

YOU WILL NEED:

......

- Craft essentials (see p94)
- Your FREE PaperCrafter border die and stamp set
- Chameleon marker pens
- Dies: circles, scallop-edged circles, scallop-edged squares
- Punches: hole, corner rounder
- Sentiment stamps
- Ink pads: black, rainbow

Happy birthday

1 Stamp 'Happy birthday' from your gift in the centre of aqua card, 9cm x Ilcm, in black ink. Use the corner stamp to form a rectangular border around the sentiment and to decorate opposite corners.

Olue onto a IOcm x I4.5cm blank, 5mm from the right-hand edge. Wrap an aqua

ribbon on the left finishing in a bow at the front, then highlight the stamped areas using a white gel pen.

Stamp six flowers, colour in teal, then cut out. Add a pearl to the centre of each, then stick three in each corner, using glue and 3D foam pads. Finish with a pearl above the 'i'.

Sweetheart sentiment

1 Use black ink to stamp three heart borders and nine heart motifs onto white card. Colour with medium and light pink markers, then cut out.

2 Layer pink cardstock onto a 9cm x I5cm tent-fold blank, leaving the bottom 3cm uncovered. Stamp a 'Miss you' sentiment directly onto the white panel.

Stick one heart border across the join, then the other two at 4cm intervals, plus three matching hearts across each pink section.



TOP TIP

Set pigment inks with a heat gun before colouring with alcohol markers to prevent smudging







Rainbow rows

1 Matt lime green card onto a lOcm square tent-fold blank, leaving narrow borders. Stamp a sentiment bottomright. Stamp a scallop-edged border seven times onto white card in a rainbow of ink colours.

Cut out, then arrange at the top of the card so they overlap and the scallops are staggered. Trim the excess. then stick a white bow in the centre.

Botanic birthday

Trim scallops across 7cm x IOcm of blue card, then fix to the bottom of a lOcm square tent-fold blank. Die cut a border from green card, and stick across the bottom.

Trim the excess, then decorate with gems. Print 'Happy birthday' directly on the front in black ink. Stamp, colour and cut three butterflies, then secure with 3D foam pads.



Special treat

Stamp diagonal lines of butterflies in rainbow colours across IO.5cm x I5cm of thin white card. Secure the short edges together with double-sided tape to form a tube. Flatten one end with the join in the centre.

Repeat on the other \checkmark end with the join at the side. Fill the box with goodies then close with more tape. Stamp 'Happy birthday' onto white using a rainbow ink pad. Cut into a decorative shape and stick on the box.

Butterfly box

Cover the inside of a matchbox with lime card, and the outside with blue. Add a lime die-cut border along one edge of the top, then trim a cloud shape from white and stick along the opposite edge.

Stamp three butterflies and six flowers on white, then colour. Glue the butterflies to the top and three flowers along each side. Decorate with gems to finish.

STICK BOXES TOGETHER TO MAKE A MINI **DRAWER SET!**



TOP TIP

If you don't have a rainbow pad, apply different inks to your stamp with a sponge



Flower power

1 Stamp the flower several times on white card in aqua ink, then repeat with turquoise and purple ink to fill any gaps.

Once dry, cut with a scallop-edged circle die. Die cut one smaller and one slightly larger shape from aqua card, then layer together.

Stamp a flower using purple ink then cut out. Stick in the centre and decorate with a gem. Punch a small hole at the edge and thread with purple twine to make a tag.

Colourful scallops

Stamp, cut and layer rainbow borders across white card, then die cut into a 7cm circle. Make a tag by punching a small hole at the top and threading with blue twine.



TOP TIP

Change the colour scheme to match wrapping paper

Piece of cake

1 Trim 2cm wide pieces of card to 4cm, 6cm and 8cm long, then use a corner rounder punch on the top of each piece. Stamp the floral scallop-edged border across the bottom of the rounded pieces with lilac ink.

Round the top corners of lilac card, 9.5cm x I2cm, and arrange the 'cake' layers I.5cm from the top. Stamp another lilac border onto white and cut out in one three-scallop and two two-scallop pieces. Secure as a cake stand.

Matt the lilac panel to the top of a IO.5cm x I5cm tent-fold blank, rounded at the top. Stamp and cut out four lilac flowers and secure so they overlap the edges of the cake.

4 Cover the bottom of the lilac panel with a purple ribbon finished in a bow, then add large pearls to the flower centres and small ones along the tier borders.





Bright birthday

1 Stamp 'Happy birthday' in black onto lime card, then use the corner border twice around it.

Trim into a tag shape and matt onto white leaving a narrow border.

Punch a hole in the tag and thread with twine. Add highlights using a white gel pen and add a few small pearls to decorate.

Hey there

1 Snip inverted scallops diagonally across IOcm x I4cm of aqua card and matt onto a IO.5cm x I5cm tent-fold blank. Use black ink to stamp a sentiment onto the uncovered space.

Stamp the floral border on white using brown ink, trim to 6cm, then stick vertically 3cm from the left edge. Glue a 7cm lime circle at the top and a lime die-cut border along the bottom.

Stamp two black butterflies and five flowers on white, then colour. Cut out, then add the flowers to the tree using foam pads.

4 Glue the butterflies at the right of the card, and several lime leaves to any gaps on the tree to add texture.

Pretty panels

Die cut the border from five bright shades of card, then glue above each other on a 9cm x I5cm tent-fold blank. Trim away the excess, then stamp a sentiment in the top-left corner.



hile there's nothing we love more than papercrafting, in at a very close second is our furry feline friends. If there's an opportunity to combine cats with crafts, we're definitely interested! Marianne Fisher has used the Catitudes collection from Crafter's Companion to make eight purr-fect greetings which stylishly combine elegant silhouettes with bold patterns and colours. Be inspired and create paper goodies with all the personality of the sassiest cat!

