# ***Introduction***

In the beginning, our ancient ancestors created artwork and text, pictographs and hieroglyphics, and each created work was an original.

With the invention of the printing press, mass production of copies of any original work became possible. Creativity exploded worldwide. As costs came down, the ability of people to share art and printed communication created a virtual torrent of knowledge and information.

It is always the creativity of individuals— inventors, innovators and visionaries—that leads the way.

The invention of radio and television created instantaneous mass communication. Each broadcast meant that anyone with a receiver would receive a simultaneous copy of the original work. Recording devices allowed copies to be literally frozen in time, for later playback.

In 1958, Jack St. Clair Kilby invented the integrated electronic circuit, or microchip. His invention paved the way for the miniaturization of computers and the birth of the Internet. Once again, another creative individual influenced and changed the world.

And so it was with the invention of the popular personal computer or PC. The Apple computer, one popular example, was born in 1975. Two teenagers in California were largely responsible for its success.

The Apple was designed by Steve Wozniak to demonstrate to his local computer club, and when a store ordered 50 of them, he and his friend, Steve Jobs, began production. The Apple II and its clones revolutionized the lives of millions of people throughout the United States and Canada.

The low price of PCs brought them within reach of highly creative and talented young people in their teens and twenties. For the first time, the power previously available only to multinational corporations and governments was suddenly available to the public.

Apple computer clubs swept the continent. Here, in monthly meetings, computer enthusiasts could meet to excitedly discuss new ideas and try out new experiments and programs.

Still, one thing was missing. And that missing something created a truly formidable challenge.

These avid computer club enthusiasts and other PC users wanted to go far beyond their local clubs and neighborhoods. They wanted nothing less than to be able to communicate globally, and exchange ideas with other young people all over the world.

To do this, they needed to cross language and geographical barriers, and political boundaries. It also had to be free, or almost free. How on earth could all these creative people—potentially millions of people scattered around the globe—share information and communicate with each other?

A large part of the answer came during a remarkable four-year period, from 1991 to 1994. A visionary scientist named Tim Berners-Lee, working in Geneva, Switzerland, created a shared information space which allowed communication among a group of research scientists. These scientists needed the ability to retrieve information regardless of the variety of computer platforms that were in use at the time.

Berners-Lee's real intent, however, even in his first proposal in 1989, went far beyond the needs of the physicists he worked with. He envisioned nothing less than a worldwide communication system for public use. And from 1995 onwards, the World Wide Web literally skyrocketed in popularity.

True, there were many Internet protocols being developed as early as the late 1960s, particularly by the U.S. military, and small nets were being used at an early date. It was the public's demand, however, that exploded the Internet into the real global phenomenon it has now become.

Today, the distinction has become blurred between the Internet and the World Wide Web (www). In this book I will often use the words interchangeably, but generally speaking, the word Internet will always include the World Wide Web.

The idea of retrieving information was paramount for the scientists in Switzerland when the World Wide Web was born, and it is still paramount. Remember this: everything that we call human history is simply what individuals have done, whether they acted alone or in a group. And retrieving information about individuals, precisely and accurately, is what this book is all about.

The Internet opened up tremendous resources that are extending deep within all fields of knowledge. The most remote details from the ancient past are coming alive at an unbelievable rate. New discoveries in the present are being added as they occur. Timelines become blurred: the first part of this sentence is already in the past.

New information is accumulating at a stupendous rate. It cannot be fathomed by any one person. It is unprecedented. Nobody, not even governments, can stay on top of it.

Every day hundreds of millions of new facts become available. Those who delve too deeply into the

information world find themselves speaking of a new disease – information overload.

This book is designed to provide you with the specific techniques that allow you to find and identify almost any individual, whether that person lived a hundred years ago, a thousand years ago, or even if that person is alive and living in our world today. This book will also provide you with the tools you need for navigation as the Internet unfolds.

You will also be sharing a vision of where the information highway is heading, what type of traffic it will have in the future and why.

To clearly see that future vision, we must first explore some unknown ancient history about ourselves.

This ancient history is quite well hidden. It is unknown to the vast majority of people in the world today. That, however, is all about to change.

# *Our Hidden History*

## **Homo Sapiens at Dawn**

The birth of modern man begins many thousands of years ago. Scholarly ancient history books along with recent archaeological discoveries have told us far more today than what was known just one generation ago. It is for certain, however, that our beginnings are rooted in small tribal groups or clans.

The members of these tribes are truly our ancient ancestors. If they did not exist, then we would not exist today.

Recent discoveries are making it clear, however, that if we do not relearn some basic truths about our ancient past, our civilization today will most likely collapse—not in some distant future like some have imagined—but perhaps within our lifetime. If society and governments incur great errors, it will be partly because we forgot where we came from.

Many historians have studied the differences between ancient tribes. Emphasizing differences is only half the story, however, and focusing just on differences alone may be misleading.

After all, if you focus just on the differences between you and your own siblings, without understanding

the similarities and common elements, it might result in a fight. If we focus on differences only between nations, but without understanding, it could—and has in countless instances—led to war and destruction.

Instead of differences, let us look at the similarities between all of the ancient tribes, and see if we can pick up some new understanding. Remember: many of these tribes developed, seemingly unknown to each other, on several continents. And yet there were three major similarities between all of them. It is the similarities that provide important and crucial clues about our own nature, characteristics and origin.

## 1. Kinship

All early tribes were characterized by a strong energy-bond we call kinship. Each member of the tribe felt a strong sense of belonging. They shared a powerful family feeling. This bond created a strong rapport and affinity between each member of the tribe. They knew how they were all related to each other. They understood this on very deep levels and felt that relationship emotionally. It was a constant.

## 2. A Common Ancestor

Early tribes all carried, from generation to generation, the verbal story of a common ancestor. The common ancestor was seen as the tribe's founder, head or chief.

He was viewed as the ancestor from whom they had all descended. This shared belief strengthened the kinship feeling among every member of the tribe and provided a sense of purpose and value to the very existence of the tribe itself. Every man, woman and child felt this force: they had a common ancestor.<sup>1</sup>

### 3. Shared Religious Beliefs

Shared religious beliefs, regardless of what other groups believed, acted as a unifying force, and strengthened the feeling of oneness among each member of the tribe. It also helped to ensure the probability and protection of their descendants.

## **The Rise of the Nation-State**

As tribes grew larger and larger through the centuries, they would encounter other tribes, and if friendly enough they might coexist and engage in trade, or even form alliances against an invading tribe that appeared to be a common threat. Some encounters, however, were more like clashes, and the differences in beliefs and symbols spawned a multitude of rivalries, conflicts and wars.

Those that prevailed in wars, whether by physical might or intelligence, formed what we call nation-states. This led to formation of countries and nations, usually led by monarchs, demigods, emperors or dictators. The

important thing to remember about this development is that the oneness or family feeling that previously was a common characteristic of each tribe was gradually displaced within this new framework of society. The feeling of kinship declined as nation-states continued to move aggressively up through the hallways of time and into the future, eventually reaching what we now call our lifetime.

Now we have arrived in our present world. Countless conflicts are going on around the world. We sense many threats to our future existence. Yet these impending threats are mixed in with the hopes of the majority of people who wish for a more peaceful life in the future, along with reasonable prosperity.

It is during this time, in just slightly more than a decade, that the Internet has flourished. Like any new tool or invention, it has the potential for great harm, or great benefit. It really depends on how it is used.

The Internet is part of the new media along with television and a plethora of electronic gadgets.

The media forms our new community. The electronic village is our hometown. . . . We know celebrities but they don't know us. The new community is not a reciprocal neighborhood like earlier ones. These vicarious relations help create *a new kind of*

*loneliness*—the loneliness of people whose relationships are with personae instead of persons.<sup>2</sup>

## The Discovery of Ebla

Ebla is typical of the archaeological discoveries that keep changing our previous concepts about early civilization and bring a wealth of new information to light.

For 15 years archaeologists had been digging in the mounds of an ancient civilization on the plain of Syria. The dig took place between ancient Egypt and the Mesopotamian empire.

Then, in 1968, the archives of an ancient city-state were unearthed, revealing 15,000 clay tablets covered in an unknown cuneiform writing. At first, none of the experts were able to translate the writing, even though there are almost 7,000 known living languages in the world today.<sup>3</sup>

A little later, the archaeologists made yet another fortunate discovery. They found a unique set of tablets within the archive that showed the unknown Eblamite words along with the equivalent words in Sumerian.

By good fortune, Sumerian was a language that was understood by language experts. Suddenly they had the key to understanding this unknown language.

Incidentally, these translation tablets formed the oldest dictionary or lexicon ever discovered on our planet.

Armed with the key to deciphering the Eblamite tablets, the experts began the unprecedented task of translation. No archaeologists had ever encountered 15,000 clay tablets that required translation.

In the words of Dr. Giovanni Pettinato, an expert in ancient languages who had participated in the Italian Archaeological Mission in Syria,

All the other texts of this period recovered to date do not total a fourth of those from Ebla.<sup>4</sup>

A remarkably clear view of daily life in ancient Ebla began to unfold. The records being translated cover trade, commerce and the historical chronicles of this ancient empire. The details include over 5,000 geographical place-names. In essence, Ebla is rewriting much of history in that part of the ancient world.

Among thousands of people recorded in the tablets is the name of David, which has never been found in such ancient texts except the Bible. The large number of genealogical references include the names of Abraham, Esau, Saul and a King Ebrium, who was believed by some scholars to be Eber, the great-great-grandson of

Noah. Ebla's scribes had even kept track of the names of the people just traveling through their country.

In the Old Testament of the Bible, the Book of Deuteronomy refers to Abraham's grandfather as being a Syrian. These discoveries have excited and mystified scholars of Judaism, Christianity and Islam, and have left historians thinking anew about the formative years of ancient civilization.

Although the discovery of Ebla is fascinating, it is just one of a multitude of other discoveries coming to light all over the world. Some recent discoveries are nothing short of astonishing.

For example, more than 400,000 fragments of scrolls, books and papyrus were found in a 30-foot deep city dump near Oxyrhynchus, an ancient provincial capital in Egypt that dates from Roman times. Some of these fragments are more than 2,000 years old. Another large deposit of fragments from an ancient library has also been found in Herculaneum. The fragments are covered with grime, soot and ash—the result of volcanoes and fires.

Now, thanks to NASA technology and innovative scientists, enhanced multispectral imaging allows researchers to see through multiple layers of these fragments, even black upon black layers, to actually see the original writing clear enough to read, reconstruct and recreate as modern images.

Texts from these two cities now being translated include property records, New Testament epistles, early Islamic writings and fragments of lost plays by Euripides, Sophocles, and unknown works by the most famous classical writers and poets of antiquity.<sup>5</sup> Only 20 years ago many historians would have thought such scientific achievements were utterly impossible.

