artists the opportunity to display their work on full bus wraps, while 10 artists receive back-of-bus space. "We created [the initiative] to incite constructive conversations about transit and find ways for this public agency to support the local art scene," says Pola Bunster, director of storytelling at Prism.

"There has been a bit of a lack of support for smaller artists over the bigger names, so this was seen as a big win for the local art scene-it provided this moving canvas for them."

Nate Dee, winner of a full-bus wrap, infused elements of colorful Haitian art into a dynamic design that's quintessential Miami, incorporating the Freedom Tower, a flamingo, and blooming orange blossoms. "It looks overwhelmingly beautiful when you see it massively on the bus," says Bunster, and Miamians seem to agree, as they're snapping shots of the vehicles and sharing them all over social media. "People are

starting to connect where they've seen these artists' work before, and they're realizing they're from Miami, they're local, and they're reinvesting a sense of local pride. And it's all coming through Miami-Dade Transit supporting the arts."

Riding the bus has never been so cool. ■

ENEIDA M. HARTNER ELEMENTARY GETS A COLORFUL REVAMP WITH THE HELP OF WYNWOOD SCHOOL ARTS PROGRAM THE RAW PROJECT. **BY SHELLIE FRAI**

The world's most acclaimed artists flock to the Wynwood Arts District year round to take part in exclusive projects, gallery exhibitions, and... go to school? Thanks to Re-Imagining the Arts in Wynwood (RAW), an initiative to bring art education to schools with limited budgets, Eneida M. Hartner Elementary became part of the annual Miami Art Week extravaganza. With the help of more than 30 artists from the US and around the globe, the blank walls of a school filled with 570 young students have become colorful and eyecatching murals of inspiration.

But it's not just worldrenowned artists lending their talents to the project. Miami Dolphins wide receiver Jarvis Landry got in on the action when participating street artist Kai Aspire recruited him to paint a mural that would both delight and inspire students. "Kai wanted to tie in another part of the Miami culture, and the Miami Dolphins and Jarvis are a huge part of this city," says RAW founder Robert De Los Rios. Their creation? A giantsized cartoon-style child reaching for the stars while balancing atop schoolbooks, sports balls, and a guitar. "[The piece] represents a child never giving up," De Los Rios says. "It's a beautiful message."





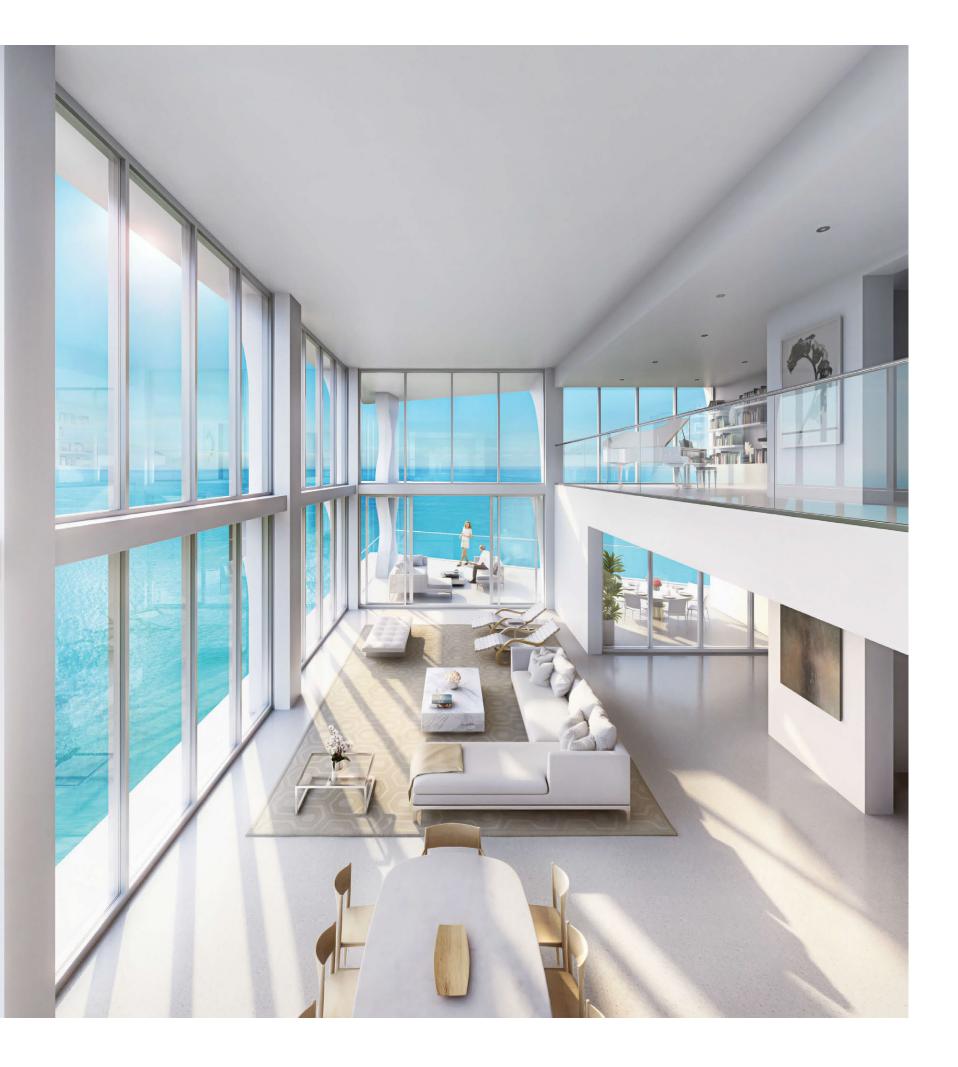








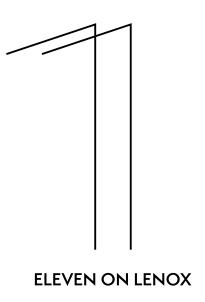






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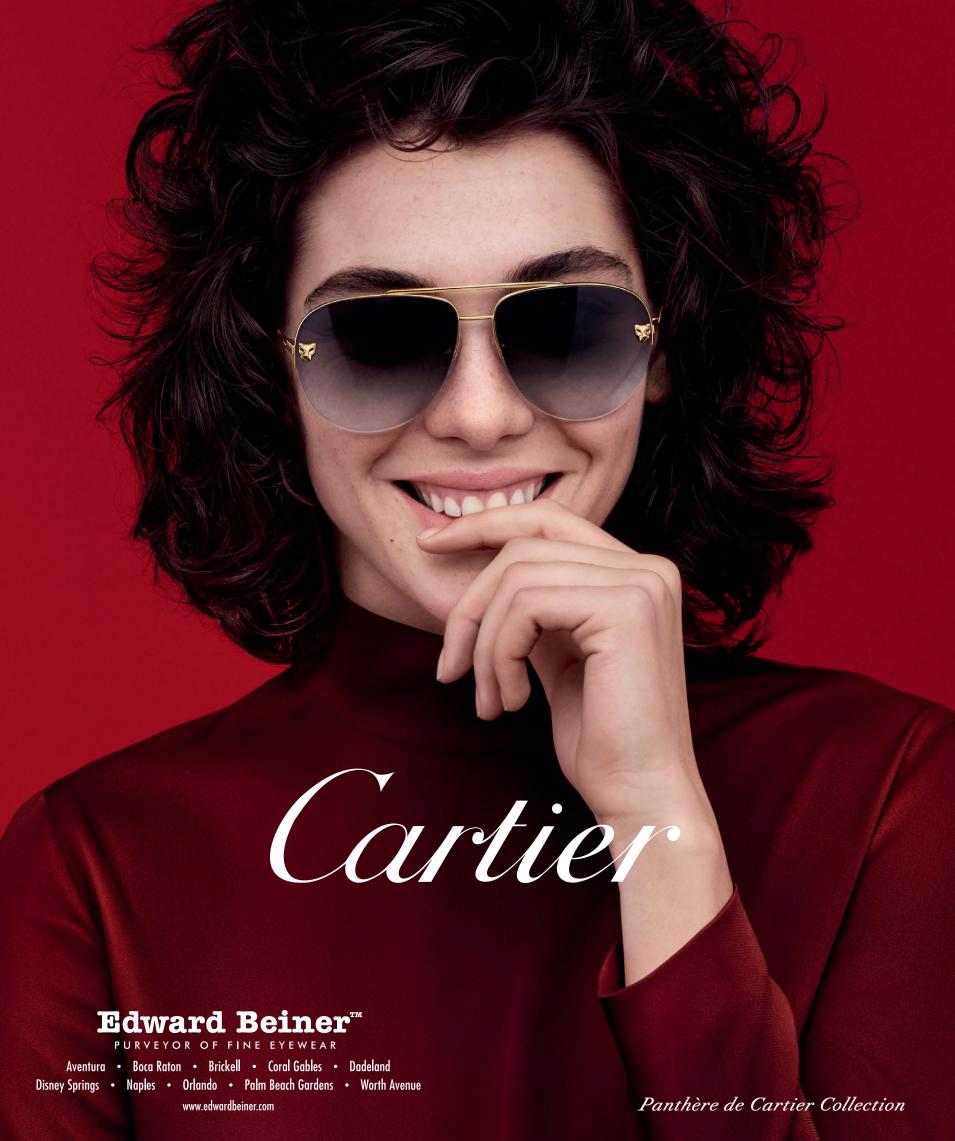

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JONATHAN SAUNDERS

DEBUTS AS DVF'S FIRST-EVER CHIEF CREATIVE OFFICER.