YOU WILL NEED:

- Craft essentials (see p94)
- Crafter's Companion
 Catitudes collection:
 Twin CD-ROM; paper
 pad; dies, Cat Silhouette;
 Stylish Stiletto; Rococo
 Frame; Dainty
 Accessories; stamps,
 Happy Family; Tamara
- Pens: Sakura Stardust, clear; Copic markers
- Paper punch: scallop-edged border
- Ink pads: black, blue, brown
- lute ribbon: 6cm wide
- Embellishments: feathers, paper flowers, wooden hearts, pearls, enamel dots, heart doily, Guipure lace, heart pins, cheesecloth



Purrfect puss

1 Layer a 14cm square of pink dots and stripes paper onto cream card, then fix to a 15cm blank. Fray the edges of a 6cm x 15.5cm piece of heart patterned jute ribbon and glue across the centre.

Print three cat tags from the Catitudes CD-ROM, then die cut using the centre pieces of the Rococo die set. Stagger across the jute and secure.

Stick a circular sentiment onto an 8.5cm white doily,

Stamp hearts on plain jute using acrylic paint

then arrange on the card front with two die-cut roses tucked under the top, a flower at each side and a beige butterfly. Secure with glue, then add two vellum butterflies to the top.





Diva shoes

1 Trim a I3.5cm square of red patterned paper, mount onto grey card then stick to a I4.5cm square blank. Glue a I4.5cm length of Guipure lace across the front, 2.5cm from the top.

Die cut a stiletto shape from silver glitter card, then stick to the bottom-right corner. Print a 'Viva la diva' tag, mount onto card then cut around the shape. Punch a hole at the top and thread with red ribbon.

Use 3D foam pads to stick the tag to the top-left of the card. Embellish the die-cut shoe with a large red gem, then add three more to the corners.

Someone special

1 Matt a I4cm square of navy patterned paper onto turquoise card. Trim blue lantern patterned paper to I0.5cm x I2.5cm, then die cut twice along the bottom using the bottom of the large frame shape to create a border.

Wrap blue dotty ribbon across the panel, securing on the reverse. Add blue lace ribbon beneath so it covers the top of the light blue panel. Glue to the centre of a I5cm white blank.

Die cut an ornate frame plus two of the nesting perforated ovals from white card. Stamp 'Someone special' onto the centre using black ink. Dab the edges of the frame lightly with blue ink, then attach to the centre of the card front.

4 Use two accessory shape dies on red patterned paper and secure one die-cut piece overlapping each side of the frame. Stick ten small red pearls between the perforated ovals on the frame, then add three larger ones along the bottom of the navy panel.







Cat in the hatbox

1 Blot the edges of a l6cm square of pink spotty paper with brown ink, then mount onto black card. Add brown ink to the edges of a l3cm square of pink argyle patterned paper, then fix it to the centre at an angle. Layer onto an l8cm square blank.

Print a Cat in a Hatbox image from the CD, trim to I2cm square, dab brown ink around the edges, then

attach to the centre at an angle. Stamp a 'Someone special' sentiment onto white card using black ink, then cut out using the centre pieces of the Rococo frame die set.

Colour the edges of the sentiment with brown ink, then fix at the top-right of the front. Use a strong adhesive to add three small pink flowers below the sentiment, a large one at

the left plus two medium

Sweet dreams

1 Cut blue star patterned paper to I4cm square, mount onto navy card leaving narrow borders then attach to the centre of a I5cm square blank. Glue a I2.5cm wide heart-shaped doily to the centre.

Die cut two cat silhouette shapes from blue patterned papers, plus an umbrella from navy card. Arrange to the right then secure. Trim 'Dream' from a sentiment ribbon, clip the end into a fishtail banner and secure to the top-left of the card.





Floral arrangement

- 1 Use a scallop-edged border die on the non-fold edges of a l5cm square blank. Rotate so the fold is at the top, layer a l3.5cm square of red floral paper onto red card, then secure in the centre.
- 2 Trim a I2cm x I3.5cm piece of cheesecloth, then secure across the front at a slight angle. Glue a I4cm length of script ribbon 4.5cm from the top, and a red lace one 2cm from the bottom.
- Print an image of a cat with flowers then use small scissors to trim around the shape. Stick in the centre, then glue one I.5cm and two 2cm wooden heart shapes in the corners to finish.

TIAKL

Glamour puss

- 1 Mount a l4cm square of turquoise patterned paper onto red card, leaving narrow borders. Attach to a l5cm square blank.
- Stamp the Tamara cat and 'If the shoe fits...' sentiment onto IOcm x II.5cm of white card using black ink, then use Copic markers to colour.
- Mount onto red card, then tape three feathers and two heart pins to the reverse so they overlap the top-right corner.
- Use 3D foam pads to fix in the bottom-left corner of the card. Add sparkle to the gems using a clear Stardust pen and a burgundy bow to the left.



Feline family

1 Measure and score a horizontal line halfway from the crease on the front of a 15cm square blank, then fold inwards to create an easel-fold card. Open, then glue a 6cm x 13.5cm panel of dotty paper mounted on teal card onto the outer half.

Layer dotty paper and teal card onto the inside of the blank, leaving narrow borders. Add a 6.5cm x 13.5cm rectangle of star patterned paper 6cm from the fold. Secure two glittery red wooden hearts in the centre of the starry panel. Add a cream ribbon below the shapes.

Stamp cats and kittens plus 'Family' onto white card, then colour with Copic markers. Trim to 9cm x I2.5cm, then mount onto teal. Glue the lower half of the image to the small dotty panel so it overlaps the top when the easel card is folded.

f the high street card selection is anything to go by, all mothers are the same. But we know this isn't at all true. and there's no-one on earth like the woman who gave you life. The true beauty of a handcrafted Mother's Day greeting is that you can make it really personal by incorporating her hobbies and favourite things and choosing the right words - the extra effort will definitely be appreciated, too. Try out a new technique for the occasion and you might be pleasantly surprised!



