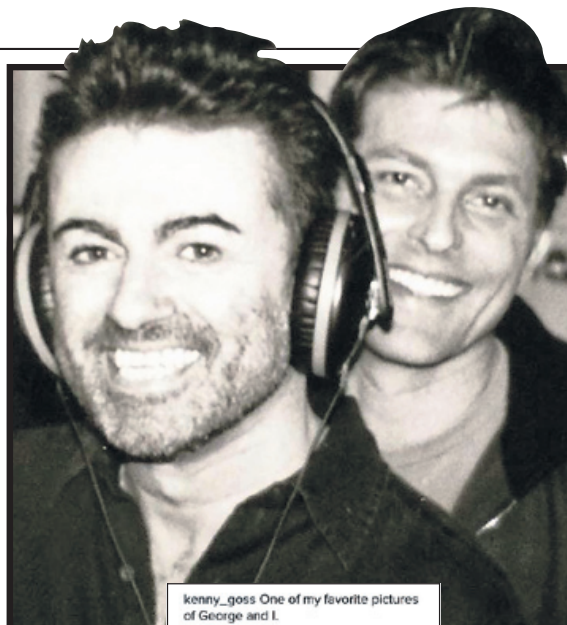

## It's last orders for 1 in 5 pubs

PUBS are closing at the rate of four a day, it was revealed yesterday.

More than 11,000 boozers – one in five – have shut their doors in the last six years.

There is now the lowest number of pubs ever in England and Wales at 43,231, down from 54,674 in April 2010.

CVS, which carried out the study, said high business rates were a major factor. And there are fears more pubs, as well as firms in other sectors, will suffer as rates are revalued in April. Mark Rigby, from CVS, said rates were based on outdated valuations and “not reflective of current circumstances”.

A government spokesman said: “Following the revaluation, three quarters of properties will see no change or even a fall in their bills, and the small minority of businesses that face an increase will benefit from our £3.6billion transitional relief scheme.”

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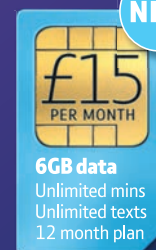
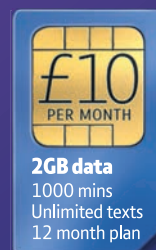
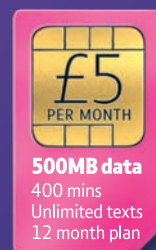
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
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## Agony mum's £260k compo

The Southampton mum's solicitor Nick Fairweather added: "The damages compensate Mandy for post-traumatic stress disorder she has suffered on account of finding Hannah. She has been left unable to work and in need of care."

An inquest heard claims that Southampton University student Hannah, who had previously attempted suicide, was called "a f\*\*\*ing waste of space" by an NHS worker on the day of her death.

Julie Dawes, of Southern Health NHS Foundation Trust, said she could not comment on settlements but added: "I apologise again on behalf of the trust for letting Miss Groves down in 2012 with such tragic consequences."

THE man suspected of killing fellow Brit Daryl Bhandal in Tenerife has been remanded in custody. John Vout, 27, appeared in court on Monday. Vout's girlfriend Michelle Petersen, also 27, was released on bail.

The pair were allegedly involved in a fight with Mr Bhandal at a hotel bar in Puerto de Santiago in the early hours of Saturday.

He died in hospital soon after suffering severe head injuries. Vout was bitten during the fight, losing part of his lower lip.

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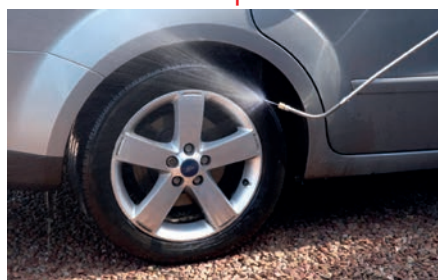

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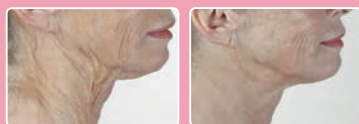
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# Get Fit CURB THE CURVES

## Fat's NOT right

**HE has been dubbed the Simon Cowell of the weight loss world and now controversial TV guru Steve Miller is calling for fat models to be banned from the catwalk.**

The acid-tongued star says: "We need to stop the 'fatwalk' on the catwalk."

Steve, presenter of Sky's Fat Families, says the trend for plus-size models, such as Tess Holliday, 31, is in danger of normalising being overweight.

He explains: "We're promoting the idea that being 'curvy' is acceptable - that fat isn't ugly. But we need to tackle the issue head on. 'Fat isn't beautiful' - it kills you. Obesity causes cancer, heart disease and diabetes."