The name Diane von Furstenberg evokes a rush of unique attributes: femininity, empowerment, confidence, grace. It also conjures New York itself. So when designer Jonathan Saunders presented his first collection for the iconic brand for Spring/Summer 2017, many wondered how a man from Scotland might interpret the vision of a worldly New York woman. The answer, it turns out, is quite successfully.

"I saw it straight awaythat effortless sense of ease, femininity without being too girly or froufrou, sensuality, and a provocative nature," says Saunders, 39, who built his name in London with his eponymous, print-heavy collection (which shuttered in late 2015 after 12 years in business), and who is now Diane von Furstenberg's first creative head not named Diane von Furstenberg. "Textiles, and printed textiles in general, were always something I loved, so there is a definite synergy between what I stand for and what the brand stands for."

As von Furstenberg herself steps away from designing to focus more on her philanthropic work, Saunders has segued with ease into the newly created role of chief creative officer. With about three months to present his first collection-which features original Saunders prints—there wasn't much time to sweat the small stuff.

"It was definitely a baptism by fire," he says. "But there was such goodwill and belief within the team about what I wanted to do, which enabled me to go in with the velocity that was required to put a collection together within that period of time."

That velocity-driven result is a lively, eclectic mix of printed separates, including bold, wide-legged trousers, structured outerwear, flowing skirts, versatile shifts, and, yes, wrap dresses that stay true to the brand's DNA. Printed silks and cottons-from an eye-catching Sakura blossom pattern to more graphic stripes and color blocking-create an overall sense of playful fluidity. Unsurprisingly, Saunders says he turned to dancers and choreographers such as Michael Clark and Pina Bausch when conjuring up the new silhouettes, noting, "Dancers are incredible examples of body movement and sensuality."

And while DVF devotees will appreciate Saunders's respect for the label's heritage, he didn't shy away from threading his own point of view throughout. One wrap-style dress in particular manages to combine a mixture of seemingly every print in the collection-a testament to his willingness to venture into unexpected territory.

"When Diane started the brand, it was about effortless clothes, but also interesting clothes. These weren't simple, retiring dresses-they were bold, bright dresses that happen to have a sense of ease," he says. "That still feels really relevant today." 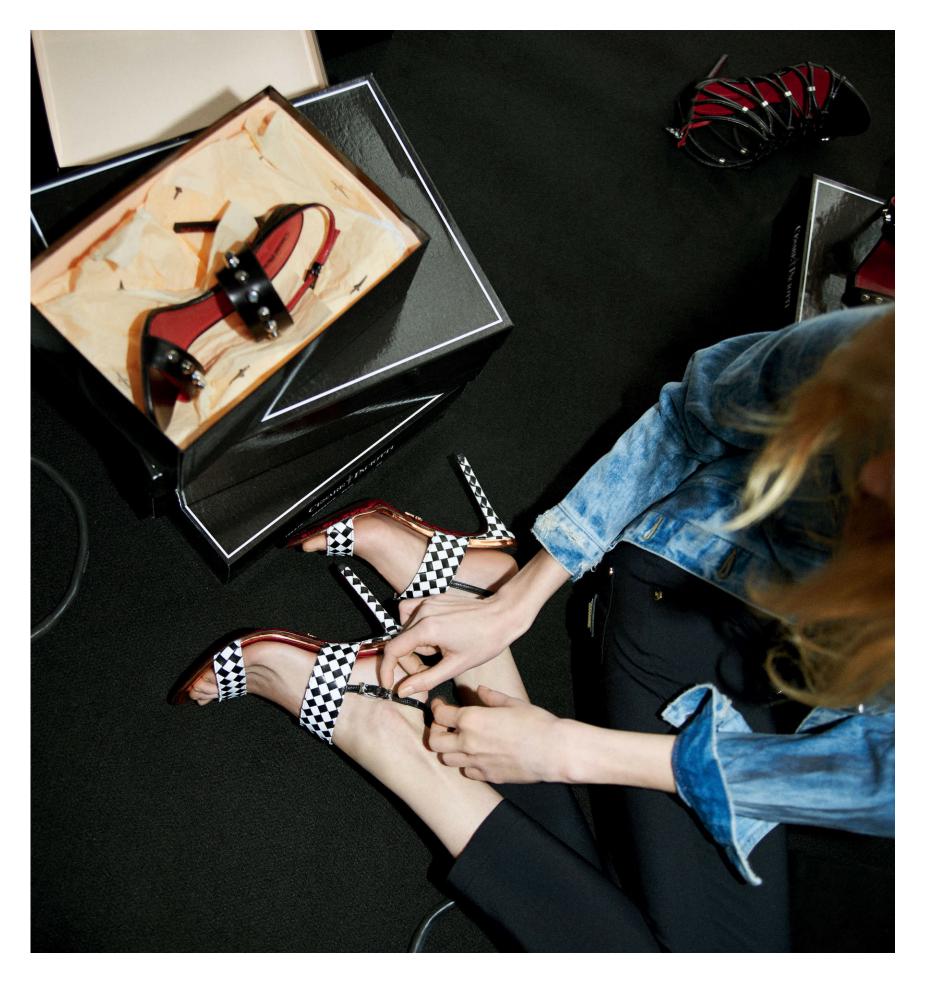

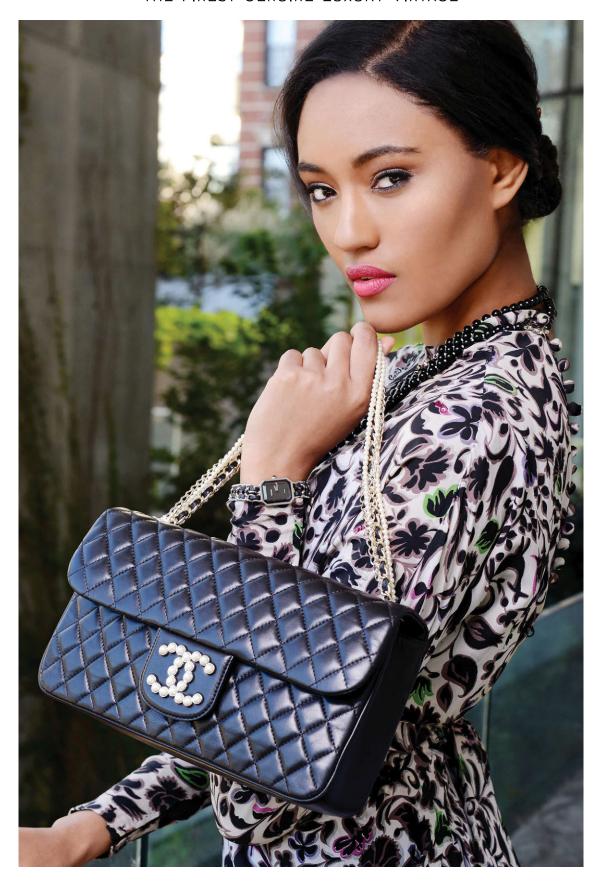

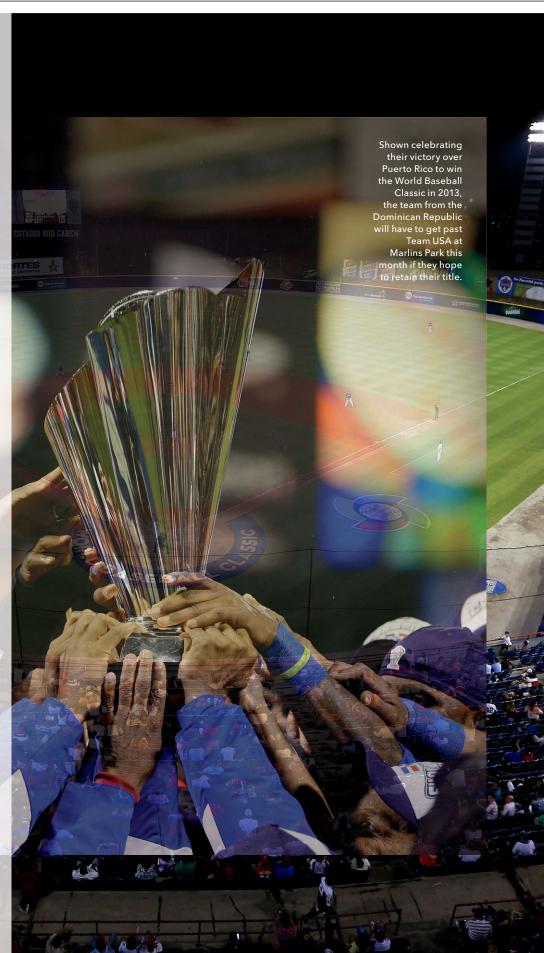

Appropriately dubbed the World Cup of baseball, the World Baseball Classic is back at Marlins Park for its first round of action from March 9 to 13. LIGHTS, CAMERA, MIAMI!