Impress mum (and yourself) this year with the perfect handmade greeting

Quilled flowers

MAKER: ELIZABETH MOAD

Practise a new technique and make something beautiful. Roll a 20cm crinkled strip of orange quilling paper into a loose coil. Wrap with crinkled red, glue, then pinch into shape. Create another petal, then glue together. Roll the top of each with a quilling tool. Coil a 5cm red length, pinch into a teardrop, then glue between the petals. Twirl one end of a I5cm green strip, leave open, then glue to the flower. Repeat on the other side. Glue four flowers to 13cm square pale yellow card layered

> on a I5cm square yellow blank. Stick a sentiment to the bottom left using 3D

foam pads.





Floral fancy

MAKER: COLETTE SMITH

Celebrate Mother's Day with striking flowers. To make this design, use a flower stamp with blue, purple and lime green inks printed directly onto a I2cm x I5cm blank. Over-stamp the detail using black ink. Cover the bottom with a 4cm x I2cm piece of blue paper. Fix a 2.5cm x I2cm scallop-edged green dotty strip above, then cover the join with purple ribbon tied in a knot. Die cut a sentiment from white card and stick to the right of the blue panel.



Butterfly

MAKER: TRACEY **DAYKIN-JONES**

If you can't find the right words, butterflies have beautiful symbology. For this card, stamp a meadow image onto a 7.5cm circle of yellow paper using black ink, sprinkle embossing powder then set with a heat gun. Cut discs from orange and red paper, increasing each by Icm. Trim the bottoms, then layer together. Glue in the centre of an Ilcm square blank covered with dark red card. Stamp and emboss a butterfly top-right, then add a trail of tiny gold gems from it.



Mum's the word

MAKER: CORINNE BRADD

Trace 'Mum' in 3.5cm high backwards letters onto the back of pink card. Draw two lines across the centre, 5mm apart. Use a sharp craft knife to cut around the letters, but don't slice through the centre bar. Turn over and gently bend out the tops and bottoms of the letters. Trim around lcm from the word, then mount onto pale pink leaving a narrow border. Stick onto a tent-fold blank covered with patterned paper, then finish with a butterfly and flower motif in opposite corners.

Sew simple

MAKER: KEREN BAKER If your mum is a keen stitcher, this card is perfect. To make, snip the top of I.5cm x I5.5cm red paper at an angle then stick to the right of a lOcm x I5cm blank. Trim blue card slightly smaller, add a faux stitched border using a white gel pen then matt on top. Doodle black stitching onto a 7cm square of floral patterned paper and a 6cm white circle, layer in the centre, then pleat washi tape along the top and bottom. Stamp a sentiment to the right. Finish with a strip of tape measure-patterned ribbon along the bottom and three buttons.



Gingham greeting

MAKER: KITTY FRAMPTON

The sweetest mums deserve the sweetest greetings. For this design, mount gingham paper onto pink card, then glue to a I5cm square blank. Layer 6cm x I5cm floral paper onto pink, wrap gingham ribbon around the centre then glue to the middle of the card. Mount a IOcm floral topper onto pink, then adhere to the centre using 3D foam pads. Add pink gems to each corner. Glue a pink gingham bow to the left. Stamp a sentiment onto white, glue to pink card then use more foam pads to fix below the topper.



MAKER: **COLETTE SMITH**Families come in all shapes and sizes and luckily, so does paper.
Layer floral paper onto the upper lOcm of an 8cm x l5cm blank, then stick turquoise card onto the rest.
Cover the join with leaf stickers and add a couple pointing downwards. Cut an 8cm bright pink circle into a spiral, roll it up to form a flower, then glue. Add a green pearl to the centre. Print 'To a wonderful step-mum' then cut into a tag shape. Mount onto turquoise, then fix to the top.

Kaleidoscope creations

Louise Collins gets crafty and colourful with the traditional mandala motif



Perfect patterns Kaleidoscopes have always been

fascinating to me. I love to watch their colours change and blend and see their shapes transform. It's very rare to ever see two alike, and this is why I was thrilled to get crafty with these kaleidoscope sets. With so many shapes and styles it's easy to create different looks each time.

Colour me crazy

The detailed patterns and foiling on the die-cut kaleidoscopes are just

begging to be coloured in and it can be done in so many exciting ways.

Whether you feel confident with pencils, or even want to try a paintbrush and ink, you're guaranteed a beautiful result every time.

Something new

I used various colouring techniques on each of my kaleidoscope cards. On one of them I used the resist of the foiling with a wash of overall watercolour, then picked out a few smaller elements to colour in to achieve a bright look. None of the methods I used are very timeconsuming, yet they look equally as stunning.





Just for you

1 Apply some ink to an acrylic block, dilute with a small amount of water and follow the photo guides below. Use black ink to stamp a kaleidoscope pattern four times onto a I3.5cm square piece of white.

Layer it onto a l4cm square piece of blue shiny card

with 3D foam pads and add to a l6cm square piece of mirri card. Mount the layered panels onto a I7cm square blank.

Using 3D foam pads, add the kaleidoscope motifs created in the step-by-step on top of one another and stick to the centre of the greeting.

Delicate doilies

1 Using a glue pad, stamp II flowers onto vellum: three large, six medium and two small. Cover each with blue glitter and leave to dry. Repeat the process with five more leaves and green glitter. Colour in the reverse of each vellum shape and cut out.

Use a green pen to colour in both vellum and a panel of card, then die cut three twigs from the vellum and one from the card. Create a I9cm circular blank from blue card and add an I8cm white card circle on top.

