





Thinking of going vegan? Don't forget to take a look at the cosmetics in your make-up bag, says our Beauty Editor

ind your own beeswax. And lanolin. And carmine. That's the message coming from beauty consumers this year as the trend for vegan products really begins to take off. Our desire for organic and natural lotions and potions has been growing for some time, with the industry predicted to be worth an incredible £12 billion by 2020. Now people are starting to seek out cosmetics and creams that are not just chemical and cruelty free, but contain no animal derivatives whatsoever.

Unfortunately, pinning down mainstream ranges that are

entirely vegan can be tricky. Even super-ethical brands such as Aveda and The Body Shop don't qualify as vegan because the smallest blob of honey or beeswax makes a product a no-go, so you really need to be in the know if you're taking this seriously.

That said, there's nothing we love more than being virtuous without making much (read: any) effort, and it came as no surprise to me to discover that one of PETA's most successful blogs is "44 accidentally vegan snack foods". You could always take the same approach to your beauty regime – pick and choose products

from ranges you love that make the grade without actually trying to.

For example, Dr Hauschka
Night Serum (£38; 0800 055
6604, drhauschka.co.uk) is
entirely free of animal derivatives
and is a fabulously fragrant gel that
helps balance skin and stimulates
the renewal process. And you can
sleep easy knowing no animals
were harmed in the making.

There's nothing remotely "knit your own yoghurt" about **Kat Von**D's cult range, which finally landed in the UK at the end of last year, but the make-up artist keeps her products vegan wherever possible. Her **Tattoo Liner**

(£16; debenhams.com)

has legions of fans thanks to its superfine flexible brush tip, which makes precise application super-easy. Also keep your eyes peeled for her amazing Unlock-It Makeup Remover Wipes, which go on sale here in the summer.

Looking for a mascara you can feel morally superior about?

Arbonne It's A Long Story

Mascara (£28; 0800 977

5721, arbonne.com) will give dramatic lashes without the worry. It's waterproof and long wearing, and you really aren't sacrificing quality for your conscience.

For rich texture and bold





colour, you can't go wrong with Barry M Satin Super Slick Moisturising Lip Paints (£4.99; 020 8349 2992, barrym.com). They're free from tallow (rendered animal fat also found in the new plastic fivers) which so many lippies contain, while shea butter and vitamin E keep your pout in peak condition – and with that price tag, you can experiment with the whole range.

If you don't want your make-up brushes plucked from the backside of a horse, goat or squirrel, there are plenty of synthetic options on the market these days.

Check out EcoTools, whose Define and Highlight Duo (£11.99; ecotools.com) are made with super-silky, sustainable bamboo. Even the packaging they come in is made from tree-free paper.

Yes, they are vegan and cruelty free, but the best thing about Nailberry L'Oxygéné Oxygenated Nail Lacquers (£17; nailberry.co.uk) is how kind and clever the formulation is. The polish is designed to allow air and moisture to pass through its surface, keeping nails in peak condition, even if you're a varnish addict who is never seen in public without a coat of the colourful stuff.

For all-natural illumination, check out Inika Organic Certified Organic Light Reflect Cream (£19; inikaorganic.com/uk) – apply lightly for cheek and brow bones that pack a punch.

For speedy coverage, Lavera
Tinted Moisturising Cream 3in1
(£12.90; 01557 332498,
pravera.co.uk) is perfect for days
when full make-up feels like a step
too far. Giving hydration and a
natural glow in a quick hit, you
simply apply it after cleansing and
there's no need for foundation –
leaving you more time to plan
your accidentally vegan lunch... §

Not a lot of people know this but I'm very good at... I think I'm quite a good cook. My mum taught me when I was younger - she's always cooked from scratch - and I think it's stood me in really good stead. I'm not afraid in the kitchen, especially with baking. For some reason, my cakes turn out rather well. My best friend is... That's a tough one. Like most people, you have friends from school and college or your colleagues, like the girls I was in the band with. But right now the person I want to hang out with is my little girl, Scarlet. She's my buddy and also getting to that point where her advice is actually quite good. She's very opinionated and outspoken and not afraid to say her true feelings, which as a mum is quite hard work, but once she's out in the big wide world, I think she'll be fine. My nickname is... the obvious one, Sporty Spice. The funniest thing about it is that I'm probably sportier now than I ever was. I think the nickname firstly came about because I wore tracksuit pants. I've done a few triathlons over the years but I did three this year including my personal best in London. The bravest thing I've ever done is... in Zambia for Comic Relief. We went down the Zambezi white water rafting, kayaking and canoeing for five days. We lived out in the bush with no contact with home apart from calling in to Nick Grimshaw on Radio 1. It was one of the most difficult things but one of the most exhilarating. We raised loads of money, which was great, and they ended up building a school in one of the little villages we visited. My favourite TV show is... I've been going over old boxsets and I'm into Mad Men at the moment, which I'm enjoying, although I'm a little late to the party on it. My perfect evening is... probably one