SOON-TO-BE-BUZZED-ABOUT FLICKS ARE SEEN FIRST AT THE MIAMI FILM FESTIVAL. BY BRETT SOKOL

The Miami Film Festival is back for its 34th edition with 10 days of eyeopening documentaries, provocative foreign flicks, and even a few Oscar hopefuls. Director of Programming Jaie Laplante explains how it all came together.

Are there any films that just

scream Miami? I have a good sense of the pulse of the city. If I'm charged up and excited about a film, I think the public here will be, too. Tell us about opening night. We're going to present Israeli filmmaker Joseph Cedar's new film, Norman. He's a two-time Oscar nominee, for Beaufort in 2007 and Footnote in 2011. This film stars Richard Gere as a New York fixer who accidentally meets the future prime minister of Israel. A few years later, when his friend ascends to power, the story plays out in terms of what power and influence really mean. Gere is extraordinary in the film, and he'll be here opening night. What makes Norman a good fit for kicking off the festival? Miami always wants something different. One year I opened with a documentary, 20 Feet from Stardom, which went on to win an Academy Award. I've opened with an animated film, Chico and Rita. I was looking this year for something that spoke to the mood and culture of our city. A thoughtful, powerful drama was the ticket! 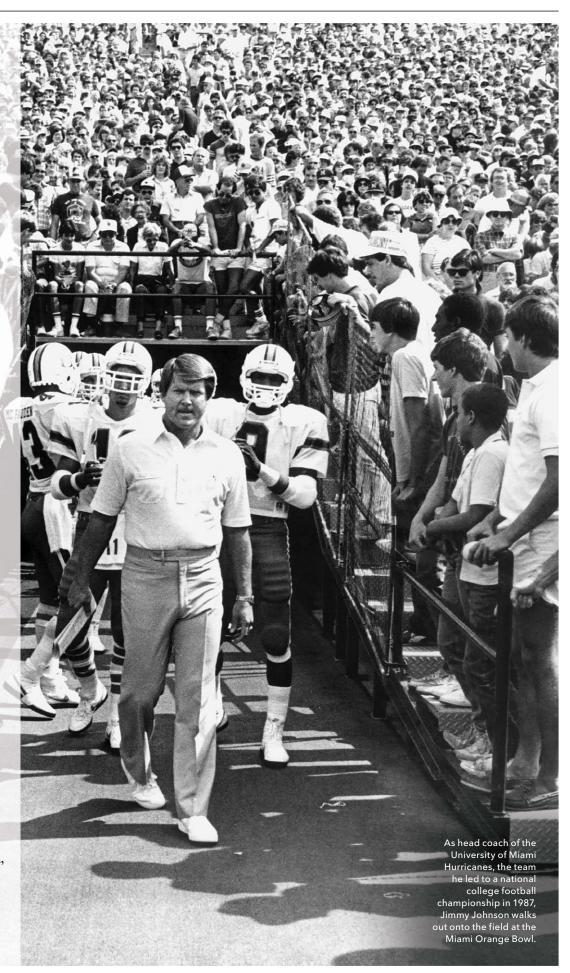
Always game for a little competition, legendary football coach and Fox NFL Sunday analyst Jimmy Johnson hosts the sixth annual edition of Jimmy Johnson's Quest for the Ring Championship Fishing Week, taking place March 8–11 in Key Largo. The contest includes the two-day National Billfish Championship, with many of the best anglers in the country competing for a guaranteed purse of \$1 million. Johnson sat down with Ocean Drive to talk competitive fishing, football, and life in the Keys.

Can fishing be as competitive as football?

It's not as competitive as when I was coaching football, for the simple reason that I don't want to fish unless I can enjoy it and relax. There wasn't a whole lot of relaxing in the playoffs and when you're winning Super Bowls. But with \$1 million on the

line, it must be hard to relax. It's hard-core. Seminole Hard Rock Hotel & Casino stepped up and decided this year to guarantee a purse of \$1 million, which makes it the largest in the country. But you can still relax and it's still a fun tournament. The dinners and

luncheons are great, but >





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obviously a lot of the charter boat captains and top fishermen from around the country come into the tournament.

Speaking of fun, is your day job with Fox as enjoyable as it looks?

We have a ball. Terry Bradshaw is one of my closest friends. We fly out to LA and we have three TVs set up there in the hotel room, so we watch college football all day on Saturday and then do the show on Sunday. Terry Bradshaw, Howie Long, and I started Fox NFL Sunday 23 years ago. Of course, I took off four years to coach the Dolphins, but we've been doing it a long time. Our ratings are through the roof. I think we beat the

competition by almost 50 percent this year. It's been that kind of dominance ever since we started the show.

You were pretty dominant at the University of Miami. What's your greatest memory from your time coaching at UM?

We had such a great run. I think we lost two regularseason games in four years. What people don't realize is that because we were independent, during my last couple of years I think we played 12 teams that were in the top 15. Nowadays everybody is on television, but back then you might have one big national game. But every other week, we were on national television playing Florida, Florida State, Michigan, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, on and on. It was a lot of visibility, and with the success that we had, it brought in good players. I'm still a huge fan of UM, and I think they're getting better, but that was a different era... Even Alabama doesn't have the schedule and visibility we had back then.

You live in the Keys. How much time do you spend fishing?

During the football season, I'll try to fish once, sometimes twice a week. In the off-season, I'm on the water more-sometimes it's boating, sometimes it's lobster fishing. I do quite a bit of entertaining. I can't count the number of NFL owners, general managers, and head coaches we've had come down to visit. Bill Belichick comes down every off-season and spends time with me. What's the best way to spend a day in the Keys?

It's all going to involve water. First you stop at Jimmy Johnson's Big Chill (104000 Overseas Hwy., Key Largo, 305-453-9066; jjsbigchill.com), and then you go across the street to Pennekamp Coral

Reef State Park and do some snorkeling or diving. Then you can go a little farther south and grab one of the charter boats at Holiday Isle or Duck Key and do some fishing. It's such a beautiful drive all the way to Key West. Jimmy Johnson's Quest for the Ring Championship Fishing Week takes place March 8-11; visit jjfishweek.com for a full schedule and more information.

MIAMI NATIVE **TYPOE** MADE A NAME FOR HIMSELF TAGGING WALLS WITH GRAFFITI. NOW HE'S GOING GLOBAL, EYEING THE FUTURE, AND DESIGNING A FURNITURE LINE.

In 2006, three budding artists took it upon themselves to establish an outdoor gallery in the then-isolated warehouse district known as Wynwood. They negotiated with landlords, begged fellow artists to contribute, and battled the city to make it happen. Typoe Gran was one of the three. He, Books Bischof, and Cristina Gonzalez called themselves Primary Flight. "We hustled day and night to get each and every wall—it was a full-time job," says the artist now known simply as Typoe. "We had no idea that it was going to be a catalyst for gentrification."

As Wynwood developed into the city's first outdoor museum of street art, Typoe's name became synonymous with the movement. But the multidisciplinary artist never considered graffiti his medium. "For me, it was more like a sport," he says. In reality, he had been creating fine art since he was a child growing up in Coral Gables.

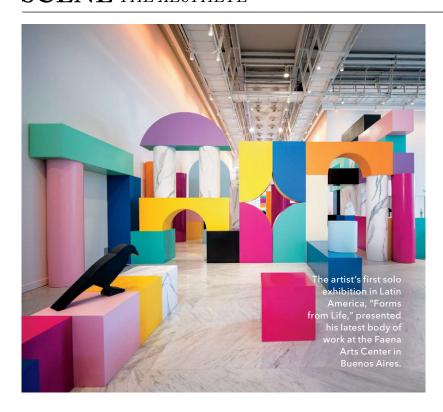
Unfortunately, Typoe had some other adolescent interests as well: drugs, alcohol, and getting into trouble. At 15, his parents sent him to the progressive Hyde School in Maine, which "pretty much saved my life," he says. He finally checked himself into rehab at 20 years old and has never looked back. "Going sober was my defining moment, when I said, 'Goals-I'm going for it.'" He focused on sculpture, learning as he went. "I would just use things around me. Then I would put it together and make sense of it."

By 2010, the newly christened Miami Arts District was the country's hippest neighborhood, the same year that Typoe-guided by gallerist Anthony Spinello-sold a piece at Art Basel Miami Beach titled Confetti Death. >

It was another lifechanging moment.