Use a die to create a heart aperture through the front of the greeting and stick a semicircle of blue patterned paper to the left of the circles. Arrange the leaves, twigs and flowers on the card with glue and 3D foam pads and embellish with gems.

Cut vellum slightly larger 4 than the aperture, colour in with a green pen and press a sheet of bubble wrap into it. Repeat on another vellum sheet and stick both pieces behind the aperture.

Stamp two sentiments onto vellum in blue ink. Once dry, brush white acrylic paint on the reverse and cut into small rounded rectangles. Add to the greeting with more 3D foam pads and position a bow on the heart shape.





Use a paintbrush to wash diluted ink over a die-cut foiled kaleidoscope. then dab off any excess



Repeat on another motif and add darker details with colouring pens



Ink one kaleidoscope design completely in black



Stamp a sentiment onto a piece of white card and cut a fishtail into both ends

Perfect for both subtle and bold strokes, dusting brushes, £11.99 for three

Pretty panels

1 Take three large black-printed kaleidoscope motifs and cut each one in half (keep only three halves). With a sharp craft knife, carefully trim small elements from each kaleidoscope into a symmetrical pattern.

2 Glue blue glittery paper behind one of the halves and trim the excess so glitter shows through the apertures. Stamp two more kaleidoscope patterns onto two different shades of blue paper and allow to dry.

Stick them behind the remaining two halves and once again trim around them

so the colour shows through the apertures.

Create three 5cm x I5cm white card panels and use 3D foam pads to add them to slightly larger blue card panels. Layer onto silver mirri card and adhere to an I8cm x 20cm white card blank. Using 3D foam pads, stick each doily half onto a panel.

Featuring Hunkydory's luxe Deco-Large sets, which gives you materials already foiled and die cut, simply co-ordinate various elements and layers for a super easy and quick greeting.

YOU WILL NEED:

- Craft essentials (see p94)
- Hunkydory Lovely Lavender Deco-Large Set

Step One

Create a I5cm x 2lcm blank by folding the background sheet in half lengthways. Press out the main lavender image and use 3D foam pads to fix it to the front of the card, leaving room below.

Step Two

Press out the decoupage pieces and, starting with the largest, align and stick them to the main image. Secure the remaining elements with more foam pads.

Step Three

Fix the smaller sentiment to the centre of the larger rectangle and place beneath the decoupage image. Add a small disc sentiment to the top-right corner of the card to finish.







1 Attach a I2cm square of pink card to a I2.5cm square blank. Cut an Ilcm pink patterned square, layer onto a white scallop-edged square and affix to the base.

Stick a paper doily to the centre. Attach a pink circle matted onto a white scallopedged circle. Stamp a greeting onto another circle die-cut in green ink and use 3D foam

pads to secure it to the base. Add a small heart cut from green patterned paper below the sentiment.

Punch nine leaves from more green patterned paper and place around the sentiment. Trim three pink and six teal flowers from the floral paper, then add a pearl to the centre of each. Position the flowers on top of the leaves.

Shop Stop

Woodware Salutations stamps, £9.99, VersaMark ink pad, £5.50, **thatscrafty.co.uk** Gift bag

1 Cut a 2lcm square of floral patterned paper, mount onto thin white card, then score 7cm in from each side. Fold each corner diagonally inwards. Punch a small hole near to the top at the centre of one of the sides and repeat on the opposite side. Fold along the score lines and gently push the non-punched sides inwards to create an open bag shape.

Trim two narrow strips of heart patterned paper and affix along the bottom edges at the front and back of the bag.

Stamp a sentiment onto pink card and heat emboss with white powder, trim into a tag shape and punch a hole at the top. Thread narrow ribbon through the holes at the top of the bag and through the tag, securing with a bow.

Trim seven small flowers from the patterned paper, shape the petals upwards and add pearls to the centre of each. Adhere three floral motifs to the lower edges at the front and back of the bag and the remaining flower onto the tag





Happy Mother's Day

1 Cut an II.5cm x I5.5cm piece of pink card. Use VersaMark ink to stamp a Mother's Day greeting in the centre and heat emboss with white powder. Mount onto green card then affix to a I2.5cm x I6.5cm blank.

Add 4.5cm x I5.5cm of heart patterned paper to the lower edge of the base and a 3.5cm x I5.5cm piece of hanging hearts patterned paper to the top.

Use a scallop-edged circle die to cut out three

teapots and layer them onto slightly larger green circles. Attach each in line with the hanging hearts using 3D foam pads. Trim three hearts from more patterned paper and adhere with foam pads onto the card.



Tea bag wallet

1 Cut a 9.5cm x 28.5cm piece of green coloured card. With the strip landscape, score at 9.5cm and I9cm, then cut diagonally across from the bottom-right corner up to the 19cm score line. Fold along the score lines, turning the triangle in to make a pocket, and secure with double-sided tape.

Trim three 8.5cm squares of patterned paper, mount onto larger squares of pink card then adhere to the front and inside panels of the card. Mount a triangle of peach card to the pocket.

Layer a strip of teapot opatterned paper onto pink card and then onto a 3 cm x7.5cm piece of green card. Score and fold at 3.5cm and 4cm, then affix one side to the reverse of the card to overlap the right edge. Fold over to the front and secure using hook and loop fastener.

Use a circle die to cut 4 out two teapots from patterned paper. Layer each onto scallop-edged circles of pink card, then onto circles of white. Affix one of these to the pocket. Layer the other onto a green scallop-edged circle and attach to the fastener on the front of the card.

Layer 9cm x 16.5cm of green dotty patterned paper onto white card. Mount onto a slightly larger piece of pink card, then adhere to a 12cm x 18cm white blank.


Cut a 7cm x I6.5cm piece of teal dashed paper and layer onto white card, then onto pink. Affix centrally to the base.