Many of the missing pieces of our true and ancient history are now coming to light. The shape of history is altering so quickly and on such a large scale that the authors of our history books are hard-pressed to stay abreast of the changes that follow each new major discovery.

Let me put it this way: the new revelations of science and archaeology require constant updating of our textbooks if we are to live in an aware and educated society.

## **The Discovery of Cousinhood**

Consider this opening phrase of a poem published in 1670 by John Wilmot:

The world appears like a great family.<sup>6</sup>

Later, in 1839, William Blackstone published a classic work entitled *Commentary on the Laws of England*.<sup>7</sup> In his research, he had noted that we all have a surprising number of ancestors.

For example, you have two parents, different from each other, or you would not exist.

It would seem logical to assume that your two parents each had two parents also, and therefore you have four grandparents. And you might further assume that your four grandparents each had two parents, and so on.

Your ancestors seemingly double with each generation as you go back in time. And although this may seem very logical and correct, it is actually not true! In fact, it's impossible. You can prove it to yourself in a few minutes.

Take a calculator and keep doubling your ancestors every 28 years or so (an average generation) and before you can get back to 2000 years ago, your ancestors outnumber the total world population at that time! And remember: we're not talking about anyone else – just your ancestors! The truth is, human history is loaded with cousins marrying cousins, far beyond what most people would ever imagine.

Mathematicians, genealogists and other scientists have examined this apparent enigma and have come to one conclusion: many of your ancestors knowingly or unknowingly married their cousins. This resulted in a reduction in the number of ancestors from the usual rate of expansion.

Genealogists call this phenomenon pedigree collapse. Pedigree collapse appears to have first been mentioned in a paper by Robert C. Gunderson.<sup>8</sup> It means that our ancient family trees are much smaller than we used to believe. As well, these repeated marriages between related cousins are far more plentiful in the past than we ever imagined. Parts of our ancestral family tree had branches that were expanding at a normal rate while other branches were contracting by comparison.

Certain individuals may show up in your family tree more than once. Acknowledging these events is the only way to reconcile world population with the fact that we each have two parents.<sup>9</sup>

In a more extreme example, the marriage of a brother and sister has quite a dramatic effect. This happened in some royal families, for instance. When a brother and sister marry, then there are only the same two people as parents for both of them in the previous generation, not four.

Often, because of religious and cultural beliefs, known sexual liaisons between certain individuals with their cousins were kept quiet and were closely guarded secrets. Genetic evidence is changing all that.

Far more children were born out of wedlock than our parents and grandparents ever would have believed. In fact, many of our parents and grandparents simply

wouldn't want to believe that this happened so often. This is understandable. After all, there was no convincing evidence of this reality until recently.

A term I particularly dislike is the word illegitimate when applied to children. Any child born into this world is as legitimate as any other child, and the use of the term illegitimate is of ill intent and demeaning and should never be used.

It would be more appropriate to refer to the activities of a parent of the child as engaging in illegitimate activities, contravening their vows or disrespecting social norms, but the child is not guilty of anything.

Today, DNA evidence and the human genome project have led to much closer linkage and cooperation between two very complementary sciences: genealogy and genetics.

While scientists may continue to argue about the exact and final degree of relationship, it is evident to them that everyone in the world is related. The relationship between us all is very clear:

We are all cousins

Many scientists now estimate that no person in the world could be further apart from you than 50th cousin. Other scientists believe that nobody else in the world

today could be any further apart from you than 32nd cousin. But they all agree on one thing: that we are cousins.

You may ask, “Does this include all of the various races besides my own?” The answer is an emphatic yes. Yes, it includes all so-called races. No exceptions.

Even remote tribes are not really being discovered for the first time. They are only being rediscovered a very long time after they were separated from other ancient tribes. In more ancient times they had ancestors in common to us all. And the latest evidence still indicates the origin of our species took place in Africa and spread out from there to other continents.

The most remote tribes are part of the overall human gene pool. In their ancient history they were intermingled with other tribes and had common ancestors with them before being cut off through exploration, natural catastrophes or other events.

When you hear news about a remote tribe being discovered, remember they represent those more distant 32nd or 50th cousins. They are cousins greatly removed by degree, but nevertheless they are still our cousins.<sup>10</sup>

As Guy Murchie pointed out, each one of us has ancestors that include:

... all the blacks, Chinese, Arabs, Malays, Latins, Eskimos . . . who lived on Earth around AD 700.<sup>11</sup>

On a very positive note, another author, Alex Shoumatoff, had this to say on the subject of cousinhood:

The political implications of this great kindred are quite exciting. If all of us could be made aware of our multiple inter-relatedness, if the same sort of altruism that usually exists among close kin could prevail through the entire human population . . . [our] differences . . . would seem secondary.<sup>12</sup>

It is evident as we look at today's world that the knowledge about our ancient kinship feelings and our beginnings are unknown to the vast majority of people.

It is also evident that most people are unaware of the vast wealth of names of people and places being unearthed in ancient archives every year.

Many of the tribes existing today pass along vast genealogies of their ancestors orally. They are recited aloud, from the eldest to the youngest. Now these genealogies are being recorded and documented by the younger generations. This is all possible with

modern tape, CD and DVD recording devices and with video cameras.

Vast archives in the Vatican contain details about millions of people who lived during past centuries. They wait for their reawakening to be acknowledged in the world of digital data. Other religious institutions have contributions to make as well. We're waiting for them too.

However, the biggest unknown fact is still this: all of the people who ever lived in the past, along with everyone alive today, are cousins.

The fact that these things are unknown produces the exact opposite effect of what was true of our ancestors who lived in those ancient tribes: most of us don't feel any kinship feelings with people of different nationalities. Most of us only feel kinship for a very few of our own nationality. We have lost that kinship feeling, that oneness feeling, that should exist within mankind.

As a result of this lack of knowledge, we are obviously paying the consequences right now. The consequences are wars, genocide, starvation, disease, murder and other atrocities. In truth, our ignorance is working against the probability of our own future existence.

Are we not aware of the 2,000-year-old expression,

A house divided against itself cannot stand?<sup>13</sup>

## **What Creates Prejudice?**

If you think about the fact those millions of ancestors lead precisely and directly down through the centuries to you, you may begin to change some of your built-in assumptions. Try to imagine for just a few minutes the range and kinds of people your ancestry includes.

Your ancestors include criminals, nobility, royalty and scoundrels of every kind. Remove just one of them from your ancestry and the you that is you right now, would not even exist. Give that realization a few minutes of your time. Refresh your memory screen.

## **Genealogical Bridges**

Anthony Wagner is well known for his essays in the genealogical interpretation of history. In his scholarly book, *Pedigree and Progress*, he explains how occurrences that took place centuries ago are now emerging as major genealogical landmarks when viewed from today's vantage point:

In the year 1265 a nephew of Kubla Khan, Emperor of China, married the half-sister of a Byzantine Emperor, who in 1279 married the sister-in-law of a nephew of St. Louis, King of France, and of Eleanor of Provence, Queen of England.<sup>14</sup>

This meant that 700 years ago a genealogical bridge was connected across the continents of Europe and Asia in less than 15 years, and through only eight people.

This is just one example of the countless thousands of genealogical bridges creating interlinkage between races, nations and countries throughout the course of human history. Every living person today is the result of common ancestry and genealogical bridges.

I remember vividly an incident that occurred when I was invited to speak to a group of students in a school in Ontario.

While talking about cousinhood I noted that these young children were absolutely fascinated. Then, during recess, one of the teachers asked me to come outside to the schoolyard where the children were playing. She told me how one of the girls that had been in my class had run out to all of her friends and blurted out excitedly: “Did you know we’re cousins?” They all clustered around and were still talking about it excitedly when I arrived.

I began to wonder at that point, “What if all children, in every country were actually taught this when they were young?” I think the change would be enormous, and when these children reached university age, they might take their professors and leaders to task for not understanding how this really changes everything.

Could world wars develop if everyone had a kinship feeling for all ethnic groups? Wouldn't we instead rely far more on understanding, reasoning, negotiation and real diplomacy?

Keep these discoveries in mind as we progress.

As the full implications of these discoveries are assimilated, our basic and fundamental ideas about ourselves and our relationships with each other must change.

Our educational institutions, by definition, should be the early transmitters of these new perspectives, but not by boring and repetitive lecturing. Instead:

Teaching is now understood as mature assistance to youthful learning, or self-teaching. . . . The teacher becomes a part of the learning group, sharing his greater maturity and knowledge, but seeking out ways of assisting others to learn rather than going through an empty ritual of forced feeding.<sup>15</sup>

With the essence of this chapter in mind, we will now step into the Internet world and lock-in on the single most important search technique we need to find the proverbial needle in the haystack.

# *The Internet Unfolds*

When the Internet began, it is important to know that there was an immediate need for convergence. By this statement, I mean that text alone, without diagrams, images, pictures and photos, wasn't enough.

Several centuries ago, the brilliant educator Comenius created a breakthrough in teaching and wrote a revolutionary book entitled *Orbis Pictus (Pictured World)*. It was the first picture-book or illustrated manual of instruction for the young. It was published at Nuremberg, Germany in 1657.

Comenius, with the instinct of a great teacher, felt that to give words without things (pictures) to the pupil was not simply to retard his progress, but to lay the foundation of vague and inaccurate conceptions.<sup>1</sup>

Another educator, Pestalozzi, ventured further by trying to have the actual object in front of the child learning the word—and from these two educators “flowed the excellent custom of *giving object lessons* in infant schools”.<sup>2</sup>

Object lessons and show and tell sessions are still used today in virtually every school. These techniques are

tried, tested and proven to more clearly communicate ideas, topics and personal experiences.

And so it was that the Internet also needed, right from the beginning, a convergence of images, pictures, and text to bring about a clear understanding through this new communication medium.

At first, websites sprang up more or less helter-skelter and confusion abounded. One of the main challenges was how to find the website that actually had the information you were looking for.

This led to the natural need for massive indexes to the data held on various websites. Ideally, these indexes would guide researchers to the right place where they might find the proverbial needle in a haystack.

If you know the history of nonfiction books to any degree, one of the most basic requirements is an index, especially when complex terminology is used throughout the book.

Remember: a noun is the name of a person, place or thing. Historically, our libraries always had card catalogs in the past, and many still do.

These card catalogs were essentially indexes to the book titles and subjects in a collection, and of course, the authors had to be indexed by name as well. And

books about geographical regions, different languages or from different countries had to be specified and grouped together.

What happened in the history of books is very similar, in part, to what has happened—and is continuing to happen—on the Internet.