Since then, the artist has had exhibitions in Mexico, Cuba, and Argentina (at the Faena Hotel in Buenos Aires). He has designed a line of shoes for Del Toro, toured with Skrillex as his art director, created an installation inside the Faena Bazaar, and designed a collection of jackets.

And today Typoe's career is coming full circle as he returns to the outdoors. "Right now a big focus of mine is public art," he says. "I want people to be able to drive by my work, or go to a park and see it." Behind the scenes, he and his partners have retooled Primary Flight as Primary, an art collective and gallery, which he views as a way of giving back to the city that made him. "Miami has been going through this renaissance,

and we've been doing our best to push it in every way we can."

Also ever-changing is the art world and the growing role played by social media. "A lot of my sales happen just because of that," says Typoe of his carefully curated Instagram feed. "There's nothing wrong with doing what you love and making money from it... It's artwork-there's art and there's work. But I stay true to who I am. I'm not going to sell out and start making things that don't make sense."

Next up? A furniture company, debuting in Little Haiti, where he now lives. Expect it to reflect who Typoe is as a person and extend his work as an artist. "I always ask myself this question: If I die next week, if I die tomorrow, am I happy with what I'm leaving in the world and my contribution?" @Typoe ■



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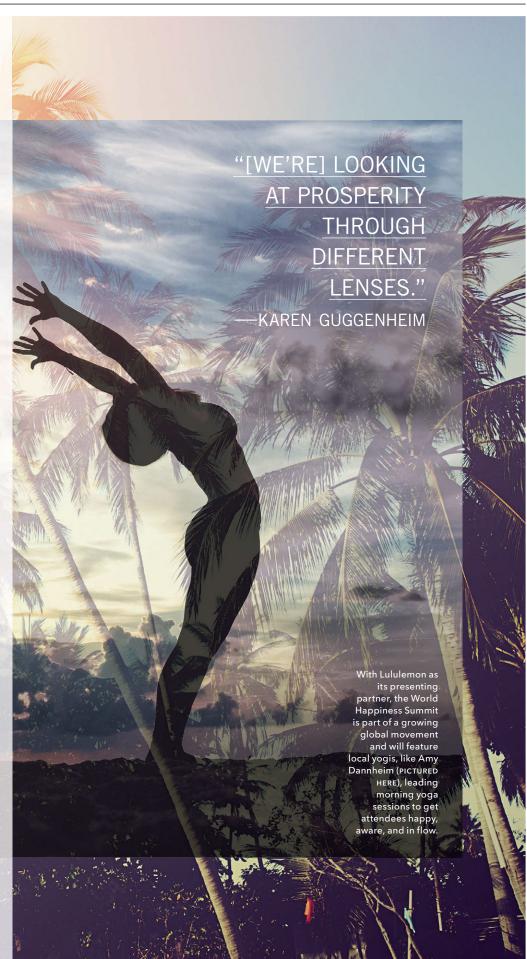

COXING A TENT

ONE OF THE FOUNDING FATHERS OF TECHNO, **CARL COX** MAKES HIS ANNUAL VISIT TO MIAMI TO HOST HIS EPONYMOUS TENT AT ULTRA MUSIC FESTIVAL.

"I would love to come [to Miami] more," says pioneering DJ and music producer Carl Cox. "But it's difficult for me to be everywhere at once." Indeed, at almost 55 years old, there's no stopping Cox from being the life of the party—especially at Ultra—year after year.

You've been playing Ultra Music Festival since 2001 and have had your signature tent for over a decade.

This year the Carl Cox Megastructure will go under the banner of the Resistance—a subgroup of Ultra itself—to create this underground vibe outside of the realm of mainstream [with] a worldwide perspective. As global ambassador, I'm leading that charge.

What should fans expect?

I'm going back to raw and to the reason I'm here in the first place: to continue to mix as much music—whether it's old-school techno, slamming-hard house music, vocals in the track, break beats, or bass lines—as I can. Things have gotten complacent the last couple of years, so it's all about *kapow* and resetting. Beats go up, it gets louder, and I do not quit.

What new talent will be joining you in your tent?

I am giving two girls from the UK called Eli & Fur a fantastic stage to perform on for the first time with me. Laura Fudonk from Liverpool has a very underground Chicago sound. I am taking Saeed Younan, who has been around for a few years but never been able to play at Ultra, under my wing, and a Radio 1 presenter from the UK, B. Traits, who doesn't use a computer, just a USB, and mixes everything.

What about old friends?

We have the big boys—Marco Carola, Joseph Capriati—and [we're] bringing back for the first time in ages Sasha, John Digweed, and a few old surprises. A few young ones.

What if people can't make it to Ultra?

I always do a club funk-and-soul afterparty on Sunday, and this year that's at Basement [at The Miami Beach Edition], which holds 500 people, and I take on a whole new style of music. Most people follow me to that.

Longest you've ever played?

The last long set I played was at Space, and six and a half hours of that was just vinyl. I wanted to show people who have been going to Space for the last five years, and who have never seen me play vinyl, that I still can do that. I've done 11 hours a few times, but anything after that, your brain is fried and you've had enough for one day.

So, vinyl over digital?

I've got a vinyl collection that's 150,000 strong, starting from 1968 and finishing at 2007, sitting right next to me.

What's something about you that would surprise a lot of people?

Every time I show people what I do on my day off—motorcycle sidecar and drag car racing—they gasp. The adrenaline rush at 192 mph is ridiculous. I have over 90 motorcycles and 22 cars in my collection. You're turning 55 this year and still the

You're turning 55 this year and still the man. What's your secret?

I never sat back and watched life pass me by. I've always loved meeting new people and being an adventurer.

Craziest night in Miami?

It was the moment I became Danny Tenaglia's go-go dancer for a couple of years. The place was slammed and Danny wasn't stopping anytime soon, so I got on top of the bar and danced from 5 AM to close at 10 AM. If you've ever danced on a bar before, it's quite a heightening experience.

Last words before Ultra?

Put your phone down and enjoy the music. These are records you won't be able to find, so forget about recording and dance.

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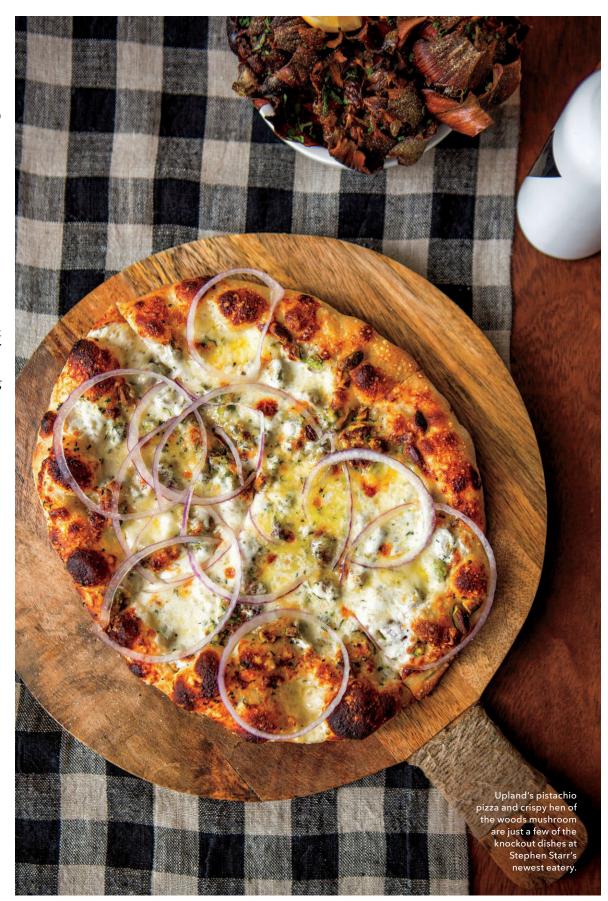
AT NEW YORK TRANSPLANT UPLAND, STEPHEN STARR AND CHEF JUSTIN SMILLIE ARE MAKING MIAMIANS SWOON **OVER CLASSIC CALIFORNIA** CUISINE, THE NEXT BLOOMING ONION, AND SWEET DREAMSICLES.

It's nearly impossible to walk by Upland in the heart of the quaint South of Fifth neighborhood and not be lured inside. A warm, enchanting glow akin to Miami at dusk draws you in, as the smell of wood with a hint of citrus permeates the copper-clad dining room bedecked with gargantuan jars of preserved lemons.

On a Friday night, every table in the 250-seat restaurant is occupied. Zak the Baker eats pistachio-topped pizza with the same hands he uses to make his sourdough. DJ Irie snaps a photo before cutting into a coal-roasted short rib for two crowned with Castelvetrano olives, walnuts, and horseradish. Even Karolina Kurkova, Courtney Love, and Diplo have stopped by. But then, would you expect anything less from a Stephen Starr restaurant helmed by a nationally acclaimed chef?