Steve says he is in favour of "constructive fat shaming", adding: "It's OK to tell someone to their face they are fat, as long as you're trying to help them rather than simply to be cruel. We need to be more honest."

"I've never met anyone who, when you really get down to it, is happy about being fat."

And he has a tough three-point plan that he wants introduced for the sake of public health, believing that traditional health initiatives encouraging people to slim have failed.

He says: "First I want overweight staff in the NHS to be encouraged to wear badges stating: 'I'm fat but I'm losing it.'"

"And if you are a GP or dietician and fat yourself you should be made to take action to lose weight and, if you don't, ultimately dismissed. These people



are role models after all. I would like menus in restaurants to have the words: 'If you are fat, think before you order' on the top.

"If that made just 1% of people think about what they are eating we'd be saving lives."

"Thirdly the government should legislate against groups, like those on Twitter, promoting the idea that being fat is acceptable."

One of Steve's other bugbears is diets.

He says: "As a nation we

have become obsessed with them but also very confused. I would ban them.

"The real issue when it comes to losing weight is tackling mindset and motivation."

Steve, who runs Weight Loss Master, gets his own clients to follow an 80-20 rule where they eat healthily 80% of the time and what they want for 20%.

He says: "I look at what people are eating. If they are having two bottles of wine a week I get them to

have one bottle and say replace the other one with low-calorie squash.

"Or if they are having two takeaways a week, replace one with a healthier meal."

He also uses hypnosis: "I take their passion for say, binge eating late at night to try to turn it into a passion for, say, taking up a new hobby."

Steve himself decided to lose his own flab when he looked in the mirror and was appalled by his own man boobs.

He shed four stone, down to 11 stone, by following the 80/20 rule, doing hypnotherapy and walking.

"Stop faddy exercise - just walk for pleasure."

Now Steve plans to write to PM Theresa May calling for tougher measures on obesity adding: "It's time to stop being afraid of the F-word."

● Never diet. Eat 80% healthily and 20% of the time have what you fancy.

● When you look at bad food say: "I am repulsed by you."

● Make motivational signs and put them up in prominent places.

She says: "I was hurt but I knew it was the truth."

Jo, married to contractor Phil, 44, says she joined slimming clubs and tried countless diets without success.

She explains: "The weight just went back on." So after

seeking help from Weight Loss Master, yourweightlossmaster.co.uk, she lost two stone in just six weeks.

The 42-year-old adds: "The hypnosis was key to changing how I thought about food."

"I stopped grazing, ate three proper meals a day and followed the 80/20 rule."

Two years on, she is down to 10st 10lb, dropping from an 18 dress size to a svelte size 10.

Jo, from Salcombe, Devon, says: "I've got so much more energy and I'm fitter too."

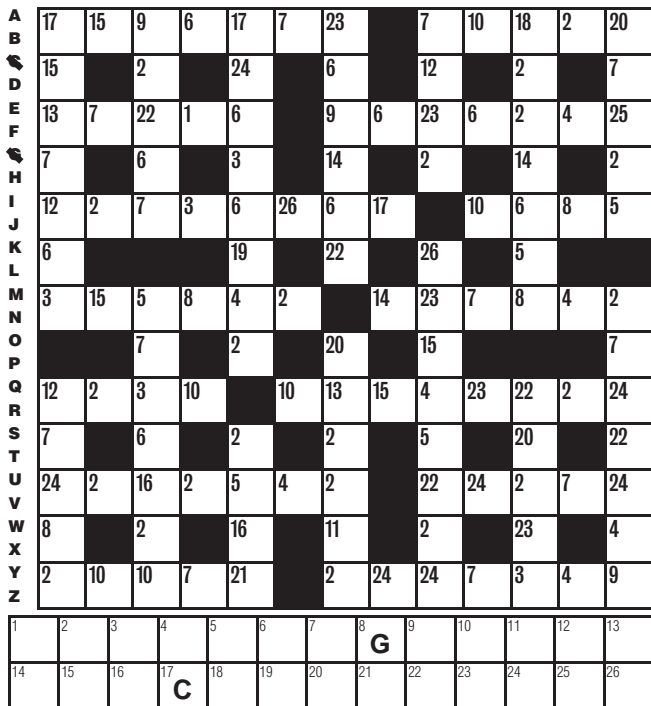

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# LOOKS GRAND FOR DON

**GORDON ELLIOTT is confident about Don Poli's prospects in the Randox Health Grand National after the weights were announced last night.**

Don Poli, 16-1 joint-favourite with The Last Samuri, is set to carry 11st 7lb in the world's most demanding steeple chase, which takes place at Aintree on April 8.