If we look at the history of books themselves, certain kinds of books were really indexes with data attached. Some of the major ones are:

- Dictionaries
- Lexicons
- Encyclopedias
- Bibliographies
- Concordances
- Directories

The Internet has many advantages over books, however, because once books were reproduced digitally, computer programs could be written to cross-reference information in ways never before possible with books in libraries.

On the Internet you can search many encyclopedias for free. One of the best free encyclopedia websites will even let you participate in creating this marvelous resource. Take a look at the following website available in 10 different languages:

Every word written in a book or on a website could be part of an index, and cross-referencing and sophisticated crisscross indexing became the major centerpiece of what are now known as search engines.

In 1962 the visionary Marshall McLuhan stated:

When millions of books can be compressed in a match-box space, it is not the book merely, but the library that becomes portable.<sup>3</sup>

In the near future, most libraries will expand to become virtual libraries on the Internet. At first, catalogs will go online, and then their older and rarest books along with high-demand books. Once the data on the pages of these books has been digitally converted, then it can be shared globally. Best of all, this can be provided to anyone at very low cost, and in many instances for free.

In the future, our descendants will likely have library buildings filled with physical books in their pioneer villages, showing future citizens what life was like during the early 2000s !

More and more libraries are being transported onto the Internet to become virtual libraries. These virtual libraries are indeed portable, whether the data covers a

dozen books or a million volumes. Books that were rare and locked in climate controlled glass display cabinets in the past, will be available to anyone, anywhere and at anytime they wish.

One choice for users will be to view scanned images (photographed pages) of books showing them as they were originally. Many researchers need to see the original work and form. This is particularly useful for rare books, artwork, maps and illustrations.

Another choice will be viewing the digital data that provides the user with the informational content, but not the original appearance or form. These are digital books.

Digital books are highly useful for many reasons, such as changing the font type and size and republishing a book that is in the public domain (not under copyright protection). Many older books were in very tiny type sizes, making them difficult to read. Now such works can be available in very large easy to read fonts.

In the Western Hemisphere, Johannes Gutenberg invented the printing press with removable metal or wooden letters in 1436. China had already been printing on a press using moveable hardened clay letters since 1041, although printing in China had begun long before that, during the 800s.

Then, in the 1960s, along came offset printing or instant printing, using photo-typesetting, and a new revolution was born.

Suddenly a photograph could be made of a rare work of art, and that photograph could be impressed electronically on a metal or paper plate. Thousands of copies could be produced automatically and instantly without the need of any typesetting.

Many collectors of rare original artworks and maps panicked at first, because they were afraid that if someone took a picture of their rare masterpiece, the value would be diminished.

Some purists felt that since early offset printing was inferior in quality compared to the original artwork, it would cheapen everything. They were all wrong.

Suppose you were a stamp collector, for example, and you possessed a very rare stamp worth \$100,000. Someone could take a beautiful, high-resolution digital photo of that stamp and the photo might be worth a few dollars, but it is the original stamp that is worth the \$100,000.

Offset printing, by producing prints and copies of rare art, created two marvelous benefits for both collectors of rare art and the public at large.

First, everyone, even the poor and middle classes, could afford a copy of a rare piece of art, and appreciate and enjoy it in their own home.

Second, as millions of people shared the appreciation and beauty of rare art, the value of the originals actually went up. As more new people acquired wealth for the first time, they had a new awareness of great art through seeing prints and pictures of it. Owning an original was highly desired, especially by the nouveau riche. Today, investing in original works of art is a huge field and prices continue to escalate over time.

Once again, the old marketing truths of supply and demand were working, but in a new way.

It is important to realize that nobody told the public to buy this great reproduced art. People just looked at the prints and were internally motivated within themselves to acquire a copy or print. Just the exposure to art itself motivated the public to buy.

Stores selling prints were simply displaying what was available, but not dictating what the public should like. Observant storeowners quickly became aware of what the public wanted.

I think one of the great errors of our time is marketing people who try to dictate or limit the choice of the public through strident advertising and controlled

distribution. Just show us everything available, and we will choose what we like. It's just the way it really is.

## **The Information Highway**

The time we live in has often been called the Information Age and we are truly witnessing nothing less than an information revolution. While there is an overwhelming explosion of data worldwide, wisdom is needed to find our way through this overwhelming morass of data. We need to hone in on our specific objectives and goals without getting totally lost in a never-ending and expanding universe of data.

Careful search techniques can locate information in minutes that may have taken many decades to find in the past.

For the most part, governments are rightly avoiding direct taxation of Internet users. The invention and use of the Internet was always premised upon it belonging to the people. Nevertheless, governments are very tempted to tax, especially in countries where the level of greed of those in control rises above the people's primary needs and rights.

When radio was first invented, the government stepped in and required everyone who wanted to own a radio receiver to purchase a license from the government. Just listening to a radio in your home in the 1920s

required a radio license. A little experience with the public reaction to licensing led government officials to drop the idea very quickly decades ago.

Incidentally, speaking of radio, did you know that many elements of the Internet came from the hobby of amateur radio or ham radio? This fraternity of people talked on short-wave radio to others in every country of the world, long before the Internet was invented. They created and coined the word “net” where people clustered together on the air to discuss popular topics in a unique and invisible information space.

It was ham radio operators who created and operated the first radio and television broadcast stations.

They assisted people to make free telephone calls between countries even as early as the 1950s, using phone patches, an elementary forerunner of VoIP technology today.

If we look back now to the information highway, we see that the highway is the actual infrastructure of the Internet itself.

Picture in your mind a complex web of millions of highways with turnpikes, intersections or hubs. Websites are like tourist attractions along the way. There are stores, businesses, services, libraries, malls and thousands of other travel stops en route. You can

tour or be a sightseer, or you can go instantly to any destination.

The big difference between the Internet versus cars on a highway is that you can move along the information highway to your destination at almost the speed of light: 186,000 miles per second. And gas prices aren't going up!

It's not just information, it's instant information. Distant websites on the far side of the planet seem to be as close as websites next door to us, and as faster Internet access speeds prevail, these huge distances and faster speeds seem to merge or collapse, and they soon become meaningless.

In our minds, whether we are conscious of it or not, we experience time and space disappearing, or becoming the same thing.

This merging of time and space can actually create a growing psychological challenge for children raised from birth in the first Internet-only generation in history.

If young children are dominated by only the Internet and games, it can become increasingly difficult for them to clearly distinguish between the invisible Internet world and the real three-dimensional world where their physical bodies live and breathe and where they must

learn to interchange and socialize with other children. This is a new and vital challenge for our educational systems and social scientists.

Let's look at the builders of the information highways. Building this immense highway system requires a huge investment by many large and small corporations. Why are they spending so much money? You need to know. It is the power of our needs that really dictates what is happening. This is the single biggest clue to understanding how the Internet will develop in the future.

Billions of dollars have been spent so far on building the information highway. Why? That enormous amount of money is being invested because the investors expect trillions of dollars will be made in the future from its existence. That is, of course, only if those investors make the right choices. And who determines the right choices? We do!

No planners build highways unless they assume from the beginning that there will be a lot of future traffic. Traffic on the Internet consists of digital bytes and bits, whether it is emails, video, audio, games, movies, search engine queries or anything else. It's all just one thing: traffic.

The benefit for us? Wise members of the public can get huge benefits for no cost or very little cost, by doing

some careful thinking and a little research on their own. Let's start right now.

## **Search Engines**

Whether you are searching for someone in the past, or someone living today, the first essential tool on the Internet is a search engine. Everybody knows about them, but the majority doesn't really know the best way to use them.

When Internet novices first locate a search engine, the majority of them just type in a word or phrase, click enter and wait. That is often a great waste of time and can bring frustration and despair. Let's understand what these search engines are and how they work.

Search engines are websites that contain powerful programs called databases. A database stores information in such a way that any piece of information can be quickly retrieved through an elaborate system of indexes and related links.

Database websites can be contained on a single computer (a server) or on a large number of computers (server farms).

These powerful servers take in your request for information, search their internal database indexes, and serve back the results of your search request. Ebay and

Amazon, for example, use huge numbers of servers or server farms to handle auctions or sell books, videos and all kinds of other products.

Search engines began in the 1990s. Many of the early search engines were created as university research projects. Many students and university researchers had the foresight to see our future needs and they also had the knowledge and creativity to write programs to meet those needs.

Major search engines today such as www.google.com can handle millions of transactions in less than a second, for people requesting information at the very same moment from all over the globe. It is no wonder that when Google went public in 2005 it was the largest public offering of its kind and raised \$2.7 billion dollars from the public and institutional investors.

Currently Google has billions of web pages in its index, and it is constantly growing.

Google has big plans for the future and their researchers and developers have already turned out new resources that are highly useful, as well as beta or test versions of new databases and programs they are working on. You can stay on top of their research work by going to <http://labs.google.com>

When you search on most search engines, they currently show the first 10 or more websites matching what you seek—but—the first 10 are often those websites that have the most links to them from other websites. Usually the first links are sponsored links that pay the search engine owner for positioning near the top. These first results may contain what you’re looking for, but if not, there are ways around this to locate a site you may wish to find. The website you seek may purposely not have many links from other websites, or they might not be able to afford to pay Google for high ranking as a sponsor or advertiser.

Some search engines require memberships. Some search engines search several other search engines, which can save time especially if the subject you are researching is relatively rare.

It is important to realize that search engines do not search genealogy databases, or any other databases that require memberships and passwords.

In fact, there are some websites that have no home pages at all, and contain databases known only to a select group of people. Most of these are not included in search engine results. These kinds of websites are part of what has been called the dark Internet or hidden Internet. It's likely that much more data may be within the hidden Internet than the visible Internet we're already familiar with.<sup>4</sup>

In general, powerful databases are structured in such a way that they can only be used by members possessing valid usernames and passwords.

So, even if a membership database contains millions or billions of names, you cannot determine what names are in there unless you are at that website. Sometimes you can carry out a free or limited search without being a member.

This is why websites containing databases should be visited and utilized if they cover the people and time periods you seek. A search engine can find the home page of these websites, but you must click on the link provided by the search engine to go there and check it out. That's part of researching.

There are very useful websites that list the many different types of search engines available. Some of these specialize in various subject fields of endeavor. Check out [www.allsearchengines.com](http://www.allsearchengines.com). Another website that compares search engines is:

The main point to note is this: search engines differ from what was previously possible with printed books in the past, because they multiply a millionfold the ways of finding out information about anyone, anywhere, at any time period in the past and present.

A logical question might be, “How do search engines gather up such vast amounts of information?” Do they employ an army of people indexing information for them? Not at all!