"It was time to bring Upland back to its palm tree roots," says chef Justin Smillie, who honed his culinary skills working under greats like Jonathan Waxman at Barbuto and Danny Meyer at Gramercy Tavern. A nod to his hometown of Upland, California, the Golden Stateinspired eatery opened its first outpost in New York City, >

where Pete Wells, food critic for The New York Times, dubbed Smillie a "vegetable sage" and "pasta savant" labels best evidenced by the chef's perfectly al dente and peppery bucatini cacio e pepe. "That and the carbonara have been with me for 14 years, since Barbuto," Smillie says, which must be why he's perfected them and the short rib that goes wherever he goes. Or the crispy and tangy duck wings searing with heat that beckon for the bones to be bared of every last shred of meat.

"California cuisine is really a melting pot," notes the chef. "Upland touches on all those parts while sticking to my philosophy of freshness and preserving the harvest." Exhibit A: the Miamicentric, wood-fired Florida prawns erupting with olive oil and lemon. There's also the coal-roasted salmon sitting over a bed of farro, bursting with acid by way of Florida grapefruits and pickled beets. "[The salmon] and the branzino are at the top," Smillie says of the smoked and roasted European sea bass whirling in fennel leek vinaigrette. Whatever you do, don't forget to order the whole crispy hen of the woods mushroom, paired with an herb Cloumage that's the equivalent of ricotta tzatziki. "It's our generation's blooming onion," he says, clarifying why every party orders one (or two).

No California-style meal would be complete without fine wine, and Upland's cellar boasts plenty for oenophiles to discover, from the Golden State to Italy and France. Dessert, too, dazzles with a moist and dense carrot cake topped with cinnamon ice cream; pink grapefruit garnished with Campari zest; and chocolate mousse dusted with fennel pollen. None are as nostalgic, however, as Upland's blood orange and vanilla twist Dreamsicle, a grown-up version of the childhood classic. 49 Collins Ave., Miami Beach, 305-602-9998; uplandmiami.com

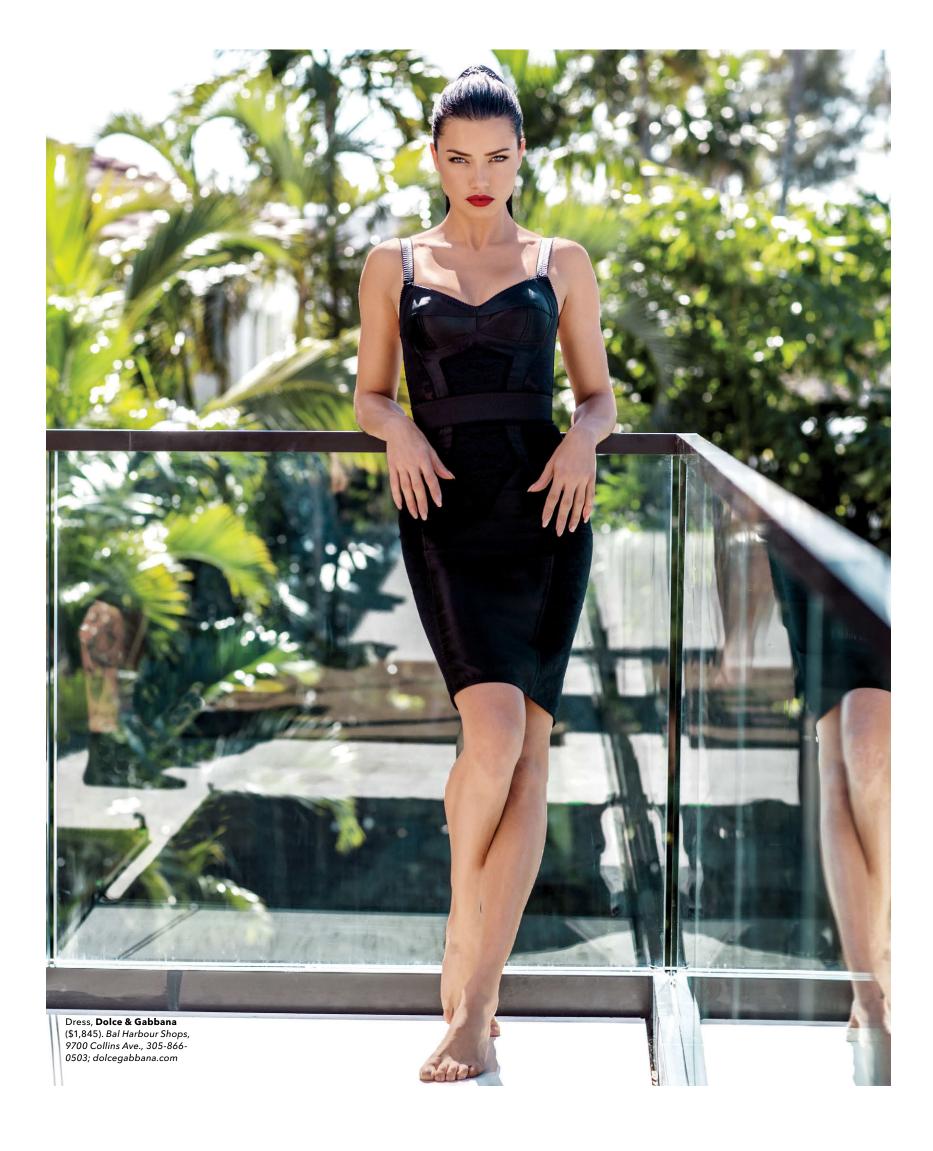




Victoria's Secret's longest-running Angel and a Miami resident, Adriana Lima elegantly balances her roles as single mother, spiritual seeker, independent woman, and the world's most beautiful model.

SAY THE NAME ADRIANA LIMA



to anyone remotely fashion-savvy and you'll get the same instantaneous response: "I love her!" Indeed, what's not to love about the 5-foot-10 blue-eyed brunette and self-proclaimed Afro-Brazilian Gemini?

"I'm a one-of-a-kind Gemini, I think," Lima tells me with the same signature head tilt and sexy stare that have been front and center on countless magazine covers and in myriad fan fantasies. That's not even mentioning the annual Victoria's Secret Fashion Show, for which Lima has been an Angel for 17 years. She sat it out only in 2009 while pregnant with her oldest daughter, Valentina (whose father is former NBA star Marko Jaric, Lima's ex-husband). Motherhood didn't stop her three years later, though, when just two months after giving birth to her second daughter, Sienna (also with Jaric), Lima made jaws drop by reclaiming both her six-pack and the catwalk.

And she's not stopping at the age of 35. Or as a single mother. "My goal is to do the fashion show till I'm 40, at least," Lima confesses in her exotic accent, looking out at the crystal-clear horizon and skyline of Miami—the place she calls home. "Or [as long as] gravity is on my side," she adds, not considering the obvious: that after being named the second-highest-paid model in the world by *Forbes* in 2016 and Victoria's Secret's "most valuable Angel" by the analytics firm D'Marie this January, she's got more than gravity and lingerie supporting her.

Perhaps it was fate that had her enter (and serendipitously win) Ford Models' Supermodel of Brazil contest as a camerashy tween doing a favor for a friend who didn't want to compete alone. Though Lima might not agree. "I make my destiny," she says. "Everything is in the power of your mind. If you think positive, you attract the things that you want in your life."

Mental power coupled with unmatched genes must be why virtually every guy wants to marry her and every girl wants to be her. Linked to the likes of (former fiancé) Lenny Kravitz and her current flame, Super Bowl hero Julian Edelman, Lima has had countless men (and probably women) fall in love at first sight.

"There are different forms of love—you cannot generalize it," she says. When I ask if she has ever been truly, madly, deeply in love, Lima smiles wide with her mouth and eyes. "I'm in love every day. I wake up and have two beautiful girls before me whose happiness is my happiness."

An only child raised by a single mother (her dad left when she was just six months old), Lima grew up a devout Roman Catholic, going to church every Sunday. As a matter of fact, before altering her path and moving from Brazil to New York City, where she signed with Elite Model Management, she wanted to be a nun—a far cry from the globally recognized Angel she's become. But that doesn't stop her from bringing a Bible to read backstage before shows, praying, or "going to church every day," although she's not talking about your typical chapel. "The church is in me—I always connect," she says. "If you're connected with the divine and always have pure intentions with everything you're doing, you're protected by the angels." Not lingerie-clad, stiletto-wearing angels, but otherworldly time-and-space-bending beings. "I'm very spiritual. I believe in nature, I believe in energy, I believe in spirits."

Something else she believes in: aliens. "I don't picture them as, like, coming to get me or abducting humans," she says. "I imagine they maybe look like us but with a higher intelligence



and connection to the universe." Extraterrestrials aside, she also has a place (or more like a shrine) in her bedroom for her crystals. "I don't count, but I have a lot-more than 50." Amethyst, in case you're wondering, is her favorite. In other words, Lima is pretty cosmically connected. But she's grounded, too-even with 9.8 million Instagram followers and the distinction of being the only celebrity to ever star in two Super Bowl commercials in one game, for Kia Motors and the online flower service Teleflora, in 2012. How did she earn such an honor? Simply put, consumers want whatever Lima is wearing-or selling. Case in point: Sales of Kia's Optima reached their highest point in the company's history after it received Lima's stamp of approval. It's safe to say that anything the bankable beauty touches turns to gold.