O Die cut two hearts from the bunny patterned paper ensuring that the bunny motif sits in the centre. Mount onto larger white hearts. Trim identical bunnies from the paper and layer onto

the hearts with 3D foam pads. Attach them to the card front.

Cut a medium-sized heart **4** around a 'With love' sentiment. Cut a smaller heart from the same design and layer it on top with 3D foam pads, then adhere to a pink heart. Draw a dashed border around the edge with white gel pen and attach to the centre of the card.

Punch two flowers from green dotty paper, then layer smaller pink flowers on top. Finish with a small pearl in the centre of each. Affix to the top and bottom hearts to finish.







an you believe something as gorgeous as Corinne Bradd's paper teacup is made in just nine steps? We'll be making ours as gift boxes for our lovely mums, but you could craft yours for a cute ornament or to hold paper flowers. Alternatively, make a wellbeing gift for a friend by simply filling it up with their favourite flavoured teabags. It's an idea you can use over and over again!



Cut a IOcm x 23.5cm piece of patterned card and, with the strip landscape, score at 2.5cm intervals



Trim scrap card into a tooth shape with a 2.5cm base and one 4cm side. Trace the outline onto each scored section and cut



Create a cup shape by pulling all tabs in the same direction and glueing each to the one next to it



Cut a 7cm diameter circle from thick card and place inside the cup. Push it down to sit flat on top of the curved base



Trim a 2cm x l6cm strip of patterned card and score one long side 5mm in from the edge. Clip into a fringe



Curl the strip up into a ring, secure and fix to the bottom of the cup with glue



Cut another strip from patterned card, 2.5cm x 25cm. Score 5mm in from one long edge and clip a toothed fringe into it




Gently curl the teeth of the strip and glue the tabs to a 7.5cm white card circle to make a lid. Cover the join with a disc of patterned card



Use matching card to add a handle and finish with washi tape trims





YOU WILL NEED:

- Craft essentials (p94)
- Xcut Cut & Emboss folders: Flower Fairies, Butterfly Aperture
- Xcut Thank You sentiment die
- Embossing folder: polka dot
- Watercolour pens: green, yellow

Birthdayflowers

1 Punch 35 small flowers from coloured card and add a black pearl to the centre of each. Using the Flower Fairies embossing folder and a I3cm x I4cm piece of white card, create a textured panel and pop out all the sections.

2 Cut an 8cm circle of acetate and stick behind the main aperture. Add 3D foam pads around the window on the reverse of the panel and cut a decorative edge onto the right side of the panel.

Cover a I4cm square blank with yellow card and place the small flowers in the centre. Attach the fairy panel on top

with more 3D foam pads and trap the flowers inside the window shape.

4 Punch a scallop-edged border into a 3cm wide strip of yellow card, tie a length of twine around it and stick to the greeting. Stamp 'Happy birthday' in clear ink onto a small strip of black card, then sprinkle with white

embossing powder and set with a heat gun. Attach to the card to finish.

Layered luxe

1 Cut and emboss the
Butterfly Aperture design
onto a lOcm x l4cm piece of
white card, then colour in the
grass and flowers using





two lcm wide scallop-edged borders from yellow card and attach to the top and bottom of the panel.

Emboss a IO.5cm x I4.5cm panel of pink card with a polka dot design, then stick onto an orange panel the same size, offsetting it slighty. tent-fold blank.

Tie some twine around the top of the white panel then attach to the greeting using 3D foam pads. Die cut a 'Thank you' sentiment twice from black card, glue together and add to the card front.

Print a bird onto white card then use watercolour pencils to colour it in, shading the surrounding background too.

Lightly dampen a thin paintbrush, then use to blend the shading. Leave to dry. Cut out with a 7.5cm circle die, then mount onto purple card.

Glue pink patterned paper onto a 10.5cm square yellow blank, leaving

a narrow border. Use 3D foam pads to secure the bird in the centre.

Orwell Owl

1 Glue an own store down onto pink glittery Glue an owl shape facepaper then cut out. Repeat with the wings from a second owl on green paper, then layer on top.

Colour the feet and beak of the second shape yellow and fill in the ears with green, then cut out all elements plus the uncoloured eyes. Stick in place on the pink piece.

Secure onto a 6cm circle of pink patterned paper, then onto a circle frame die-cut from green card, using foam pads. Layer a sentiment on white card and then onto two shade of green.

Matt floral paper onto a 4 IOcm x I3cm pale green blank. Use more foam pads to mount the motif and sentiment onto the front.

the left hand, then decoupage onto another image using foam pads.

2 Trim the face, left hand and right knee from the final stamped image, then layer them in place. Secure the completed monkey onto a yellow scallopedged circle mounted on orange.

"I've seen a lot of beautiful cards lately that feature partial diecutting, but I've yet to try it myself! Is there a particular technique or any tips you could give me for using it on my next project?"

Tina Evans, via email

Partial (or selective) die-cutting Lis an easy way to transform papercrafts and give die-cuts a new lease of life. To achieve the look, a die is placed on a cutting plate with part of the shape sticking out of the bottom edge. The sandwich is then put through the machine as normal, but the die won't cut beyond the edge of the plate where it's been positioned. A pencil line will help line the die up with the edge of the plate before securing with strips of washi tape. This technique can be used to create decorative panels, tags, extend basic shapes, create silhouette letters and much more.

- Mix and match patterns and colours but avoid going overboard. Remember, three is the magic number
- Can't find mini doilies? Cut your own from thin coloured paper like you would a paper snowflake
- Don't overfill your boxes and use a strong, heavy card for bigger or heftier items

Monogram cards

1 Cut and fold an A5 piece of pearlescent card to form an A6 blank. Sketch an initial onto the reverse of a contrasting print and trim with a craft knife.