Computer programmers create digital robots—known as robots or crawlers—that roam around the World Wide Web visiting every website they can to index the home page and other pages on websites where they are not blocked.

Every moment of every day these crawlers are tapping into new and old websites to gather up information. The crawlers convey the newly found data to the home website, where it is integrated into the ocean of data that's already there. The ocean just grows and grows.

At the search engine's home, every word is indexed except for words like “the”, “and”, etc. In other words, they are primarily looking at nouns, the names of people, places and things.

Search engines churn out their data in a similar form to concordances. That is, if you are searching for a particular person, place, or thing, search results will usually provide you with the name of the subject you seek within a sentence or two taken from a website source.

This way you have the word within the context of a sentence. This triggers your mind to select the most likely source for the information you seek, even when many sources come up in the search.

Usually the most relevant results come up first, but as mentioned above, some search engines and directories will show or highlight their paid advertisers first, along with heavily linked websites.

This often means that cluttered websites having links to, or ads for, many other websites may show up with higher priority than the website that you may wish to find. However, many websites prefer not to clutter up their sites with a lot of links and ads. A lot of clutter looks unsightly and unprofessional.

When I began using the Internet, I remember looking up the word genealogy on a search engine, and I was truly astounded to see there were over 10,000 responses. I was astounded because in the early 1990s genealogy wasn't exactly a household word.

Today, when I search for the word genealogy on a popular search engine, I get almost 80 million hits or responses! Initially, on the surface, that might seem wonderful, but in fact, it reveals a huge new problem facing researchers. Who can look through 80 million responses? Instead of too few facts, suddenly there are too many facts to go through!

## **Search Engine Techniques**

I mentioned earlier that beginners often go to a search engine, type in a name and wait for the results.

Sometimes even people using the Internet a lot do little more than just type in what they’re looking for. That is most often a big mistake.

For example, I went to Google<sup>5</sup> and entered my name, *Noel Elliot*. I got back almost two million results.

However, as soon as I put quotation marks around my name, “*Noel Elliot*,” I got back about 3,500 results.

Quotation marks are widely used by search engines to mean the results must be precisely the words or phrase between the quotation marks.

I got almost two million results on the first search because the search engine—if I just enter *Noel Elliot*—will look for Noel Elliot but it will also look for any website page that mentions Noel and Elliot even if they are widely separated in an article.

So remember this: if the name you are searching for is rare or uncommon, then using quotation marks will bring back comparatively few entries.

However, this doesn’t work very well for common names. For example, if I choose the name “*John Smith*” within quotation marks, I get over five million results.

However, if I add a middle name, “*John Maynard Smith*,” I get less than 75,000 results. It turns out that

someone famous had that name. But if I add the name Elliot as the middle name and search on “*John Elliot Smith*,” then I get only 74 results. Obviously this name is not as famous. Experiment, experiment!

Here’s another angle. I tried entering my name without quotation marks plus the word genealogy and Canada, like this: *Noel Elliot genealogy Canada*. I got 14,600 results. Even that is a lot better than the two million results I got when entering my name without the words genealogy and Canada.

One more step: if I enter “*Noel Elliot*” *genealogy Canada*, I get only five results. This is just a small sampler of how you can narrow down the results of a search.

A little ingenuity, thought and experimentation will convert a beginner to at least an amateur in a very short time. In today’s world, a search engine is the primary resource for every kind of research.

This simply means that search techniques have to be constantly refined in order to precisely find the person you are searching for.

I strongly recommend that when you visit a search engine website, take the time to click on advanced search. Examine all the options very carefully and you will be richly rewarded.

You will be pleasantly surprised what search engine administrators have organized to refine your search immeasurably. Search engine operators spend a lot of time and energy to try and clearly illustrate what is now possible.

One last trick that you find very handy is to specify a range of years. For example, if I search “*JohnSmith*” born 1617...1618 I get only 122 results. So, even with a popular name like John Smith, the search can be narrowed down by naming the year(s) of probable birth, marriage or death. When you specify a range of years such as 1617...1621 the search will bring back results only within that specific range.

# *Finding People in the Past*

## **Onomatology to the Rescue**

Onomatology, or the onomastic sciences, are certainly not familiar words to the public. However, if you are seeking to extend a genealogy into the past, these relatively unknown sciences eventually become essential.

Broadly speaking, onomatology is the classification of names and their meanings, alternate spellings, origin, history and so on. You could sum it all up as the study of names.

Onomatology deals with the proper names of people, places and things. This science encompasses real names as well as fictitious names. It even includes the study of coined and invented names often used in fiction novels.

A certain group of researchers within this unusual science might specialize in just one specific type of names, such as surnames. Others focus on name changes, and yet others focus on aboriginal and native names. And we should all be very glad that this science is old and well established, because it becomes indispensable as we go back in time.

In China, where surnames are much older than in Europe and North America, there were originally just about 1,000 surnames. Compare that with more than 750,000 surname variations in Europe and the British Isles!

## **Legal Name Changes**

Onomatologists and genealogists are concerned with name changes. For example, one person immigrating into Canada from Europe changed his surname from Pslajavicoski to Jacosky.<sup>1</sup> Fortunately, onomastic scholars documented this change, otherwise it might be very difficult for anyone, generations later, to trace their family tree if they were unaware of the name change.

Another publication provides a dictionary of over 30,000 Ukrainian surnames in Canada.<sup>2</sup>

When legal name changes are made in Canada, they have to be published in the provincial Gazette. This means there is always a place where investigators can find legal name changes. Fortunately, genealogists and onomatologists sometimes publish indexes to these gazettes, a few of them cover periods up to the mid- to late 1900s.<sup>3</sup>

## **Illegal Name Changes**

Now picture this imaginary scenario: let us suppose two brothers, more than a century ago, had a serious

argument over religion. That was not unusual at that time.

Let us further imagine that the argument got so intense the brothers decided never to speak to each other again, and they each decided not to let their wives or children associate with the others family.

One brother might change the spelling of his surname to clearly distinguish himself as if he was of a different family and therefore he no longer had any obvious association or connection with his brother's family household.

Each brother might raise their children to avoid the other family entirely, or imply that there is something unspeakably bad about the other brother's family. Later, as the remote brother and his family had almost faded from memory, if asked about the other part of the family, the one brother might say something vague, suggesting perhaps that there is a black sheep in the family.

One brother might move his family far away. Again, this is not as rare as you might think, especially in times past. Generations later, when the descendants try to trace their family tree, they would hit a brick wall. Over the years I have found some of these cut off families, and usually, the descendants on both sides no longer feel the need to allow an old argument to cripple their kinship now, a century later.

The old arguments might have been seen as very serious breaches a few generations ago, but they no longer are seen as grounds for breaking up a family and keeping descendants separated today. They become reunited. Stories like this are not all imaginary. Stories similar to this happened all the time in the past, and to a much lesser extent it still happens today.

## **Immigration**

For other name changes, let's take a closer look at those who immigrated to North America in the past.

Occasionally, some overseas emigrants purposely spelled their names incorrectly. Perhaps they were a young couple fleeing parents and family in Europe or the British Isles. Perhaps their parents gave strict orders that for whatever reasons they could never see or marry each other. History has hundreds or perhaps many thousands of stories similar to this.

For a young couple in love, fleeing to North America for land and opportunity was their way out of family rules that were simply too strict to bear. Naturally, such a young couple would want to make sure they couldn't be found as they began their lives in their newly chosen homeland.

Sometimes immigration officials themselves simply copied names down incorrectly. Usually the spelling

was subject to errors anyway, because it was often based on the way the name was pronounced verbally and how the officials interpreted the sound of the name when writing it down. And here we must point out that just as recently as 50 years ago, phonics was being taught in all our schools. People would hear a name spoken aloud, and then try to spell it based on their knowledge of phonics.

Phonics produced a generation of people who could spell very well, but no one method alone is perfect. Add foreign accents and poor pronunciation into the equation and it's easy to see why census-takers and immigration officials could easily make mistakes.

It is also true that there were good census-takers who were careful and meticulous, and there were poor census-takers in a rush to get home, didn't care much for the job, etc. Not much has changed!

Particularly in the earliest years of immigration, it was easier to slip undetected through the record-keeping process. No papers, or forged papers - thousands entered North America this way. And yet, the more onomatologists and genealogists work together, even these name changes can be figured out, mainly by a process of elimination, often on first names or later documents of marriage, census or taxation.

In general, professional genealogists have up to 21 ways around a genealogy block in the mid to late 1800s.

Familiarity and the study of surnames and given names by onomatologists provide us with reference books that often provide a breakthrough in tracing names that have changed over time. These reference books belong on the shelf of every serious genealogist.

## **Criminals**

Others immigrating into North America were criminals, intent on doing anything they could to create an alias or false surname. This might work well until the time of marriage, since that particular record usually required the parents' names of the bride and groom, and required witnesses who provided their names and addresses. Often people trying to hide their identity would give some correct names, or parts of names, on such a document.

There are several other ways of tracing these purposely changed names that are very sophisticated. These techniques are known primarily to highly innovative genealogists and private investigators versed in an intense process of elimination and other methods, some of which may occasionally extend into gray areas.

A very few generations later, however, descendants of criminals might run into serious health problems

if they cannot get a medical history of their ancestors to assist them in their own medical diagnoses. This means that one result of hiding your identity is that your descendants' lives could be at risk.

Fortunately, DNA and the genetic sciences are advancing to the place where even those who do not know their family ancestry can be assisted, and more so with each passing year.

## **Is Singapore Ahead of North America?**

In the year 2000, Singapore became the first country in the world to conduct their entire population census on the Internet.

Think of the great savings and efficiency over door-to-door enumerations and all the paperwork and voter-machine problems.

Every citizen in Canada has a Social Insurance Number (SIN) and every citizen in the U.S. has a Social Security Number (SSN). Computers love to crunch numbers and they can do it instantly. What on earth are we waiting for? Maybe our governments should be humble enough to inquire from Singapore about their methodologies.

Another pleasant surprise on my trip to Singapore was the way in which they kept new or changed phone numbers

instantly up-to-date. A screen on your telephone stayed up-to-date as a directory for the whole country.

This makes we wonder: How many trees do we cut down every year to produce telephone books? And we have to wait a year to get a new replacement for our current books. And the beat goes on. *Waste of time. Waste of money. Waste of natural resources.*

And think about all those trucks that are loaded down with heavy telephone books, bound in huge groups and dropped off at apartment buildings, condos, businesses and homes by a small army of people hired to deliver them.

Let's consult with Singapore!

## **Genealogists to the Rescue**

Genealogy is classified two different ways—first, the “-ogy” ending tells us it is a science of something—and that something is genus, or generations, or human genesis.