"The race looks made for him," enthused Elliott, below.

"I was expecting that sort of weight. I was delighted with his run at Leopardstown on Sunday in the Irish Gold Cup when he was third.

"He could have done with a stronger gallop. But he's come out of race in great nick."

Elliott took over the training of Don Poli this season after Ryanair boss Michael O'Leary decided to move all his horses from Willie Mullins.

The eight-year-old showed he was class act after running a cracking race in last year's Cheltenham Gold Cup when third to Don Cossack.

He had earlier beaten the 2015 Grand National winner Many Clouds at Aintree.

Elliott has a staggering 14 entries in the race and is 6-1

with Hills to take the prize. "I will run as many as I can," he said.

"Of course the prize money is very good and it's a race we've won in the past (Silver Birch 2007) and I would love to win it again.

"Uccello Conti (10st 7lb) and Cause Of Causes (10st 8lb) are on good marks," said Elliott.

"The Outlander [top weight with 11st 10lb] is probably my Gold Cup horse. I should think I will run at least six.

"At the moment Don Poli is my best chance as it looks an ideal race for him."

The Last Samuri, runner up to Rule The World in last year's race, has received a hefty hike in the weights from the handicapper Phil Smith.

The Kim Bailey-trained nine-year-old has 11lb more to carry this time.

But Vieux Lion Rouge, eighth home 12 months ago, looks to be on a favourable mark.

The David Pipe-trained gelding again showed his liking for the demanding course when taking the Becher Chase at Aintree in December.

On that occasion he had The Last Samuri back in third place. He looks the each-way value at 25-1.

## Wigan win vital for cup's future

**WIGAN** owner Ian Lenagan has warned Super League sides to earn the right to go toe-to-toe with the giants of the NRL.

Only two Aussie clubs have agreed to take part in this year's World Club Challenge after English sides have flopped in recent years.

Super League has suffered a 6-0 whitewash in the last two years, when the competition was expanded to three games a year.

In the main event between the champions of both hemispheres, Australian sides have won six of the last seven showdowns.

### Fault

The competition's future could be at stake when champions Wigan take on Cronulla on Sunday, a day after Warrington host Brisbane in a friendly.

But Lenagan says there is no point in bleating about the fading interest from the NRL, claiming Super League clubs had to prove they were worth taking on each year.

He said: "I think we have to earn the right to play more games. The fact that we have lost six in a row is our fault, it is not the NRL's fault."

"What is the point of expanding something that has not been successful? In that respect I am pleased it is only back to two games."

"The pull of the big teams in Australia is very strong but we have got to win first and that is Wigan's objective on Sunday. It is

time we won it. It is crucial for us to measure how we have improved."

Wigan offered to play the game in Australia and Lenagan (right) believes the competition will see Super League clubs regularly travel Down Under.

He said: "I think that would be great for Super League and rugby league in general."

"I am completely convinced that there is an appetite and the more we can open the eyes of the Australians properly to

the international club arrangement, the better."

"We have to maintain that international club football is one of the most important routes forward. I passionately believe that."

Warrington coach Tony Smith agrees that it would help the

competition to play the games in Australia.

And he added: "We could play a round of Super League there."

"I think there would be interest if it was promoted the right way and put on in the right cities."

Warrington should have Kev Brown and Ben Westwood back from injury to face Brisbane.

## Ford is on road back to Tigers

**LEICESTER TIGERS** have re-signed Bath's England fly-half George Ford for the start of next season, with Freddie Burns moving in the opposite direction.

Ford, 23, had been contracted to Bath until the end of the 2017-18 season but Leicester have bought him out of the final year of his deal.

Ford came out of Leicester's academy but left to join Bath in 2013. Followed fly-half Burns, 26, joined the Tigers from Gloucester in 2014 after starting his career with Bath.

Ford, who won his 32nd England cap in the Six Nations victory over Wales on Saturday, said: "This hasn't been an easy decision but I feel it is the best one for me at this time."

"I have really enjoyed my time at Bath and have worked with some incredible players and coaches at the club."

"And I know I have developed hugely as a player because of that."

### Better

Meanwhile, Wales kicking coach Neil Jenkins believes Dan Biggar would be a better fit for the Lions next summer than England star Owen Farrell.

Wales and Lions coach Warren Gatland's side face the All Blacks in a huge three-Test series.