2 Mount the letter onto plain card, then trim the outline to leave a narrow border. Fix the shape to a 6.5cm diameter patterned circle using foam pads.

Out a larger disc from the same plain card and layer the initial onto this. Place the monogram top centre of a portrait card or centre-left for a landscape version.



- Pastel pearlescent cardstock (372416)
- Card, coloured
- Coloured doilies
- Baker's twine
- Washi tape
- Gems

Milk carton boxes

1 Use our template to cut out and score a pastel cardstock shape. Glue the side tab to make a tube and fix the bottom flaps together to create a base.

2 Stick a half doily to one bottom corner of the box with diluted PVA and leave to dry. Add extra decoration with co-ordinating washi tape and gems.

Fold in the straight edges at the top of the box and slot the corners through the holes in the sides. Secure with baker's twine, then add a gift tag cut from co-ordinating cardstock trimmed with gems.

3D makes from paper is one of my favourite pastimes. You can have so much fun with this style of card and knowing it will really surprise the recipient makes it even more special. You can even increase the surprise factor by tying strings between folds that pop up when opened.

Colour corrections

Although I've used a bright and fun palette, these cards would also look beautiful in a vintage style with soft colours and romantic paper motifs. Simply alter the designs depending on the recipient you have in mind. Once you've mastered the folding technique you'll be able to whip up a batch of them in no time.





Birthday fishes

- Die cut a 10.5cm x II.5cm stitched rectangle in green card and matt onto an II.5cm x I2.5cm textured green tent-fold blank using 3D foam pads.
- Ink a 7cm square piece of white card with a blue ink



pad, then spritz on a small amount of water for a mottled effect. Adhere to the centre of the greeting with double-sided tape, then layer a 7cm stitched die-cut white frame on top with 3D foam pads.

Die cut a lcm wide chevron banner and stamp 'Happy wishes' before sticking to the bottom of the card. Stamp, colour and cut five fish. Place one in the centre of the frame.

Follow the photo guides below with a piece of 20cm double-sided patterned paper. Embellish the inside with the remaining four fish and a sentiment to finish.

Super girl

Die cut a 9.5cm scallop-edged stitched square from light pink card and adhere to a 10.5cm square tent-fold blank. Create a dark pink stitched 8.5cm square panel and add to the greeting with 3D foam pads.

Stamp, colour and die cut a superhero image and I7 small stars from yellow card. Stick the motif and six stars to the centre of the greeting.

Using a I4cm square piece of card, fold it in half once, then in half again. Unfold it then score a diagonal line from one side to the other. Fold the sides into position and stick squares and triangles of patterned paper to cover each folded panel.

Die cut two 9.5cm scallop-edged squares from patterned paper and glue to the inside of the card, then stick the folded insert inside as shown. Embellish with the remaining star die-cuts, a sentiment and number ten.

Glue three nesting fishtail banners cut from patterned paper to the right-hand side before wrapping the entire panel with a 2cm wide scallop-edged border. Tie brown twine around to secure.

Using 3D foam pads, adhere the elements onto a 9cm x I4.5cm tent-fold blank.

Die cut three flowers from glittery white card and arrange across the middle of the greeting.

4 Add 'If friends were flowers' stickers and three layers of torn washi tape to the top-left corner of the card. Embellish the greeting with gems.

Flower power

Punch a scallop-edged border along the base of a IO.5cm x I5cm tent-fold blank, then matt a I0cm x I2.5cm panel of floral paper onto it. Emboss a tile pattern onto an 8cm x IO.5cm white card panel before using 3D foam pads to layer onto blue patterned paper.

Position a punched flower on each tile, then wrap blue raffia and brown string around the panel before securing to the greeting with 3D foam pads. Die cut a flower and leaves from coloured card and assemble on the raffia border. Finish by adding a 'Hello flower' sentiment.

Digital design

Creating beautifully decorated favour bags, a stunning floral wreath and seasonal artwork is easy using the Cricut Explore $\operatorname{Air^{TM}}$ or $\operatorname{Air} 2^{TM}$ and the corresponding online software, Design Space TM . The bags make a great thank you gesture, party favour or 'get well soon' token, and the stunning floral wreath is perfect to decorate the front door, a window or as a table centrepiece. Finally, disperse any wintry blues that might still be lingering by creating a fresh bright canvas to welcome in spring. Happy 'exploring'!





Spring art

Paint the edges of a canvas grey. Connect the Cricut Explore[™] to the computer and \log on to your Design SpaceTM account. Select 'Spring' from the Categories menu and locate the 'Spring Has Sprung Wall Art' project located near the bottom.

- Resize the project by clicking 'customise', or select 'Make It Now'. Resize the images by first highlighting the image and dragging the corner point.
- Cut the images from card and paper, adjusting the Smart Dial™ accordingly. Adhere the decorative paper to the canvas. Glue the 'Spring Has Sprung' layers together and then onto the canvas using a hot glue tool and glue stick.

Little bag

1 Connect the Cricut Explore™ to the computer and log on to your Design Space[™] account. Select 'Parties & Events' from the Categories menu and locate the 'Merci Favor Bag' project near the bottom.

Click 'Customise', then (Insert image'. Search for and select 'gift bag', then choose one from the options. Search for 'pennant' and select a rectangular-shaped flag for the washi tape seal.

• Resize the images as required. Do this by highlighting the image and dragging the corner point. The size appears in a black text box as the image is altered.

Change the size of the gift 4 bag image to 7.6" x 7.8" for

a finished size of approximately 6.5cm x IOcm. Resize the pennant to fit across the width, then 'hide' the shadow layer.

Cut the gift bag from patterned paper, the flowers and leaf from card and a pennant from washi tape, adjusting the Smart Dial as you change the material and inserting the scoring stylus and pen as prompted.

Once cut, carefully fold the O bag along the score lines and glue the tabs. Fill the bag and seal it using the washi tape pennant. Tie twine around the top and knot to secure.