at home. It doesn't sound like anything extraordinary but I find that when I'm busy and out and about, I just crave to be at home, having a nice quiet dinner with

my boyfriend [Joe Marshall] after the kids are in bed [he has two children, who are 10 and eight], then settle down in front of something decent in front of the box.

I'd like to say sorry to... the girls. Emma, Geri and Melanie wanted to go out and do some stuff together as a band again, but it just didn't feel right for me so I had to do what was right for me and follow my instinct. I feel bad about letting people down and fans that'd want to see it. But I think when you are 43, it's time to start doing what's right for you and not just what's right for other people.

My first kiss was with... my boyfriend at school. I was about 14. It was in the playground but not during school time. It was pretty daunting but I think I've improved since then.

My biggest regret is... Some days I really regret some of my tattoos. I love tattoos and think there are some really beautiful ones, and some people look great with them, but I wish I had made different choices. If I could get rid of any, I think I'd start with the one on my calf, which is a dragon. I'd quite like my legs back. Who you are in your mid-twenties and who you are in your early forties are quite different.

The one thing I'd change about myself is... I often have a lot of guilt. I find it quite crippling if I do decide to do something when people would rather I did something else.

It's not good for my image but I like...

I suppose I'm obviously quite healthy and active and all of those things, but I do love a boozy day down the pub with my mates. I don't think that's very good for my image. It's quite rock'n'roll but it's not really sporty.

If I could pass any law I would... police Twitter. Some of the abuse that you get is so horrendous. I think if it could be clamped down on, that would be my first port of call. From comedy to drama, Sarah Parish can cut it in a wide range of roles. She's thrilled to be in the new series of *Broadchurch*, as Simon Button reports

sked to describe her character in the new series of *Broadchurch*, Sarah Parish says: "She's the girl everybody wanted to be at school. She was the good-looking one all the boys fancied, the girl who was really good at sports, the girl who was the head of the gang."

And was Sarah the same? "Absolutely not," she laughs. "I was kind of a quirky thing at school. I liked quite unusual music and I was very into drama and not particularly sporty. I had a group of friends but we were by no means the cool girls."

As a guest on the third series of the crime drama, Sarah plays Cath who has been married to her high-school sweetheart for 30 years. At first sight they seem to be the town's perfect couple.

"When I read the part of Cath, I thought, 'Yes, I remember that girl,'" says Sarah, who was born and raised in Yeovil in Somerset and filmed her scenes in nearby West Bay. "I remembered looking at her in school and thinking, 'Gosh, I wish I looked like her and I wish I had her designer trainers.'" She sighs. "I knew that girl. But I wasn't her."

Still, the actress went on to greater things with roles in shows such as Cutting It, Mistresses, W1A and Trollied while Broadchurch's Cath remains stuck in her home town. And as she marks her 50th birthday, the cracks in Cath's marriage are starting to show.

Thankfully, 48-year-old Sarah's marriage to actor James Murray is much happier. The most stressful thing, Sarah says, is organising her acting career around caring for their seven-year-old daughter Nell.

"It's an ongoing struggle, I think, for any actress," she says. "You just take one day at a time and one job at a time. I've been fairly lucky that since Nell was born a lot of the jobs I've done have been quite close to home, like Bristol or down in the South West somewhere. I haven't had to schlepp up to the Orkney Islands or anything like that.

"Sometimes, it's been taken out of my hands or I've deliberately made that choice, but it's worked out well. Now Nell is seven I probably could take jobs a bit further away. I've taken a step back from acting, but now it might be time to pull my socks up and do a bit more work."