Genealogy is the science of identifying an individual, in relationship to other family members. It uses the evidence generated by direct family connection of siblings, parents and so on.

As mentioned earlier, the science part of genealogy is becoming more closely linked with another science, genetics—the science where the chromosomes and the DNA molecule are being unraveled and accelerated.

In the great classification of things, genealogy is not only classified as a science on its own, it is also seen as an auxiliary branch of history. Genealogy provides the skeleton of family history. It is important to keep this duality—genealogy and history—clear in your mind, even though we will deal primarily with the science of genealogy in this book.

Genealogy has to do with a lot of investigative techniques, the outcome of which should provide documentary evidence. These source documents and findings provide a picture of a series of sharp occurrences between the cradle and the grave, and associations with close family kin.

A very large percentage of biographies begin with details about the grandparents and parents, and other family members, otherwise we would not understand the background, the challenges, and the kind of environment the subject was raised in during their formative years.

Genealogy is always a search for truth. It separates family mythology and family fiction (and sometimes over-inflated egos) from the reality of events as they

really occurred. In this sense, genealogy is refreshing, for it teaches us that every family has ups and downs during the many generations that take place over a long period of time.

The person who really spotted and predicted the popularity of genealogy in the future, was Léon Roy, an archivist who worked in the Archives of the Province of Québec, Canada.<sup>4</sup>

The records of French Canadians are among the best in the world, if not the very best. In Québec, genealogy is often more than just a hobby or pastime—it is a passion.

Some of the largest family reunions in the world take place in Québec. It has been stated with authority that the greatest national treasure of Québec is their genealogical heritage. Their records are simply the best of any state or province in North America.

This is particularly fortunate for many American families in New England, New York, Michigan and all the northern border States who descended from the French. It is very common to trace such families back into the 1600s and beyond with relative ease, since links are most often provided to ancestors in the ancestral villages and parishes in France.

Since the French have spread out into every province in Canada, it is also fortunate for Canadians who have some French ancestry, including the Métis and the Acadians.

Remember the Roots television series craze that swept North America and then Australia? More people watched the television mini-series than watched man's first step on the moon.

Years later the Roots television production was selected by the Chinese government to be their New Year's special program, and it was seen on national television across China.

I tried to imagine the likelihood of the story of a black man's ancestry from Africa, as told by a descendant generations later in the United States, being used as an example and inspiration for the people in China. Since it was for the Chinese New Year, perhaps it was chosen by the government to motivate the people of China to view their future with optimism. I think it worked!

Anyway, during the Roots publicity, the fascinating thing to me, and mentioned in a great many magazines in the 1970s, was that all the so-called experts didn't see it coming. The public's interest in genealogy had been growing uphill in strength and numbers every year since 1960, but the experts didn't even see it happening as any kind of significant event.

All along, I kept thinking: Here is a hobby that is growing dynamically. Millions of people are strongly interested and excited. Nobody told the public to get interested in this hobby, no government told the people to do it, no advertisements told the public to get interested in tracing your family tree.

This is very important! Why? Simply because it shows that this phenomenon was a natural inborn need rising to the surface in people's lives at this particular time in history. It was all part of a search for identity and meaning in a society that was in danger of becoming rootless. It was some kind of natural response to the times we were living in and the conditions we felt around us.

And yet, it remained seemingly undetected for decades, even by the so-called social scientists.

The only people who really knew it was happening were those who were working in archives, because each year they needed more money and time to meet the swelling demand for information. For example, in their annual reports year after year, the Nova Scotia Archives referred to the huge backlog of mail, and asked other archivists how they coped with the rising tide of requests.

Genealogical societies and many historical societies were beneficiaries of this rising public interest in

genealogy. Word of mouth played a large role until the media caught on. The ongoing interest in genealogy led to a swelling of the ranks among genealogical and historical societies. More and more clubs and family associations sprang up.

Each genealogy group had a library of helpful books, or used the local history collection of their public library. More and more books were being published, especially in the awakening period from the 1960s to the 1990s. Printed indexes to census records, birth records, baptismal records, tax records, voters' lists, immigration lists, city, town, township and county histories, sprang up everywhere.

Avid genealogists and historians came out in droves to genealogical society meetings. Societies held fairs and other meetings, drawing the public. Later, in these huge annual events, people crowded around the publication displays searching for books of interest.

In my mind, the most valuable indexes combine many indexes from different types of sources, in different periods of time, into one massive alphabetical index.

For example, in 1984, The Genealogical Research Library produced a three-volume set of books titled *People of Ontario 1600-1900*. It had been derived from a large number of publications and historical property maps, and thus Ontario was the first province

to have an index combining a multitude of sources into one large index. It had been produced using the Apple II computer, machine-language programs, a disk operating system and a library of 5" floppy diskettes.

By the 1990s after upgrading the indexing programs and training scores of indexers, the library published 12 volumes, which covered all of Canada for three centuries of time, 1600-1900.

By the year 2000, the data in those books and new indexing had reached the place where even 84 huge volumes wouldn't contain all the data, and so the library decided to begin development of a major database engine for their website, [www.grl.com](http://www.grl.com).

Here's a personal way I can truly illustrate the huge advantage of the Internet over a library of genealogy books.

Let's compare the previous printing of the 12 books in the 1990s, with the Internet databank which came online in 2003.

The original 12 volume set of books published in the 1990s cost over \$1000 to purchase. They held details of about two million ancestors.

Today, just ten years after those books were published, for a very few dollars, anyone can join the library

at [www.grl.com](http://www.grl.com) and search 21 million records. Add to that one million source document images that are available as well. These images can be downloaded for free by members. And then add to that, several thousand antique maps of every country in the world. The maps are also available to members.

The cost has dropped to a tiny fraction of the cost of the 12 volumes, while the amount of data available has increased dramatically on the Internet. Plus source images and maps. Additionally, a search on the Internet takes a fraction of a second, far faster than you can open a book and even begin to look.

## **Two Major Commercial Databases in the U.S.**

In the U.S., there are two huge genealogy websites that are commercial in nature, namely, [www.ancestry.com](http://www.ancestry.com) and [www.genealogy.com](http://www.genealogy.com). Both of these are databases owned by The Generations Network (previous known as [www.myfamily.com](http://www.myfamily.com)). Both databases charge for most of their services on a database by database basis or by specific collections. Examine the content carefully to discern which database you need before paying any money. I advise people the same way about the database at [www.grl.com](http://www.grl.com).

It is always sensible to see if you can find what you need for free, before paying to search a fee-based website. Ultimately, you may indeed find that some fee-based

sites are highly useful for finding what you're looking for and there are often many benefits to membership.

Most fee-based websites keep people employed who are excellent indexers—and they can be fired if their error-rate is not kept at a minimum. Other websites may have volunteer indexers providing the data, only to discover they have a mixture of correct and incorrect data. There are good indexers and there are indexers that are not so good.

In summary, there are advantages and disadvantages of fee-based as well as free websites, so the onus is on you to search carefully.

## **Cyndi's List**

For the record, a popular website for locating genealogical websites has traditionally been Cyndi's List at [www.cyndislist.com](http://www.cyndislist.com). While I still use this website, personally I liked the older layout this site had a few years ago. For me, I found the old listings quicker and easier to use than the current layout. However, that said, it is still the #1 index to genealogy sites and it is a primary resource and many researchers use it.

The largest database in the world, however, is absolutely free to search. And that database—surprisingly to most newcomers—is contained in two Mormon church websites, as follows:

If you are searching for your ancestors I suggest you start with the free searches. If you are unsuccessful, then try the commercial searches, especially if they give you a free search or trial period to see what they have.

There are thousands of free databases. We have listed a few thousand of them in the Worldwide Website Directory at the end of this book. For example, most state and provincial archives have a website where more and more material is becoming searchable. They range drastically in the amount of information available.

## **About the World's Largest Free Genealogy Website**

As mentioned, the single largest sources of free genealogical records in the world, is found at the Mormon church websites mentioned above. As more records are indexed around the world, they are moved into the free online database at [www.familysearch.org](http://www.familysearch.org).

Interestingly, this huge website and search engine is operated by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints or Mormons as they are popularly called. I myself am not a Mormon, but they have made a huge impact on genealogical research globally. Again, the Mormon website at [www.familysearch.org](http://www.familysearch.org) is the single most important website on our planet for finding free genealogical information.

The genealogy data includes the famous IGI or International Genealogy Index, which is a tremendous resource for genealogy for a large number of countries.

Let me get the legal niceties covered here: this website is owned by The Corporation of the President of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, Inc. The website's copyright ownership is vested in Intellectual Reserve, Inc., and the International Genealogy Index is a trademark owned by Intellectual Reserve, Inc.

The IGI lists millions of births, christenings, baptisms and marriages in countries around the world. Since a great many of these records are obtained from parish registers, the IGI is very valuable because in such cases, these are records of primary evidence.

The Mormon IGI is particularly strong in certain countries including the United States, England, Wales, Scotland, Mexico, Ireland, Germany, Austria, Canada and Russia.

The IGI records that were used to produce the indexed database were all microfilmed originally. These microfilms of scanned documents are stored in massive vaults in the mountains near Salt Lake City, Utah, within atomic bomb proof facilities containing a fresh water supply in the event of a catastrophe or war.

For the Mormons themselves, the acquiring and storage of these records is a necessity for church work by their members. You might notice that the IGI index is devoid of death records and cemetery records, and that's because of certain beliefs held by Mormons. When it comes to birth, baptism, christening and marriage records, however, they are loaded.

The Mormons also maintain their internationally famous Family History Library in Salt Lake City. This facility is a place not only used by researchers in the U.S., but by visiting researchers and scholars from many other countries as well.

The Mormon website also has another set of free records that are indispensable if you are searching for people who lived during the 1800s or early 1900s in England, Wales, Scotland, the United States and Canada. These are the every-name indexes to federal censuses. They've had very popular census records indexed for many years now, specifically:

- 1881 census of England, Wales, and Scotland
- 1880 census of the U.S.A. (all states)
- 1881 census of Canada (all provinces)

The 1881 censuses mention every family member, household by household, who was alive in those years. They include the name of every man, woman and child. Their ages are given, along with birthplaces,

occupations, marital status and many other important facts as well. Every month more census records for various years are being added country by country.

In the Worldwide Website Directory included in this book, I have also listed many other websites providing various census years for different countries, some as early as the 1600s and others as recent as 1945.

This book is not meant to be a training manual for genealogists. A discussion of tax lists, school censuses, assessment rolls, cemetery records, burial records, wills and a plethora of other kinds of records is beyond the scope of this book. However, the Worldwide Website Directory will link you to these kinds of records and much, much more.