Assemble the flower by adhering the tab on the reverse of the last petal. Layer the flower sizes together and secure using a brad. Glue the flower and leaf onto the bag.

Wondrous wreath

1 Select 'Spring' from the Categories menu and locate the 'Summer Wreath - Lia Griffith' project. Resize if required.

Turn to portrait and score at I.5cm and I4cm. Cut into each small square and clip the last I.5cm notch, as shown on the template.

Curl the blue flower petals outwards and glue the

layers together. Roll the middle layer and adhere to the blue flower's centre. Score and curl the leaves and foliage.

Assemble the wreath using the hot glue tool. Firstly, stick the leaves down, then add the flowers and tuck in foliage to fill any gaps. Use the remaining leaves to cover the back of the wreath. Tie ribbon or twine around one part of the wreath to hang.

OUR TOP TIPS FOR USING THE CRICUT EXPLORE AIR MACHINE

- Use the scraper tool to lay the materials onto the cutting mat and minimise air bubbles
- For crisp creases, you can also use the scraper tool as a bone folder
- To minimise damage to both the image and cutting mat, use the spatula tool to carefully remove the cut images
- Take time to browse the many images you have to choose from on the Cricut Design Space[™] software you'll be using your machine every day!

Q: How can I create a dynamic die-cut card?

KEREN BAKER SAYS:



I have used has a wonderful swirly shape and gives you the perfect template, so all the thinking is done for you.

Choose one main swirl and add an odd amount of flowers (I used Kori Kumi flowers from Craft Consortium) at two points to create a pleasing design.

To give contrast to the project, fix the die-cut panel to a contrasting coloured base using 3D foam pads. Leave some white space to give the eye somewhere to rest. If you don't have a die like the Tim Holtz Mixed Media 2 Thinlits one I used, why not try giving yourself a template with a swirled stamp design? Either add elements on top of the flat design or, for a little extra dimension, try cutting out

Q: What is a pretty springtime project I can adapt?

KITTY FRAMPTON SAYS: Creating a 3D window box greeting may look tricky but,

once you have the template, it will come together very easily. If you already have a window shape die you can use this to create the main window frame; simply adjust the other measurements to match. You can make these as simple or as embellished as you wish. Why not add some lace for curtains to the window sides, or add pearls or rhinestones to each of the scallops? You could also mount the entire window onto the front of a card blank, but try not to make it too front-heavy or it may not stand up. Experiment by using different colours and add pretty embellishments in the windowsill box.

How to make a window card



Draw four $3.5 \,\mathrm{cm} \times 4.5 \,\mathrm{cm}$ rectangles onto $10 \,\mathrm{cm} \times 13 \,\mathrm{cm}$ of white card. Score a border around each side at $0.5 \,\mathrm{cm}$ in from the edge



Stamp flowers and leaves onto the window panes. Cut out each shape and press out. Stick acetate behind the window aperture



Download and draw the template onto the back of floral paper. Cut, score and fold along each line. Assemble with tape and secure onto the window base



Cut $4 \text{cm} \times 10 \text{cm}$ from pink spotty paper and die cut one side with a scallop-edged die. Score a 0.5 cm line across the top and attach to the window top

Q: How can I achieve different textures with coloured ink?

LEANDRA FRANICH SAYS:



stain. The mix of walnut crystals and dye colour are particles that dissolve at different rates. The colour is so fine and powdery that as soon as water touches it you instantly see bright colour. The walnut takes longer to absorb the water as it's more like a sugar granule. There are many ways to use these to achieve different effects; start by varying the amount of water you use, then see if extending the time



before you dry your surface makes a difference. For example, a light mist and quick dry gives you lots of interesting colour-dominant spots. For a lighter effect, blot with a paper towel instead of drying naturally or using a heat tool. With a generous spray of water and after 10-20 seconds, you'll see the walnut crystals really kicking in and



dissolving. The longer you leave this process to occur, the browner the colour will become. Again, try blotting instead of drying with a heat tool. Try the same ideas onto a chalk-painted surface, a chalk-paint-stencilled surface, or a surface that has had Grunge Paste applied to it. I hope these ideas have inspired you!





Helen Fitzjohn creates a stunning pop-up card by combining English country garden papers with 3D elements



Can you get a much cuter motif than a tea set? Using the templates downloadable

from our website, as well as a gorgeous paper pad from First Edition, you can make vour mum a beautiful themed card she can think of each time she has a cuppa. Helen Fitziohn's greeting might challenge your 3D cardmaking skills, but it's easier to make than it looks. Simply construct a box using a tab to secure, then stick your sentiments and embellishments to acetate arms and the panels of the open flaps. What's best is it even folds flat so it can be popped in the post!

YOU WILL NEED:

- Craft essentials (see p94)
- Online templates from papercraftermagazine. co.uk
- First Edition Bella Rose paper pad
- Paper punches: scallop-edged border, scallop-edged heart, doily lace edged border
- Circle nesting dies
- Watercolour pencils
- Embossing tool
- Mountboard
- Pink ribbon
- Paintbrush
- Acetate
- Pearls



Box card

Download the templates from our website and use it to make a flat box using bright pink card. Score the middle line on the reverse to allow the flaps to fold down. Cut out three 7cm x 9cm rectangles

from blue floral paper and punch one short side on each with a doily lace-edged border. Add them to the flaps.

Matt three 6cm x 8cm pink rectangles to the sides of the box. Punch a doily laced edge along blue floral paper

and use it to cover the tall panel of the card. Cut two bunting poles from a 0.5cm x 2lcm piece of mountboard. Make a small hole in the top of each rod using a needle, then glue them inside the edges of the panel.



Make three triangles and string them together with thread, then attach the length to the poles. Fold up the box and glue the tab. Once dry, glue two tabs in the centre of the container. Slowly fold the box down as they dry.