Her *Broadchurch* stint was ideal for moving things up a notch as the huge cast meant Sarah wasn't needed all the time. For while she was making *Broadchurch* she was also filming a new series of *Trollied*, spending half the week in Bristol and the other half in West Bay.

"That's very appealing when you've got a little girl and you live nearby, but I might have to go further afield and work a bit harder in future," she says. "I've had a nice time but we've all got to pay the rent, haven't we?"

Sarah and James, who was also in Cutting It

and was recently seen in the ITV miniseries *Him*, try not to work at the same time but they have a nanny who steps in on the rare occasions their schedules collide.

When Sarah is away she uses FaceTime to keep in touch with Nell.

"I don't think kids are that interested in FaceTime," she says. "They go hello then they lose interest really quickly and run off and you're left there with a blank screen. Sometimes it's more disappointing and it's better to just wait to see them. You think with FaceTime it's going to be this wonderful, 'Oh Mummy it's lovely to see you,' when often it's you going, 'What did you do at school?' and them going, 'I can't

remember,' and it's obvious they're watching the telly out of the corner of their eye."

Having left Dorset to study drama in London, Sarah loved being back in West Bay for *Broadchurch*. "It was very nostalgic going back and seeing places I hadn't seen for years," says the actress, who now lives in Hampshire.

Back then she dreamed of being a dancer. "But I just wasn't good enough and I was never going to be good enough," she recalls, adding that she auditioned for The Royal Ballet School but didn't get in. "They knew I was going to be too tall and completely the wrong shape."

So she turned her attention to Yeovil Youth Theatre where she found acting was more up her street and eventually graduated from a Boddingtons bitter advert to starring roles in *Peak Practice* and *Cutting It*.


Sarah's subsequent credits include *Merlin*, *Mistresses* and *Atlantis* and she has a recurring role as Anna Rampton, Director of Better, in BBC2 satire *W1A*. With filming of the next series under way, she says of the show's rapid-fire dialogue: "It's incredibly difficult. Everyone feels the pressure but it's so rewarding and we have an awful lot of giggles on the set."

Broadchurch sees Sarah working with leading man David Tennant for the fourth time. They have previously worked together in the musical series Blackpool, the drama Recovery and in a Doctor


Who Christmas special where she was unrecognisable as the alien Empress of the Racnoss. She says of their relationship: "We have a shorthand now, although in *Broadchurch* we don't have an enormous amount to do together. But we've known each other for such a long time and we've worked closely together so many times, it's always nice to work with someone you know. There's a real ease there."

She is also a fan of *Broadchurch*'s leading lady Olivia Colman. "I would say Olivia is one of our best actresses and to watch her work is brilliant," she says. "The great thing about Olivia is that she has a huge versatility. She's incredibly funny and very good at comedy but she's also heartbreaking. Her range is enormous."

But flitting between the *Broadchurch* and *Trollied* sets meant Sarah had no time to hit the gym. "I let myself go a bit," she admits. "I would find myself stuffing in sandwiches between West Bay and Bristol, desperately trying to learn lines in the car and

She and James are also gearing up for a big fundraising push for The Murray Parish Trust. a charity they founded in honour of their daughter, Ella-Jayne, who died at eight months from congenital heart failure in 2009. The trust raises money for the Paediatric Intensive Care Unit at Southampton University Hospital, which cared for Ella-Jayne. This year the trust is

organising a Teddy Bear's Picnic and is hoping to involve every child in every primary school across nine South West counties.

The long-term plan is to build a children's emergency and trauma to keep Ella-Jayne's memory department at the hospital. Sarah says: "It's wonderful to keep Ella-Jayne's memory alive by doing this and also wonderful to be helping other children." She and James feel blessed that Nell is happy and healthy. "She's funny, she's lively and a happy little girl," says her mother. "She's really balanced and she's fun to hang out with. I think she'll be all right.

> In a recent interview James told us his daughter is his best friend and Sarah agrees: "Definitely. She's a good mate. I think because she's an only child and she spends a lot of time with adults you can take her out for a meal and she'll behave. You can take her with a bunch of grown-ups and she won't demand attention all the time. She's great at being around adults and knowing how to behave and knowing what's cool and what isn't. We're very lucky to have her."

She's a cool kid."

And Nell does not seem overly impressed by what her parents do for a living.