So just how does Lima-who has been included in Maxim magazine's Hot 100, AskMen.com's Most Desirable Women, Models.com's Top Sexiest Models, Complex.com's 100 Hottest Supermodels of All Time, and FHM's Sexiest Women in the World (four times); has won Spike's Guys Choice award for Hottest Girl on the Planet; and is one of Google's 50 mostsearched-for women on the Web-stay grounded when she's

pulling in a reported \$10.5 million a year and a regular day at the office (like today) involves shooting at a \$30 million manse with Victoria's Secret photographer and dear friend Russell James? "My meditation is boxing, believe it or not," she says. "I get so into it that no thoughts come in my mind. It's my Zen moment." Of course, a knockout like Lima trains only with the best, and in the ring that's at the same world-famous Miami Beach gym where Muhammad Ali became the greatest, Angelo Dundee's 5th St. Gym.

"I try to box every day," Lima says, "but these past few days I've been bad." By "bad," she means she's been trading her gloves for a spoon and molten chocolate cake. "It's my guilty pleasure. If it were up to me, I would have it three times a day." She's not joking, either: In the middle of her Ocean Drive cover shoot, Lima got a hankering for chocolate bars to nibble on between outfits. "I eat everything," she says, "but at the same time, I'm super healthy." Healthy is as easy as cake when you have an on-call nutritionist and a personal chef to whip you up whatever your heart desires. "The best restaurant in Miami, I have to say, is my home."

Home for Lima is where she feels closest to her native





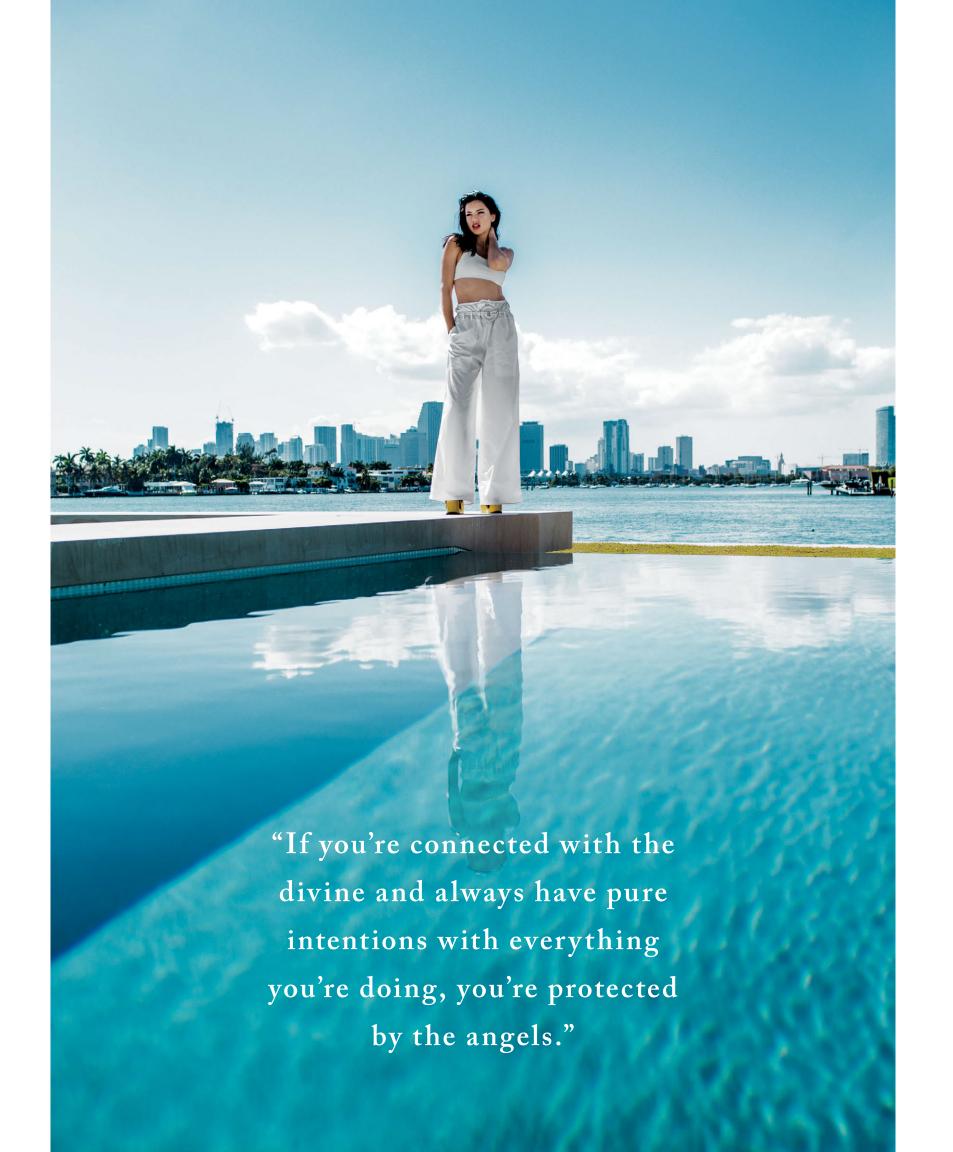
Brazil. And for the last five years, that's been the Magic City. "I wanted to find a base where it was always summer, always nice and welcoming, with warm people and a beautiful ocean," she says. "I just fell in love with Miami. Plus, there are so many Brazilians here, too, so I feel like I'm in Brazil." If you're hoping for a supermodel sighting, hit the Arts District. "I love to go walk the streets and Wynwood Walls and look at art."

Good luck recognizing her, though. "I'm pretty low-key when I'm walking around—I think because people are used to seeing me with makeup and hair and in lingerie." She laughs, adding, "I usually don't wear any makeup and [have] my hair up, and I'm always in sports clothes, especially with my kids." At least when she's not rocking Victoria's Secret's million-dollar Fantasy Bra, an honor she's had not once but twice.

"It's a really special thing for an Angel to wear the Fantasy Bra," Lima says. "It's the highlight of the fashion show and a surprise. All of us [Angels] are always wondering, Who is it going to be this year?" "Kind of like being named prom queen?" I ask, forgetting that she's a foreigner. "I'm not sure what a prom queen is, because we don't have that in Brazil, so maybe you have to wear the Fantasy Bra first before you can say it's just like that," she answers, sassily and unapologetically. And in this moment, I grasp who Adriana Lima really is. She's an independent, second-generation badass single mom who has never let the millions of dollars and accolades she sunbathes in cloud her values or stop her from articulating her religious and spiritual beliefs. She's simply irresistible while still being innocent yet seductive. And she's a true role model to her kids, who "understand mommy is a model, but also a businesswoman," she says-an Angel disguised in lingerie who serves "not just girls [I work with] but the world we live in. I have a lot of energy to expend."

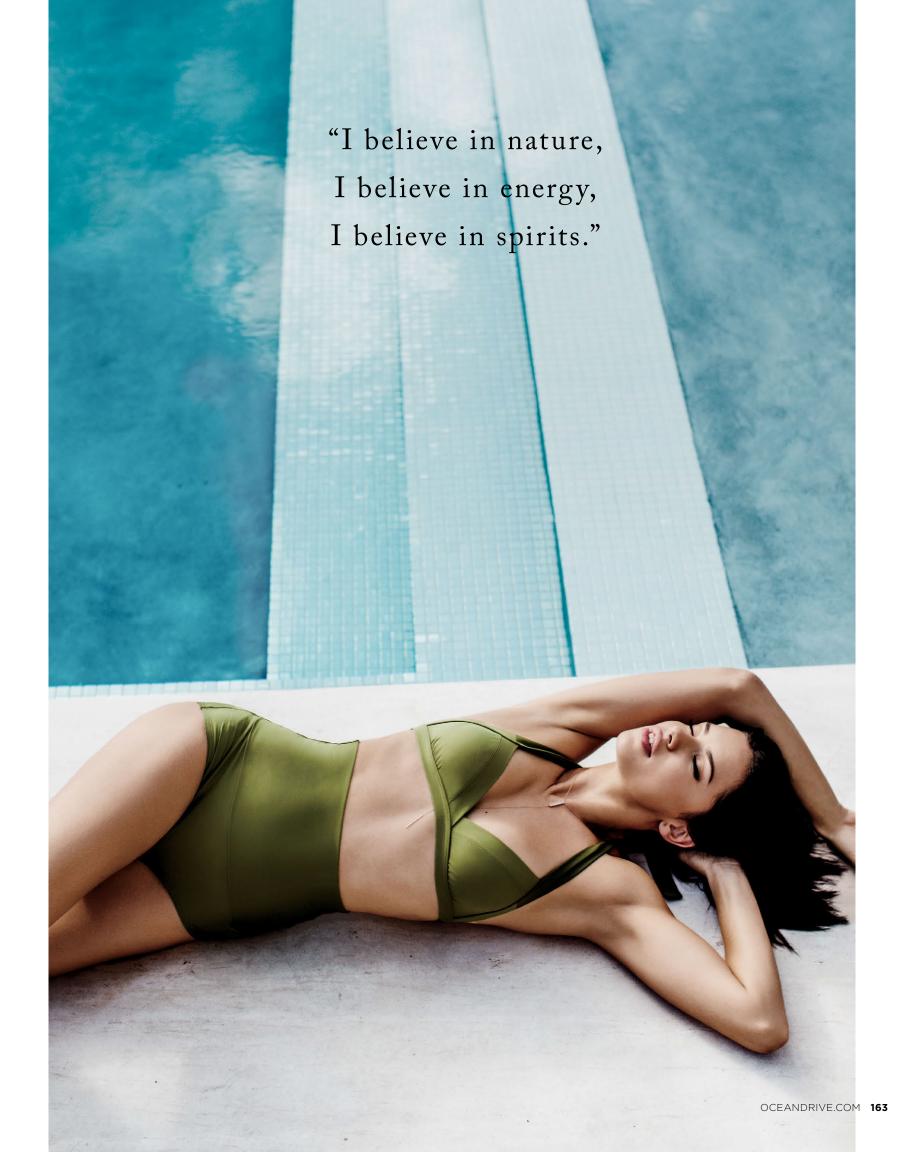
Where does she get it all from? Girl power runs in her family. "It comes from my mom and my grandmother. Even though my grandmother was married forever—over 50 years!—she was still an independent woman, and seeing how she carried herself made me who I am." Lucky for us, Lima's not done passing on her genes: "I always wanted a lot of children. I'm not finished yet."