I will, however, discuss two particular areas here that are more specific to Internet searching. Let's discuss that old standby, newspapers, and kick it up a notch or two.

## **Newspapers**

One of the sources for births, marriages and deaths—as well as millions of articles and social columns that might mention the people you seek—are newspapers.

Newspapers were being printed long before vital records of births, marriages and deaths were being

collected by governments. Some newspapers published extensive genealogies of families who were early settlers.

The *Yarmouth Herald*, for example, located in Nova Scotia, published vast genealogies of New England families that had branches of the family who came to Canada.

The collected genealogies from the *Yarmouth Herald* were eventually published between the years 1896 and 1901. These comprehensive genealogies included detailed listings of families, generation by generation, often beginning in the 1600s and ending in the late 1800s. These newspaper genealogies were compiled into a massive book and published in 1993.<sup>5</sup> This book contains invaluable genealogical data for those seeking ancestors in the New England states as well as in Nova Scotia. The descendants of these families today are scattered throughout many other regions of the U.S. and Canada, and probably in a great many other countries as well.

In the Worldwide Website Directory you will find newspaper websites for about 200 different countries. You can investigate these on your own as well.

You will find almost every country listed and the principal newspapers, along with links to connect you directly to the particular newspaper you seek. Many of

the newspapers have email addresses included in these listings.

If you are searching for a lost relative and you know they lived in a certain city, why not write a letter to the editor? It's free, and thousands of people have found missing family links by taking this simple step. Today you can contact editors by email, avoiding the cost of postage, envelope and a drive to the post office.

## **Digital Newspapers and Indexes**

Wouldn't it be nice if you could search for anyone's name ever mentioned in a newspaper over a 40 or 50 year period? Or a century? It's here already!

Several groups around the world are scanning old newspapers and using highly sophisticated OCR (optical character recognition) software to convert old newspapers into digital data. Once digitized, other software creates indexes on any noun mentioned.

This is a researcher's dream come true, or at least it's becoming more true with each passing month.

One of the first companies that caught my attention near the beginning of newspaper digitization was *Cold North Wind, Inc.*, and I have followed their progress with great anticipation.

Their website is at [www.paperofrecord.com](http://www.paperofrecord.com). They have digitized well over 21 million newspaper pages at the time of writing. Newspapers in many countries are being digitized. This is necessarily a pay site, but well worth the money if you see newspapers in their list that you need to search.

Another website, [www.newspaperarchive.com](http://www.newspaperarchive.com), claims to have 993.6 million articles covering 771 cities, over a 240 year period, and 2,975 titles, as of the time of writing. I searched on a rare name to sample the index and got several hundred hits. Again, this is a subscription site.

Also of particular interest to genealogists is the website  
<http://www.genealogybank.com/gbnk/>

At the time of writing [www.genealogybank.com](http://www.genealogybank.com) had 125 million articles, from more than 500,000 issues of about 2,500 historical U.S. newspapers. These newspapers were originally published between 1690 and 1980.

They also have the texts online for searching 11,700 books prior to the year 1900, and 151,000 reports, as well as other lists and documents spanning the years 1789 to 1980. Their website constantly lists newly-added newspapers and I am impressed with the speed at which more content is being digitized and added to their website.

## **PERSI - The World's Largest Periodical Index**

PERSI, The Periodical Source Index, with more than 1.8 million index entries, is the largest subject index to genealogical and historical periodical articles in the world. It was created by the Allen County Public Library in Fort Wayne, Indiana. This library was originally known as the Fort Wayne Public Library.

It covers more than 5,000 periodicals written in English and French (Canada) since the year 1800, although the articles cover the 1700s to the present.

## **Introducing the Lost Genealogies**

Did you know that there are millions of ancestors in a very specific collection of books that have never been indexed?

Are you aware that many of the libraries and archives you've probably visited in the past actually have these books available? You may not have seen them, however, because they are not in the genealogy collection.

Although researchers may work nearby, comparatively few of them have delved into this other collection of books.

This other collection of books contains invaluable records. Families are recorded generation by generation. Many of these genealogies start around the late 1800s and go as far back in time as 1,000 years ago.

Therefore, I have singled out this overlooked collection of books and I refer to them as the Lost Genealogies. If I were to use the old dictionary meaning of “fabulous,” it would really apply here. These genealogies are truly *fabulous*.

The purpose of the next chapter is to reveal these Lost Genealogies and to show you why they are the single most unused source of genealogical data in the world today.

# *The Lost Genealogies*

## **Heraldry, Coats of Arms, and Crests**

Coats of arms and crests originated many centuries ago before the general public could read and write. They were popular throughout Europe, the British Isles (United Kingdom) and Japan.

Knights and soldiers in battle, often wearing suits of armor, with their face helmets closed, did not have a clear view of who was who in the midst of fighting, and a split second hesitation could mean the difference between life and death. Certain garments worn over the armor, and specific symbols emblazoned on their shields were the fastest way to distinguish between one of their own or the enemy. They could recognize color patterns and designs easily, even if they were unable to read or write.

The coats of arms were generally issued by a central legal authority in each country, and were usually reserved for people of noble families and royalty.

In England, for example, even today the *College of Arms* continues to grant arms to those who are deemed worthy. The design involves complicated mixes of symbols, colors and replications of animal furs and metals, all with certain meanings and characteristics.

Today you will see coats of arms for cities, provinces, states and countries and are often part of official seals.

It is important to know, however, that there is generally no such thing as a coat of arms or crest for a surname. Coats of arms were granted to individuals, so having the same surname as someone in the past that had a coat of arms does not mean you are a direct descendant of that person.

Heraldry merchants can be found at fairs, malls, and even on the Internet. They may show you a picture of a coat of arms with your surname below it. Beware of this, unless you know—with genealogical evidence—that you are a direct descendant of the original person to whom such arms were granted. Save your money.

Why then, does legitimate heraldry play such an important part in genealogical research? Applicants for coats of arms had to attach genealogical evidence as documentation, which had to be verified as part of the registration of arms. In some cases the coat of arms came with extensive genealogy—or at the very least a brief family history—that's why it is so important.

Such genealogies will trace the ancestry of European families back into the 1300s and sometimes even earlier than that. It is the most neglected area of genealogical research.

Genealogies attached to coats of arms bridge huge gaps that are missing in written records. These genealogies had to be accepted by the authorities granting arms. The authorities had professional experts who thoroughly examined all genealogical evidence. It was very serious business.

Remember that although these arms were originally for noble families, the genealogies would nevertheless often include people that were not of the nobility themselves, including those who were distantly related in some way. Many of these marvelous genealogies would often encompass time periods where genealogical records were either missing or had been destroyed.

More than 250,000 people were awarded coats of arms in the past. Imagine the genealogies and family histories and the connectivity that would be included among such a large number of people. I daresay that millions of people would fall under one huge genealogical umbrella.

As more heraldic genealogies are discovered, more pieces are added to this global jigsaw puzzle that is truly gigantic in size.

As usual, the pessimists will say most records can never be found, whereas optimists and realists can say truthfully that with each passing year, a virtual torrent of new information is emerging and sometimes it originates from the most unlikely places.

How far it will evolve in years to come is anybody's guess, but it will – without any doubt – continue to grow larger and larger as we move into the future where vast storehouses of information and knowledge will reside at our fingertips.

It is also possible that genetics will be able to be combined with what you know of your family tree, to actually extend your genealogy – by person if not by name – back far enough to connect in with ancestors from centuries ago. Still skeptical? Visit the many websites involved in DNA sampling. Here are just a few of many that may surprise you:

The oldest original books combining heraldry and genealogy were all painstakingly made by hand. In a few cases just one original is made. In other cases, copies were made one by one for a limited number of patrons, libraries or archives.

The Genealogical Research Library has copied many of these handwritten books and once the genealogies are completely indexed, they will make them available. Once again, what was once available only to the privileged few in the past will be available to everyone, at little or no cost.

As these books of heraldry with attached genealogies are assembled together and added to the growing genealogical databases, the skeptics who predicted huge gaps would always remain will be proven wrong once again.

The rest of this chapter contains a few samples of heraldic designs and the genealogies associated with them.

I trust that these images – and copies – are worth thousands of words, so I will let them speak for themselves. These are very real examples of The Lost Genealogies.







Der obengenannte livländische Stammvater des Geschlechts Bartholomaeus hatte 2 Söhne: Bartholo-

maeus (II.) — Argemes und Laurenz (der Aeltere genannt) — Ermess — die 1486 auftreten Letzterer hinterliess eine Wittwe N. N. geb. v. Guitseff, die 1505 Repshof erhielt.

Vielelleicht ein dritter Bruder derselben und Sohn des Bartholomaes war Hans Ergemess, dessen Schwiegervater, Frombold Brincken mit ihm am Montag nach Peter und Paul 1467 von Diedrich v. Brincken, dessen Anteil am Dorfe Kippewer, den Hof zu Lemover und das Dorf Kondess (Ksp. Waimel) und Dorf Linnastwer (Ksp. Kapstewer) kauft. 1468 überträgt genannter Frombold und seine Frau Else genanntem Hans Ergemess dies erkaufte Gut (Hof Kyppegerwe-Kibbijerw i/E.) dem der D. O. M. Berend v. d. Borch dasselbe d. d. Wenden 1474 Dienstag nach Michaelis bestätigt.

Er war 1505 todt; seine Söhne Reinhold u. Lorenz II., (der junge genannt) erhalten d. d. 26. Mai 1505 Kibbijerw und den Besitz v. Repshof (s. oben Laurenz) durch den Comthnr von Fellin: Wennemar v. Delwig zugesprochen.

Reinhold, der schon 1501 urkundlich, ist wohl erblos verstorben, wogegen Lorenz II. die genannten Güter, wie auch Schloss Lade (das einer seiner Söhne Johann indess 9. September 1518 dem Johann von Plettenberg auftrug) übernahm.

Ausser Johann hatte Lorenz II. noch 3 Söhne: I.) Lorenz III. (trotz 1539 dessen Wittwe 1539 Pfandbesitzerin von Kondes war und dessen Sohn Lorenz IV. 1541 Mandever und Moisema i/E. verpfändete. 1547 und 1549. 1554 1559 urkundlich auf Kojel und Sall i/E. erscheint und erblos am 11. September 1560 gegen die Russen im Gefecht blieb, II) Reinhold und III) Fromhold.

Diese beiden theilten am 11. Juni 1549 das ihnen von ihrem Stiefvater Johann v. Wrangel auf Luhde als Entschädigung für gewisse Ansprüche eine Zeitlang entzogen gewesene, aber vom Comthnr zu Fellin am 26. Mai 1540 wieder zugesprochene Dorf Kibbijerw (s. oben) wozu damals der gleichnamige Hof, die Dörfer Lemmofer, Kowtts, Toylemets, die Mühle zu Watsilli, das Gesinde an der Arro und der Krug zu Wemel, wie das Dorf Atzejerwe (Ahtjerwe), das sie 1552 verkaufen, gehörte.