Create three cupcakes from white card. Lightly colour each with a brown watercolour pencil, then apply a wash to it. Once dry, shade with brown and use grey to add shadow around the frosting. Make cupcake cases and fix them to the motifs, then embellish.

5 Cut out and create a teapot, then repeat to make a teacup. Print a 'With love' sentiment, then punch a scallop-edged heart from

a pink spotty circle. Stick the message behind the opening and adhere it to the teapot.

Trim several paper flowers. On the reverse of each, emboss a small circle and cut between each petal, stopping at the line. Add pearls to the centres. Attach pink ribbon to the side flaps and mount a 'With love' circle to each one. Add flowers.

Print a 'Mother's Day' sentiment, then cut out and matt to a pink scallop-edged circle. Mount onto the front using 3D foam pads and secure a pink ribbon bow next to it. Fix the cupcakes and flowers to the tabs, then the teapot and cup to the tall panel. Glue flowers to strips of acetate to create depth.

Use the templates to cut and piece together a teapot from spotty pink and floral papers. Cut out a scallop-edged heart from mint patterned paper, then punch around the aperture to make a circle. Stick a 'With love' sentiment behind the opening. Create a flower from floral paper, add a pearl to the centre, then secure pink ribbon around the handle to finish.

Paper Crafter

QUICK JARGON BUSTER

- BRADS: paper fasteners with split pins that pierce paper then pull apart to secure on the reverse
- **DECOUPAGE**: where strips of paper are pasted to cover an object, or creating a 3D image by layering paper, where the smaller parts of a repeated image are cut out and added to the original image for a raised effect
- **DIE-CUTTING**: a die-cutting machine cuts out shapes from paper, card and other materials. Sandwich a metal die over your material then feed it through the machine, turning the handle. The pressure on the die creates the cut
- MATTING: the method of layering different sizes of paper or card pieces together
- ORIGAMI: the traditional Japanese art of folding paper to create 3D shapes
- SANDING: using a sanding block to create a rough texture on the face or edges of a piece of card
- **SCORING**: the method of running a scoring tool over a piece of card to create a straight line that can then be folded

·STEP-BY-STEP· How to... stitch a picture



Draw out your design onto tracing paper using a pencil



Secure onto card with masking tape. Prick evenly-spaced holes along the lines




Remove the tracing paper. Stitch through holes with two strands of embroidery thread



Secure the loose ends on the reverse with tape, then attach to a mount and frame





- Round two opposite corners of 8cm square white card, then add thin strips of double-sided tape in the shape of a number four.
- Place small buttons onto the card, leaving a gap for a candle. Pierce through the holes and sew in place using white thread.
- Slice a slither from the back of a candle and stick in the gap between buttons. Punch a hole, thread ribbon through and tie to secure.
- Mount onto a I2cm square blank covered with leaf patterned paper using 3D foam pads.



shaker cards

- Wet acetate (then dry!) to reduce static and prevent glitter from sticking
- Vellum envelopes and poly pockets work well if you run out of acetate
- Experiment with aperture shapes try cutting away sections of an image
- Use a fast-drying ink to stamp on acetate, being careful not to smudge it

The Last Word



A CUP OF TEA WITH Ali Reeve

FROM CLEVERCUT

We chat to the owner of the Leicestershire-based crafts workshop for tips on mixed media making

What inspired you to start up CleverCut?

When I was a teacher I worked in a nursery school when we visited an education show. There, I watched a demonstration of a large die-cutter for schools and I was hooked, but I couldn't afford to buy all the dies. So we bought a few and sold the die-cuts to fund buying more dies. The rest, as they say, is history!



What's your favourite product?

The item that is never off my desk has to be my Mica powders. These can be used in so many ways for different effects, and they also breathe new life into those items that get pushed to the back of your drawers.

How did your own line, Stamps Away, come about?

We wanted to bring something different to the craft market, and the only way to do that was to start making more ourselves. We bought our first stamp machine and began to produce our own clear polymer designs, then brought in powders, paints and, more recently, MDF blanks.

What products do you sell that are must-haves for mixed media crafters?

Our MDF products are a great stepping stone for mixed media beginners, and we have a good range for creating more ambitious projects such as Artist Trading Blocks (boxes used for displays, stands and as art in themselves). Mixed media artists need a good stash of stencils and masks, and ours were developed with versatility in mind so they work with all the amazing inks, pastes and mediums available to crafters.

What should we try in our next project?

We've just developed some lovely new bubble kits, including word and letter bubbles for creating fun and dimensional cards and projects.

We are very excited and we can't wait to share them!

Tell us about the workshops you currently run?

Every month from our classroom, I teach all-day classes which include four projects where I share as many techniques and tips as I can. What I enjoy most is seeing how everyone adds their own creativity to projects; I find it so rewarding when I hear stories from crafters about how they've taken an idea I've taught them and gone on to create other projects. Another thing I find really great is the friendships that have come about through them. That is the joy of craft, it brings people together.

What are your plans for 2017?

We're aiming to bring even more new products to as many crafters as possible. Ideas can sit on the drawing board for far too long, so our current mission is to see these through. I also adore teaching and so I hope to have the opportunity to lead more workshops, possibly even online for crafters further afield!

ALI'S TOP TIPS FOR MIXED MEDIA CRAFTING

- Think of mixed media as a smaller version of a canvas, but one that you can pop in an envelope
- A bright card with textured flowers and butterflies is just as mixed media as a decorated book or something vintage or grungy
- Start with a bit of recycling: save a few buttons from an old top, use string from a bunch of flowers, die cut shapes from a nice chocolate box, add a few old washers to a Father's Day card...
- Swap your ink for paint to create fun backgrounds that can easily be stamped over, die cut and more