In June she'll be 36, and this December she'll again walk in the Victoria's Secret Fashion Show, maybe even wearing the Fantasy Bra for a third time—that is, unless fate intervenes and makes her Mother Lima for a third time instead.

WELCOME HOME! Carlo Gambino, executive vice president of Douglas Elliman Florida, recently listed a tri-level penthouse in Miami Beach's exclusive Apogee building that he calls the "best apartment south of New York City."

The 8,271-square-foot unit, designed by Miami's PH Design Studio Group—known for their work on the Gianni Versace mansion—has five bedrooms, seven full baths, one half bath, and a 7,000-square-foot private rooftop terrace complete with a pool, Jacuzzi, cabana, outdoor kitchen, and movie theater. The price for all this opulence? An astounding \$65 million, which would break the Miami record previously set by Douglas Elliman when it sold the \$60 million penthouse at Faena House in late 2015.

"It's the largest and nicest penthouse in the building," says Gambino. "I've been selling real estate for over 22 years in Miami Beach, and it's the best unit I have ever seen."



Located at 800 South Pointe Drive in Miami Beach's posh South of Fifth neighborhood, Unit 2204 is a contemporary penthouse that was purchased new in 2008 for \$16.5 million by entrepreneur William Duker, who then spent the next five years completing it to perfection. The stone used for the floors and walls cost more than \$1 million alone, without installation.

"It took six months to design and then a year to get through the permitting process," Gambino says. "The owner also removed some of the structural concrete slabs to create a magnificent glass staircase and corridor. He replaced cement with glass, and that process took an extremely long time."

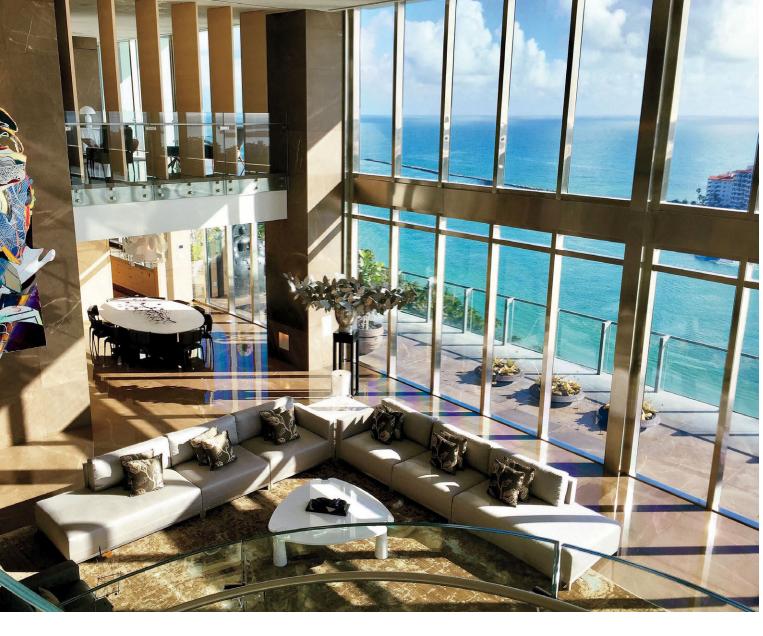
The result is a stunning, two-story glass staircase—the focal point of the living room. Designed by Faour Glass Technologies, that feature cost close to \$1 million, says Gambino, who notes that "the entire unit was done with the most exquisite taste and attention to detail—and the most expensive materials."

Spanning the 22nd, 23rd, and 24th floors, the unit actually has more exterior space than interior, with a total of 13,149 square feet of outside terraces.

Though technically lived in, the apartment is more like new; according to Gambino, Duker resides in upstate New York and did not use the home as his primary residence. Now he's selling the unit, Gambino says, to spend time sailing the Caribbean and the Mediterranean on his new 270-foot sailing yacht, *Sybaris*.

So what is the buyer pool for a record-breaking unit like this? "Most of the sales of similar properties have been to the Northeast market—hedge fund managers from New York City," Gambino says. "That's the biggest market, but I just had a well-known gentleman from Dubai who came to see it, so the Middle East would be another source of this type of clientele, as would Russia. It's not a Hollywood buyer. Hollywood can't afford a \$65 million unit." *elliman.com*

Favorite Miami restaurant?

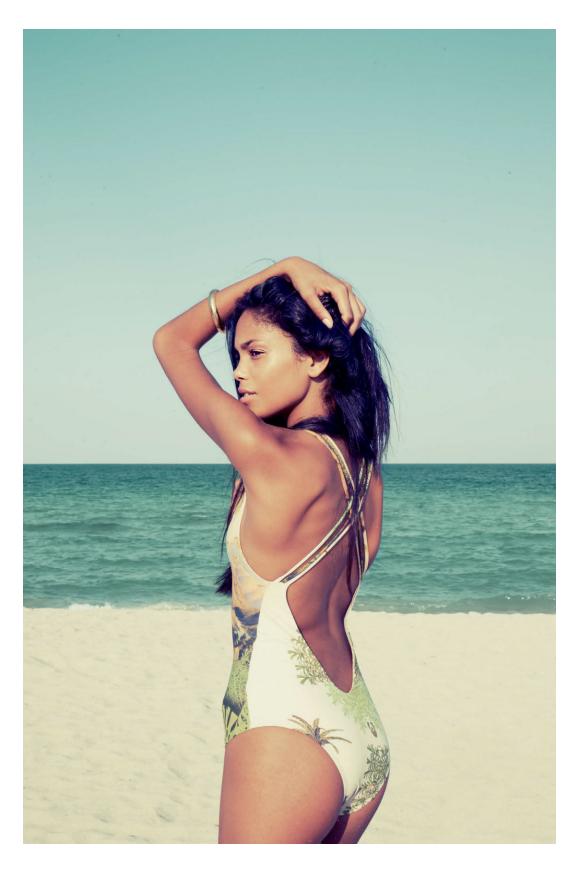

THE RELATED GROUP'S **CARLOS ROSSO** LOOKS TO THE MIAMI SKYLINE AND BEYOND FOR THE NEXT DEVELOPMENT BOOM.

Since joining The Related Group 15 years ago, Carlos Rosso has been responsible for a broad cross-section of the company's operations. As president of the firm's Condominium Development Division, he's developed more than 16,000 condo units in his career and helped Related grow into South Florida's multifamily powerhouse, while now leading the firm's expansion into Mexico-and all over the globe. But in a tumultuous world economy and unstable future, how do Miami and its international ties continue to prosper? Rosso gives *Ocean Drive* the scoop:

How is the condo market in South Florida right now?

The condo market is very healthy. We started closings at SLS Brickell, and we closed more than 60 percent of the building in less than 60 days, so that's very positive.

Have things picked up since the election?

Yes. People were waiting to see what would happen with the election, but the rebound in the stock market is a good sign for the real estate market. As all the financial guys in New York start making serious money, they'll come back to Florida to buy more properties.

Are the international buyers back?

The international buyers are seeing the strengthening of the dollar, so they're thinking more and more of putting their savings into dollardenominated goods, and real estate in Miami is one of them. New Yorkers, particularly in the financial sector, are making more money and are coming to South Florida to buy condos. Prices are very cheap here compared to New York.

