



Baseball bozos








Coddled on Campus


Reports of His Death Greatly Exaggerated

Needless to say, the Paul-is-dead hoax was a lot more fun than some meme prematurely saying that Charlie Sheen overdosed.




The "Crying Jordan Face" is the meme that just keeps on giving. The tearful image of Jordan, first snapped at his 2009 induction in to the Basketball

Built for the sheer thrill of the ride, McLaren's track-racing-inspired supercar flies from zero to 60 in 2.9 seconds and reaches a top speed of 204 miles per hour. The twin-turbo, 3.8-liter, twin-turbo-charged V-8 engine cranks out 562 horse-power, propelling fun and speed to new horizons.

The rear-wheel drive, fed by a sequential, seven-speed gearbox keeps the accelerations smooth and powerful, while the engine's 443 pounds per foot of torque and 8100 rpm capability ensures a deeply satisfying rumble.

At less than 3,200 pounds, the 570 is a sleek, light sport-car owner's dream. Or if you don't have \$187 Gs to spare, maybe convince a wealthy friend it's what they need.