"Sometimes we say, 'Mummy and Daddy tell stories and we're actors and we pretend to be other people' but I don't think she cares," Sarah says. "Sometimes she'd have a look at Atlantis when it was on but she didn't like the monsters much.

"She's just not that bothered," she adds. "She's more bothered about her mates and school and her dolls and her teddies." §

Anxiety attacks almost ended Anna Williamson's TV career. Here, she tells Connie Knox how she turned her life around

t the age of 25, Anna
Williamson had it all

– a job presenting
children's show
Toonattik, a flat in
central London and the loving
support of her parents. But anxiety
began to plague her and soon her
dream career was threatened.

Fast forward 10 years and Anna is still on TV – you may have seen her on the *This Morning* sofa. But she is also a trained counsellor, a performance coach and a member of the National Council of Psychotherapists.

And now she has written a book

- Breaking Mad: The Insider's
Guide To Conquering Anxiety

- which she describes as

"a therapist in your pocket".

Life has been something of a roller coaster for Anna, now 35, but she is confident she can help people "kick anxiety into touch". In her gentle, soothing voice she explains how her grounded background became the springboard for her glamorous career.

She says: "I had a lovely upbringing. My parents gave me a lot of love and I have a very healthy relationship with my brother and sister."

At 15, Anna started a band with two other girls, which ignited her passion for performing. "I just loved the lights, the creative outlet," she explains. "So when I stopped being in a girl band, TV presenting was the next step."

Having landed a job at 17 with Disney Channel, she went on to work on *Toonattik* – and it was then her anxiety became a debilitating problem.

"It was ITV's Saturday and Sunday morning slot," she says. "I loved it – it was the best job of my life. But being in a bad relationship was causing me a lot of emotional stress and I was putting a lot of pressure on myself to be the best at my job.

"I was caring so much about my job that all I worried about was getting fired." This intense pressure led to anxiety, nerves and insomnia, triggering terrifying panic attacks.

"They were like an electric shock of adrenaline – a wave of hot and cold dripping fear which takes over your body," says Anna. "It's that debilitating feeling of: 'Oh my God, I have to get out of here.' You don't know what to do with yourself, you are scared of everything with no idea why. It is the loneliest experience and can last for up to 30 minutes after a slow build-up."

For six months Anna kept her problem a secret from the people around her.

"I had a fog of fear every morning. When it got really bad I would take sleeping tablets for my

insomnia. I would drink coffee to keep me up during the day, which made it worse," she says. "I would look at myself in the mirror and will myself to get through the day.

"Before I got help I would call my mum every morning and she would give me a pep talk in the taxi to work."

The panic attacks struck six or seven times a day. By the end of each day Anna was exhausted, every ounce of energy used in her battle with anxiety. But she was such a good actress no one noticed anything wrong. She obsessed about sleep and her social life tailed off.

Anna describes developing OCD

(obsessive compulsive disorder) about getting home every night to the safety of her flat.

Finally, she could cope no longer. She walked into work one day and a colleague asked her if she was OK. "I burst into tears and it was actually the best thing that ever happened," she says. "People underestimate how nice others can be. My team made the decision I wasn't fit to be there. I was to go home and get the help I needed."

Anna saw a psychiatrist, who diagnosed her with generalised anxiety disorder and panic disorder.

"Getting a diagnosis was life changing and I didn't feel like a freak. The psychiatrist put me on short-term medication, which helped me recharge, then I could build myself up again.

"I then had talking therapy, a mix of Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP), Emotional Freedom

Technique (EFT) and hypnosis to help me change my thought patterns. I had two sessions a week for the first three weeks then one every month for around a year."

Less than a month after her breakdown at the studios, Anna was back at work and loving her job again.

"I learnt about myself, what triggers my anxiety and what needed to change," she explains. "In three weeks I felt very strong. I ended my relationship and have never looked back. I presented *Toonattik* for another two years and it was the best two years of the show. It made me a much better presenter."

Anna admits anxiety can still creep up on her occasionally, in which case she takes the time to evaluate what is going on: "It can play tricks on your mind and brain and this is why I wrote the book. If I had listened to my anxiety I would have jacked in my job and I would have been worse off for that. Do not let the fear win," she says.


The former therapy sceptic is now a qualified NLP practitioner, counsellor and life coach. "I wanted



to fly the flag for mental health," she says. "Training on and off for five years, my new education became part of my TV career."