Are you seeing any trends in the market?

I think it's been confirmed that the idea of mixing hotels and condos is a good one. The opening of SLS Brickell, with the residences on top, has proven that. Also, people are more interested in urban locations, like Brickell.

How do you think President Trump will affect the local real estate market?

We are in a wait-and-see situation. To have a developer in the White House is good for us, but at the same time, we want to see what his policies are going to be.

What does Related have in store for us this year?

We are going to deliver seven projects, starting with Hyde Resort. Then we have two Brickell Heights towers, SLS Lux, Hyde Midtown, and two towers at Paraiso.

What about new launches in 2017?

We are going to launch a new development in Wynwood, which will be 182 units. We are also doing more international projects-our second phase at SLS in Cancun, and we are looking at some projects in Argentina.

Where do you see the real estate market going in 2017?

It's still going to go at a steady pace, maybe not as fast as 2015 or 2016, but I think that's good. We are in a very solid market. relatedgroup.com ■

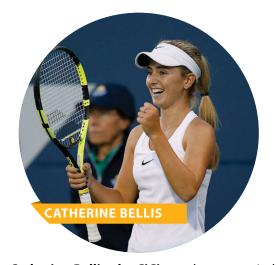
handed forehand and dogged determination helped Keys

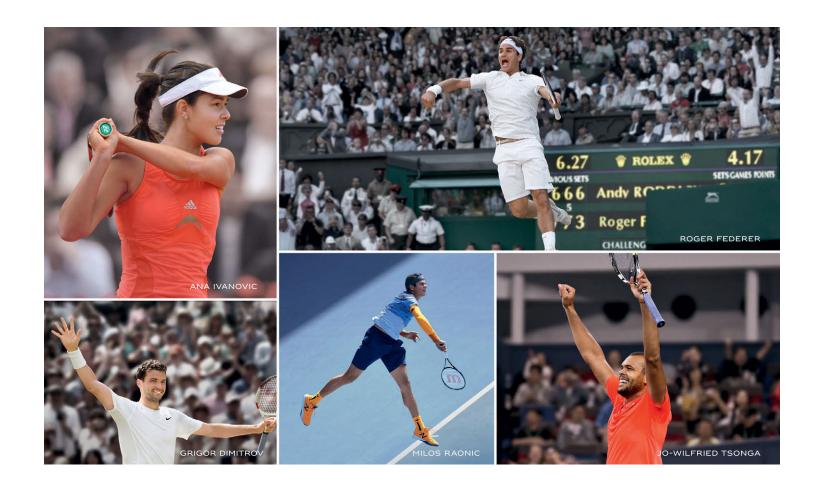

ANDY MURRAY

Murray ended the 2016 season by reaching a career-high ATP ranking of No. 1 and winning all of his last five tournaments, including the Barclays ATP World Tour Finals, where he defeated No. 2 Djokovic in the finals. Earning his second gold medal during the Rio de Janeiro Summer Olympics and his second Wimbledon crown, Murray should have another successful season ahead. The two-time champion, Murray won his last title in Miami in 2013 and will be one of the favorites as he seeks his third in 2017.





NOVAK DJOKOVIC

Defending Miami Open Champion Djokovic ended 2016 ranked No. 2 and completed the career grand slam with his 2016 victory at Roland Garros. He earned his sixth Australian Open crown and reached the final of the US Open. He always seems to play his best tennis in Miami having won the event six times (07, 11-12, 14-16). As the reigning champion, he looks to defend his title and claim a record fourth consecutive Miami crown. He recently started off the season with a title in Doha, where he defeated No. 1 Andy Murray to claim the Qatar ExxonMobil Open. His early momentum shows he will once again be one of the strongest men on Key Biscayne.









MILOS RAONIC

Raonic battled some mid-season injuries en route to his best year-end ranking to date, holding the No. 3 spot on the ATP tour. He recorded his sixth straight season of over thirty wins (2011-2016), with a career-high of 52 coming in 2016. Those wins can be attributed to a semifinal appearance at the Australian Open, a finalist finish at Wimbledon, and a title in Brisbane where he defeated Roger Federer. He also reached the finals of London/ Queen's Club and Indian Wells, falling to Novak Djokovic. Raonic entered 2017 with eight total ATP titles and is searching for his first in Miami. His best showing on Key Biscayne came in 2014 and 2016, when his run ended in the quarterfinals.





STAN WAWRINKA

Reaching a careerhigh ranking of No. 3 mid season, Wawrinka captured titles in Dubai, Chennai and Geneva during the 2016 season and was a finalist in St. Petersburg. His history in Miami allows for two fourth round appearances in 2009 and 2014, falling in the second round last year. In his first event of 2017 he reached the semifinals of the Brisbane International and should be in contention for his best tournament yet on Key Biscayne.

He represented Japan in the Summer Olympics and brought home Bronze with a decisive win over Rafael Nadal to claim the medal. Nishikori secured his 300th career win last year, reaching the semifinals of the US Open and the quarterfinals in Australia.

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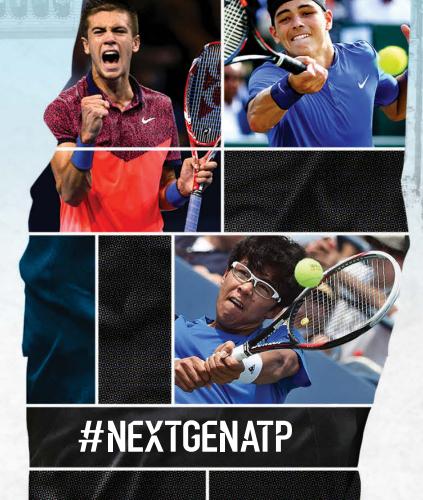

Cilic continued his streak of claiming at least one title for nine straight years (2008-2016) when he won his first ATP Masters 1000 title in Cincinnati and claimed his first ATP World Tour 500 title in Basel. As a recipient of the 2016 Arthur Ashe Humanitarian Award, Cilic's stunning year also produced his third straight Wimbledon quarterfinal appearance and his second run in the ATP finals. Cilic led the Croatia Davis Cup team to the final and emerges in 2017 eager to make a run for a crown in Miami.

His year of firsts continued with an all-time high of 58 wins in 2016 and reaching his first ever quarterfinal and semifinal of a grand slam at Roland Garros. Thiem's top win of his career by ranking came against Roger Federer at the ATP Masters 1000 event in Rome. He also secured his first three Davis Cup victories in 2016 for Austria. Thiem's run in Miami ended last year in the fourth round to the eventual champion, Novak Djokovic, but he seeks the spotlight in 2017 for his first ATP Masters 1000 crown and to continue his rise on the tour.







RAFAEL NADAL

He still added to his total of 69 career titles with his ninth win in Monte Carlo, marking his 28th ATP Masters 1000 title, and his ninth crown in Barcelona. The win in Barcelona marked his 49th career clay court title, tying Vilas for the lead in the open era. He's the eighth man in history with over 200 Grand Slam singles matches, with his best 2016 Grand Slam finish being the round of 16 at the US Open. Nadal competed for Spain in the 2016 Summer Olympics in Brazil, capturing the second gold medal of his career in doubles with Marc Lopez. He looks to add to his 800+ career wins in Miami. Nadal has reached the Miami final four times (05, 08, 11, 14) and will play for his first Key Biscayne crown in his thirteenth appearance in 2017.

With a win in Shenzhen last year, Berdych notched his 13th career singles title. In addition, he advanced to the semifinals of Wimbledon and quarterfinals of both the Australian and the French. He was a member of the 2016 Czech Republic Davis Cup team and earned his 50th career win for his country. Berdych hopes to capture his 2nd career ATP Masters 1000 title this year in Miami.

Parking

General admission ticket holders may park on Virginia Key (one mile North of the Tennis Center), with free shuttle bus service to the parking area at Crandon Park. Directional signs will lead you to the General Parking Lot on Virginia Key once across the Rickenbacker Causeway. Miami-Dade County will provide Virginia Key parking for \$15 per vehicle.

From the South: Take US1 (South Dixie Highway) to the Brickell Avenue exit. Stay right and follow the Rickenbacker Causeway toward Key Biscayne. Look for the parking signs.

From the North: Take Interstate 95 South to the Key Biscayne exit. Follow the Rickenbacker Causeway toward Key Biscayne. Look for the parking signs.

Transit

Bus service via the popular Route B Bus, also referenced as Route 102, covering the Brickell Metrorail Station, Brickell Business District, Rickenbacker Causeway, Miami Seaquarium, Crandon Park, City of Key Biscayne, and Cape Florida State Park, will make regular stops at the main entrance of the Tournament when heading toward the Village of Key Biscayne. The continual use of laptop computers or other handheld electronic devices within the confines (spectator area) of the tournament match courts is prohibited. The exception to this provision is properly credentialed media, tournament vendors and tournament staff when used in the performance of their duties.