Ende des 16. Jahrhunderts besassen die Gebrüder Lorenz und Jacob (beide tott 1600) Kibligerw, sowie die (von Lorenz IV. ererbten) Güter Sall und Ottenküll i/L. Ihre Kinder erhielten vom Herzog Carl von Südermanland am 5. Dezember 1600 Kibbigerw bestätigt, was Kunigunde, Tochter oder Enkelin, eines von ihnen nebst Sall und Ottenküll ihrem Gemahl Heinrich v. Stryk 1632 zubrachte.

Vorher achon, nämlich am 22. März 1597 d. d. Warschau bestätigte K. Sigmund III. von Polen einem Caspar I. v. Ermes die Güter Kokenberg und Wiegandshof (auch Ermeshof) geheissen, die schon (wahrscheinlich) Hans zur Ordenszeit besessen hatte, als alte Erbgüter. Dieselben vererbt auf Caspars I. Sohn: Caspar II., dem sie, als Schwed. Regimentsquartiermeister, er starb vor 1649 als Oberst und Commandant v. Erfurt) v. Schweden bestätigt wurden. Seinen unmündigen Kindern (aus der Ehe mit Anna v. Löwenwolde) (geb. 1609 † 1648) wurde von der Königin Christine am 6. Juli 1649 die nochmalige Bestätigung darüber zu Theil. Von diesen Kindern hinterliess anscheinend nur Johann Caspar († vor 1682 als schwed. Rittmeister) Nachkommen, denen die Schwed. Reductionskommission am 23. Januar 1683 die Güter ebenfalls beließ, dergleichen Pnikeln, was der Familie aus Tiesenhausensehen Besitz vererbt war.

In die Livländische Adelsmatrikel wurde (in die Matrikeln v. 1742, 1745 und 1747) die Familie v. E. bei Klasse I sub Nr. 1 verzeichnet und zwar die Häuser Kokenberg und Wiegandshof, welche damals Johann Aренд v. B., 1743 Ordnungsgerichtsadjunkt, dann Ordnungsrichter besass, der sie 1749, nebst Puikeln, verkaufte und der auch Jummerdehn inne hatte, was die Erben des Kammerjunkers v. E. 1784 verkauften.

Eine derselben (wohl die Letzte ihres Geschlechts) war Wilhelmine v. E., welche sich mit dem Hofrat v. Berg auf Mahlenhof vermählte und eines Ahnen ist des Feldmarschalls Grafen v. Berg, der auch ihr Wappen in das seinige aufgenommen hat. In Esthland ist die Familie am 8. Februar 1745 als notorisch bei Klasse I (Nr. 22) eingetragen, aber dort bald ebenfalls erloschen.

Auf dem gekrönten Helme mit schwarz-goldsilbernen Decken der rechte Mohrenrumpf.

Die auf Tafel 93 nach dem Siegel des Laurenz Ermes (Arrimis) v. 1552 gezeichneten Wappen hat statt der Mohrenrämpfe einen halben Moskowiter u. dgl. Königin.

Das älteste bekannte Siegel (des Bartholomaeus v. E., v. J. 1457) zeigt unter 2 am Halse abgeschnittenen Mannsköpfen im Schildhaupte, 9 (3. 3. 3) Pfennige im Schilde; dagegen führt Lorenz Ermes 1547 einen ganz dem Wappen, der „von Dücker“ ähnelnden Wappenschild (mehrere Balken oder Schach).







Böhmisches Freiherrenstand dto. 1605. 9. 9. für Joachim v. M. und seine Vettern Balthasar, Hans und Georg; Reichsgrafenstand dto. 1633. 12. 11. für Joachim Frhrn. v. M.

Uraltes schlesisches Geschlecht, welches seit Beginn des XIV. Jahrhunderts in schlesischen und glätzischen Urkunden unter dem Namen Czeczow, Czechow, Czeschow vorkommt; der Name Mettich wurde von dem Gute Mettkau (Mettichow, Metchow, Medgow) wohl angenommen. In glätzischen Urkunden erscheinen 1316 Otto und Tamme (Thomas) Cz., 1412 Hans Cz. und noch 1456 ein anderer Hans Cz. Als Stammvater des Geschlechtes dürfte Schibko oder Schibeschin v. Cz. zu Gross-Peterwitz und Polsnitz (Kr. Neumarkt) zu betrachten sein, welcher mit Herzog Bernhard von Münsterberg in der Schlacht bei Mühldorf kämpfte und bis 1360 erwähnt wird. Dessen Nachkommen Thamme, Otto und Friedrich werden unter dem Namen „Medgow zu Ossig“ (Kr. Striegau) erwähnt, wogegen Kuno 1391 als „Metschow“ aufgeführt wird. Des letzteren Nachkommen Scheijbechin, Hans und Friedemann „Metchow“ verkaufen 1405 Polsnitz an das Vinzenzstift in Breslau; Georg v. „Metchaw“ 1452 auf Ingamsdorf (Kr. Schweidnitz); 1454 Heinrich v. „Tzetschaw“, Erbherr auf Paulsdorf (Pohlsdorf, Kr. Neumarkt). Von letzterem stammte Hans auf „Metche“ (Mettkau, Kr. Neumarkt) und Borganie (ibid.), welcher als der nähere Stammvater der Freiherren und Grafen von Mettich zu betrachten ist und 1496 starb. Er hinterliess 3 Söhne: Balthasar auf „Metche“ 1502—1540, Kaspar auf Borganie († 1553) und Hans auf Neudorf (Kr. Neumarkt) † 1551. Kaspars Nachkommenschaft erlosch mit seinen Enkeln; von Balthasar stammte Ladislaus, Amtmann der Comende Gröbnig, welcher um 1570 Zeiselwitz (Kr. Neustadt), sowie 1584 Mochau (ibid.) und Gläsen (Kr. Leobschütz) erwarb († 1585); von Hans stammten Christoph und Nicolaus (welche 1569 Hilbersdorf bei Falkenberg erkaufsten), Joachim (welcher 1607 das Seniorat Wiese mit den Gütern Langenbrück, Riegersdorf, Buckelsdorf,

Dittmannsdorf etc im Kreise Neustadt stiftete) und Caspar (bis 1597 auf Hünern, seit 1602 auf Schräbsdorf c. pert.). Die Söhne Ladislaus: Balthasar, Hans und Georg, sowie Nicolaus Sohn Joachim wurden in den Freiherrenstand erhoben; letzterer später auch in den Grafenstand. Dieselben übernahmen 1604 die Schlossherrschaft Ratibor in Pfandbesitz, welche 1609 in Erbbesitz überging und bis 1631 bei dem Geschlechte blieb. Balthasar († 1612 oder 1613) hinterliess von seiner Gemahlin Helena v. Schaffgotsch zwei Töchter und einen Sohn, Hans Christoph, welcher nach kinderloser Ehe mit Juliana v. Zvole und Goldstein 1635 starb; Hans war 1579 Comthur des Johanniterordens zu Klein-Oels, 1585 zu Lossen und Gross-Tinz und starb 1610 als k. k. Kämmerer, Hof-Kammerrath und Ober-Silberkämmerer; Georg hinterliess bei seinem Tode 1613 aus seiner Ehe mit Maria v. Bauch einen Sohn, Hans Georg, mit welchem seine Nachkommenstafte erlosch. Joachim setzte den Stamm dauernd fort, bis derselbe mit dem Tode des Grafen Heinrich Josef Ferdinand 1853. 11. 4. im Mannesstamme erlosch.

Aus der adligen Linie (von Kaspar abstammend) war Hans auf Wiersbel (Kr. Falkenberg) und Schräbsdorf k. k. Rath und Hauptmann von Münsterberg und Frankenstein († 1621) und dessen Bruder Nicolaus († zw. 1614 — 18) Johanniterordens Comthur zu Klein-Oels (seit 1609), erzherzoglicher Kämmerer und Geh. Rath; mit des ersten Söhnen aus der Ehe mit Anna Maria v. Zedlitz — Hans Nicolaus auf Schräbsdorf († 1625) und Karl — erlosch dieser Zweig. Ausserdem blühte noch — von oben-nannten Georg (1452) abstammend — eine adlige Linie, in deren Besitz Gregersdorf, Paulsdorf (Pohlsdorf), Ingramsdorf, Roth-Kirschdorf, Schmachtenhayn, Struse, Seifersdorf, Mittel-Peila, Langen-Neudorf, Guhrwitz, Karisch etc. erscheinen; doch erlosch auch diese Linie in der zweiten Hälfte des XVII. 



# *Finding People in the Present*

## **Dead or Alive?**

There is a myriad of reasons why you might want to locate someone that you believe is living somewhere in North America. This section will cover techniques for finding people living in the present, both here and in many other countries.

If the person you seek was living in the U.S., then before going through a sequence of searches to find him or her in the present, you should first check to see if that person has died recently. For example, you may be trying to locate an old friend that you went to school with when you were a child.

The Social Security Death Index (SSDI) is maintained in the U.S. Social Security Administration's Death Master File.

The names include anyone who had a Social Security Number (SSN) and whose death was reported to Social Security Administration, and if benefits were payable to the surviving spouse. It contains applications beginning at the end of 1936, although the vast majority of records are for those who died between 1965 and the present. It is updated annually.

Currently, my personal favorite free source of this index is maintained at [www.newenglandancestors.org](http://www.newenglandancestors.org). Updated to 2005, the SSDI contains the names of about 75 million people. The exact address for the SSDI is:

If you find the person you seek, you can also order a copy of their original SSN application form. That application usually shows the full name (and in the case of women, their maiden name), place of birth, date of birth, their address at the time of application, color, the names of parents including the maiden name of the mother, and the signature of the applicant. The signature is very important for comparing to wills, deeds and other important documents the deceased may have signed.

Once you locate data in the SSDI, you can then order a copy of the Application for a Social Security Number (SS-5). To request a copy of a SS-5 form, you must send a letter to the Social Security Administration (pursuant to the *Freedom of Information Act*) with the details of the individual in question. Your letter must include: the name of the individual, the social security number, date and place of death and reason the information is wanted (family history is an acceptable reason). You will

need to inquire what the charge is—fees have been rising. Send your letter to:

One last search you might want to do, however, before searching for a living person, is to check out [www.interment.net](http://www.interment.net) for cemetery listings, especially if you know the likely state or a tri-state area where he or she might have died.