But despite also facing competition from Ireland's Johnny Sexton, Wales believe their man Biggar should start at fly-half.

Ospreys ace Biggar impressed in Saturday's defeat after brushing off a rib injury, and Jenkins said: "I thought Dan was huge against England."

"I thought he had a massive game and his all-round contribution was massive, both in attack and defence."

"Dan is easily good enough for the Lions, there's no doubt about it. "We've got a lot of good 10s in the UK at this moment in time."

"I am sure Gats and the staff will have a good few headaches when the time comes for selection."

"There are a lot of big games to come yet and it will be very interesting to see how it unfolds."

"But I'm biased and I'm a massive fan of Dan Biggar - and he would certainly fit into any Lions squad."

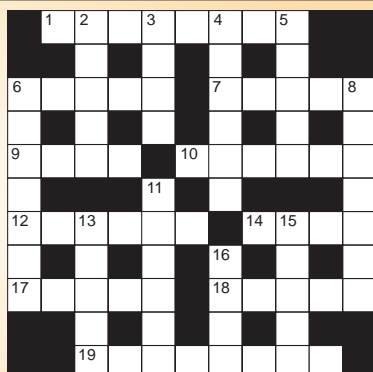

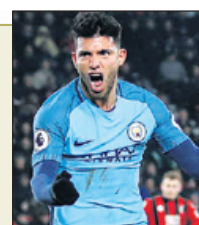

## Klopp's Wijn-ing formula

GEORGINIO WIJNALDUM praised manager Jurgen Klopp for not "killing" his faltering players during Liverpool's nightmare start to 2017.

Saturday's victory over Tottenham ended a winless start to the year and the Dutch forward said Klopp's declaration that he still had faith in his stars was vital.

"If you have a few poor games in a row you are going to put pressure on yourself of, 'We have to win this one or this and this will happen'."

"I think we were too busy thinking about the consequences than concentrating on the game."

"Last week we were only concentrating on Tottenham – how we can play against them, how we can hurt them and so on. The focus was different than a few weeks before."

Liverpool are on a warm weather training break due to a free weekend following their FA Cup exit. They next play at struggling Leicester a week on Monday.

After defeats this season against Burnley, Bournemouth, Swansea and Hull, Wijnaldum admitted his side has to perform against the Premier League's strugglers as they do the front runners.

He said: "We did it in most of the big games but in other games we didn't deliver. That was the biggest problem. There was a lot of pressure on us because only in the biggest games have we shown how good we are."

"In December and January it wasn't good. Against the smaller teams we didn't deliver. That was a bad thing."

## Wenger's stuck by flops too long says Hamann

**DIETMAR HAMANN has more European honours than Arsenal can boast in their entire history.**

Former Bayern and Liverpool midfielder Hamann won UEFA Cups in 1996 and 2001 and the Champions League in 2001.

A hammering at mighty Bayern Munich tonight in the first leg of their Champions League knockout phase could spell another trophyless season for Arsene Wenger's men.

And Hamann believes Arsenal have gone soft and Wenger can't hack it in Europe, saying: "Resilience is a key ingredient and they simply don't have it any more.

"I thought the two FA Cups would kick-start Arsenal's trophy-winning habits. I thought that was the monkey off their backs.

"But now, after another potential title-winning bid has gone out of the window, once again we are asking ourselves if Arsene Wenger is even a Champions League manager?

"I would not discredit the players but he has too many that he has persisted with for years and years.

"I was a big fan of Theo Walcott and Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain when they came to Arsenal.

"But they have too many players who have gone there and not improved. I don't think Walcott turned out to be the player we thought he would be.

"Some of these players have not done it in the big games but, rightly or wrongly, Wenger has stuck with them.

"Loyalty is a big thing in football and too often there is not enough of it but sometimes there can be too much.

"It is very hard to knock the man but there might be a reason why players don't improve as they should do under Arsene. They do not work

enough and he maybe sticks with them too long.

"Players at Arsenal are very happy with the manager. Mesut Ozil is the prime example.

"He even said he would not sign a new contract until he knew the future of the manager.

"They have got into the comfort zone. 'We finish fourth, we lose in the last 16, the gaffer's happy, the club is happy'.

"Okay, they have had some tough draws but Chelsea found a way with only 10 men at the Nou Camp against Barcelona on the way to winning the Champions League.

"Sometimes you have to have the resilience just to grind things out. Arsenal simply cannot do that.

"Arsenal have had so many misses that it becomes a psychological problem.

"They may have won their group this time, but as soon as Bayern Munich came out of the draw, it was, 'Here we go again'."