Once you have carried out the SSDI search, if you do not find a record indicating death and benefits, then it is quite possible that the person you are seeking is actually alive today. In that case, the following section will prove most useful. Finding an old friend from years ago, or finding a long-lost relative, can be a very exciting experience.

## **U.S. - Searching for a Living Person**

A recent and very powerful search used by governments, lawyers, businesses, professional skip tracers and individuals is available at

[www.zabasearch.com](http://www.zabasearch.com)

Free search results will often include the last several addresses of an individual. In many cases it often reveals the birth year, month or date so you can use a process of elimination to zero in on the person you seek.

Another bonus—search results will often include telephone numbers (don't be surprised to see both listed and unlisted numbers).

Zabasearch claims that this free public information is collected from phone listings, court records, real property records, subscriptions etc. In other words, they claim that their sources are publicly available government records and commercial sources.

For those with an investigative trait, Zabasearch offers a background check for a fee, which may provide a lot of information about an individual.

Once you have the street address in Zabasearch, you can go to [www.terraserver.com](http://www.terraserver.com) for a satellite image of the area. To get driving instructions and road maps, go to the popular [www.mapquest.com](http://www.mapquest.com). This is also a very useful website if you are vacationing anywhere in the U.S. and Canada.

New and impressive technology will soon be available from [www.pictometry.com](http://www.pictometry.com). They will be able to provide images of buildings and homes in 3D technology with 45-degree angle photography. A sample is available on

the website. It will provide excellent visualization for 911 emergency calls as well as an unlimited number of other uses.

Although zaba means free, this search may not be free in the near future. I would not be surprised to see an annual subscription fee or minimum annual purchase of one background check per year, for example - time will tell. At the time of writing this website search is in beta or testing mode and is free unless you want a background search.

More than a decade ago, white and yellow page listings began appearing on the Internet. Today, it is relatively easy to acquire mailing addresses and telephone numbers along with postal or zip codes.

In England and the UK, check out www.192.com which as well as directories, has an amazing set of electoral rolls covering the years 2002 to 2008. These even allow investigators to verify the ages of people in some years. I'm certain that these kinds of searches will be in strong demand in the future in many other countries.

To locate telephone directories in other countries, I will first assume you have read the section on search engines. If so, then the easiest way is to use a search engine and enter white pages Sweden, for example. In some countries, what we call white pages (in North America) are actually known as yellow pages in some other countries, so the alternative technique is to enter into a search engine yellow pages followed by the name of the country. Experiment with naming a large city rather than a country if you have no success.

Contacting people by telephone is not all that expensive compared to years ago, and costs have been coming down thanks to websites like [www.magicjack.com](http://www.magicjack.com) and [www.jaxtr.com](http://www.jaxtr.com). Remember too that people having the same surname and living in the same area as the person you seek may know the person you're looking for. I've

used white page searches effectively many times over the past two decades. Often this search has located the person I was seeking after all other search techniques had failed.

*What if you don't know the surname?*

Believe it or not, there is a way of searching for someone if you don't have a surname, or if you have forgotten the surname. It is a simple three-step process that is easy once you know how!

(1.) Go to [www.intelius.com](http://www.intelius.com) and select a state, enter the first name and if you know the initial for the middle name enter it also. The more information you can supply, the better. Also, a rare or unusual given name will produce a manageable list of search results.

(2.) Search. The results can then be examined. You will see a list of people with the first names and initials you provided, along with their actual surnames. You may recognize the surname if you have forgotten it, but even if you don't, you have a list of possible names to check out. And how do you check them out? Copy the list or print it out on a sheet of paper, and proceed to the next step.

(3.) Go to [www.411.com](http://www.411.com) and enter the full name details you now have, and the state. The search results usually provide you with the full address and telephone number in most instances.

If you find who you are looking for, you can call them to ensure you have the right person and not someone else who just happens to have the same name as the person you seek. Don't ever make assumptions about this. Once you think you have found the right person, you can go back to [www.intelius.com](http://www.intelius.com) and order a background search to see if you have a match (former addresses, etc.).

This search technique works well at the time of writing, but may not be available in the future. The future is uncertain, however, so there may actually be several ways of carrying out this type of search.

## **Searching for the Living: Worldwide**

Another way of finding someone living today is to use quotation marks around the person's name (include their middle name or initial if you have it) in a search engine. Search engine techniques are outlined in a previous chapter. This is a very powerful search, global in its scope, and should never be overlooked. Also, use the advanced features in the search engine to narrow your search even more. If you don't use the advanced features you are not doing the best job of searching.

Your next step would be to check newspapers. The chapter, Finding People in the Past, ends with a careful outline of how to locate newspapers in any country, and more importantly, how to search digital newspapers

online. Since many of the newspapers are indexed by every name, up to the present date, you can search for a living person, either today (literally), or during the last decade, for example.

Digital newspapers with digital indexes to every name mentioned therein are a very new type of resource that will have a profound effect on all researchers and biographers in the near future. While many genealogists are using them already, chances are the number of people using this technique will grow rapidly. Many people alive today, including those who might be called hermits or obscure citizens by others, can be located in this manner.

## **Dead or Alive in Canada**

Zabasearch does not currently extend into Canada, but one website that caters to companies as clients to carry out background checks, credit reports and criminal records is [www.backcheck.net](http://www.backcheck.net).

In Canada, nothing similar to the SSDI exists for public access yet, but there are excellent indexes to cemeteries, the most notable of which are the OCFA5 and OCFA6 (Ontario Cemetery Finding Aid) and the BCCFA (British Columbia Cemetery Finding Aid).

Ontario is the most populated province and the OCFA5 and OCFA6 are indexes to people buried in Ontario.

One major disadvantage is that it does not include the date or year of burial. While this is a serious missing piece of data, this search does provide a great benefit to persons who had either uncommon surnames or given names. Also, if you know the county where an ancestor might be buried, this search is very helpful. The city of Toronto is not covered very well in the OCFA search, but Mt. Pleasant Cemetery and its associated cemeteries have very complete computerized records on site.

The OCFA search has the names of more than three million people. To search, go to:

The BCCFA is similar, but it does contain dates. It is very valuable for locating burials in British Columbia. This is a free search of the burial records of 344,000 people, and is available from:

The Alberta Genealogical Society has been indexing cemeteries throughout the province and will do limited searches for a \$2 fee at the time of writing. Check for updates at:

## **Genealogical Societies**

In each province, genealogical societies and their branches have indexed many of the cemeteries in their district or county, often with full extracts and dates. The advantage is that you usually find the person you seek along with other family members mentioned on the gravestone or on a cluster of family stones.

## **Large Libraries**

If you live in Canada, then sizeable regional libraries, provincial libraries, and provincial archives have extensive collections of other useful documents.

As well—and always worthy of note—the Metropolitan Toronto Reference Library (MTRL) is Canada's largest public reference library. It has an excellent collection of records covering many provinces, and in fact, many countries.

# *The Future Internet*

Where is the Internet headed in the future?

I provided an answer to this years ago, in the first edition of this book, and the answer remains so simple that it is almost elusive to the experts.

If you can speak with a child, or if you can think for a moment like a teenager, the answer is plainly evident.

If you ask a child when he would like to hear his favorite song he will say right now. If you needed to know the population of a country for a paper you are writing, you want it now. This idea of the instant world has led us to calling young people The Now Generation.

What we want is now.

If you extrapolate that and look at the World Wide Web and picture it as the source of instant everything, then you will see where the web is going. Some corporations and governments may arrive struggling, kicking and screaming, but they will be inevitably dragged along by the people towards the eventual outcome: Instant information, instant media, the past and the present—all available, now.

Already television cable companies have responded to this public pressure – you and your family may want

to watch a certain movie at 6 p.m., stop the movie for supper at 7 p.m., start it up again at 8 p.m. and put it on pause while you get a snack, take a break, or when you want to create your own intermission.

In this case, the media is bending to your timetable and needs, instead of forcing you to bend to an artificial timetable that is not related to, nor cognizant of, your personal needs.

People don't want to build their lives around the media, they want the media to be responsive to their desires at the very moment they want it. And it is already headed in that direction. Convergence will escalate into new territory.

If it is cheap enough or freely included in a monthly service fee, the public will respond. Google learned this early, as well as other websites, large and small. The Internet has proved this time and time again, and created many millionaires simply because they caught sight of what the people wanted, and they met these needs.

All music, all motion pictures, all history, all geography, all education, all art, all music, all art forms, all knowledge, will be wanted on that instant basis. That is the ultimate goal of the future Internet.

If a teacher is world famous because students find him or her to be one of the best, then why shouldn't a million people be able to tune in to that inspiring

teacher and repeat the lesson or speed it up, based on their own progress? Why shouldn't they learn at their own speed and still be able to gather in groups and forums and socialize with others?

This is the most probable desired future, and we are moving rapidly in that direction.

In the 1980s, I was told that a patent of a new invention in Europe would take an average of five years before U.S. researchers became aware of it. This was called the technology gap. Now that five-year gap is almost instantaneous.

Several thousand years ago, the prophet Daniel predicted that the day would come when

...knowledge would cover the earth as the waves cover the sea.

In 1947 and again in a reprinted edition in 1960, Philip Wylie, in his book, *An Essay on Morals*, stated,

American or Russian, Chinaman, Jap, Hindu, or Briton - we are all on this same planet which has become boat-sized (all) of a sudden.<sup>1</sup>

In 1962, Marshall McLuhan, in his book, *The Gutenberg Galaxy*, wrote about a global electronic village where he envisioned a shared information space—an invisible

place where space and time were no longer barriers to acquiring knowledge.<sup>2</sup>

That time is now, and for better rather than worse, the personal computer and the Internet may eventually become the communicative glue that helps to link mankind into a fabric of oneness, creating a new bond of kinship that would include all races, cultures, sciences and religions.

If you spend just a few minutes reading the instructions below, and you will be searching like a professional in minutes.

(1) First, select the country, or religious group, or ethnic group you wish to research, and you are on your way. If you have (or can borrow) a scanner with OCR capability, you can scan your chosen list, and then change the scanned image into digital text. That's the key.

(2) Then, copy your digital list of websites into an email. Then, at the very end of each website link, press the enter button on your keyboard, and you should instantly create a hyperlink. Continue down the list changing each website address into a link.

(3) Then, send the email to yourself. When it arrives, you can then click on any link and travel instantly to the selected website. Another way to accomplish the same thing would be to copy the web links you created

in your email, into a Word document instead, for easy reference.

As you know, websites URLs can change, so over time from this publication date there will be some updating required to keep things current in the website directory.

Please note that the directory will be regularly updated through membership in [www.grl.com](http://www.grl.com) or you can use search engines to add additional websites suitable for your own personal objectives.