The book followed. "Everything I teach my clients is in this book," says Anna. "As many as one in four people suffer from a mental health illness so *Breaking Mad* is there to help anyone cope with common

symptoms and typical situations in which anxiety can be present.

"Anxiety is when you start being unnecessarily anxious about day-to-day tasks. It becomes life limiting. If you are starting to change thoughts and actions as a result of the anxiety, then that's when you should seek help."

Today, Anna is happily married to

Alex. They have a four-month-old son, Enzo, and live in Hertfordshire. She has a show on talkRADIO, is a member of the *Celebrity Big Brother Bit On The Side* "psych" team and has more than 30 clients at her practice. She is also a campaigner for the mental health charity MIND, the Prince's Trust and Childline.

"The overall message is to step

back and give yourself enough time to do every task," she says. "If you can't, then drop one. If you don't feel rushed, you won't stress."

Strategies for dealing with stress

- Talk: Don't hide it. If you are experiencing debilitating anxiety you are not alone. Millions of people in the UK suffer from it. The first thing to do is to talk to a friend, a partner or, if you don't want to open up to anyone you know, a GP or a private counsellor.
- Breathe: Breathe in for seven seconds and out for 11 seconds, feel it down to the bottom of your lungs. Lack of oxygen fuels anxiety.
- Time out: Do something different for 10 minutes.
 Get some fresh air and completely change whatever you are doing to distract your mind.
- Technology-free zone: We are so connected to emails and social media that they will increase your stress. At some point, when the emails are coming in thick and fast, turn the computer off for an hour and read a book.
- Perspective: Remind yourself where you are and find yourself a safe place.
- Plan your day: Plan the top four things that need doing in a day and take time in your day to do nothing. Take your hour lunch break at work.
 A change of scenery can reset your mental health.
 Make time for your family things like sitting down for a family meal, rather than eating at 100 miles an hour standing up. Eat healthily.
- Exercise: Yoga and meditation are great for the mind. Use up the adrenaline that anxiety feeds off, so go for a run around the park. This will help you sleep better and it will also release "happy" chemicals.

The art of Nae

With two mega movies out, Janelle Monáe is the hottest news in Hollywood. Simon Button reports

eading the script for *Hidden Figures*,
Janelle Monáe was hooked by the
thought of playing Mary Jackson.
"I loved the fact that she wasn't
going to sit back and allow people
to stop her achieving her dreams and goals,"
Janelle says of the African-American NASA
mathematician and engineer who helped
put the first American astronaut into orbit.

Mission accomplished, Mary went on to work in NASA's human resources department. "She sought to help the careers of other women and other minorities and I thought that was so awesome," Janelle marvels. "It was so noble and kind of her – to take a pay cut to go help others."

After voicing a character in the film *Rio 2*, 31-year-old Janelle has been nominated for a slew of supporting actress awards including acclaimed drama *Moonlight*. However, since 2003, she was forging a path as a singer and songwriter and she sees a lot of herself in Mary Jackson.

"On the music side of things, there were times where I was told to dress a certain way to achieve a certain level of success or that I had to sing about certain topics, playing up to the stereotypes of what it means to be a black woman and a black female artist. Mary wanted justice and I've always wanted justice for my career as an artist. For her, it was about changing the face of what it meant to be an engineer, like, 'Yes, black women can be engineers, too.'"

An inspirational true story, *Hidden Figures* centres on three African-American women who aided NASA in the space race. Alongside Mary, there's Katherine Johnson who played a huge role in calculating flight trajectories for the mission that in 1962 sent astronaut John Glenn into space and Dorothy Vaughan who mastered the computer system.

The roles played by these three women aren't well-known. "And that's appalling," Janelle sighs, "but you understand why when you consider

the historical circumstances. Women were treated as second-class citizens. They were not looked at as full human beings with rights."

With an even deeper sigh, she says, "Then try being a black woman during that era. This was pre-Martin Luther King and his 'I have a dream' speech. I understand it, I totally get it, but I'm excited that people will finally get the chance to be inspired by these behind-the-scenes heroes."

Agreeing that great strides have been made since the 1960s, Janelle believes there's still a long way to go. "We've overcome a lot of obstacles but we still have some unfinished business. When millennials like myself watch *Hidden Figures*, I think they'll be able to relate. They'll maybe know what it's like to fight for justice and equality as a woman or an African-American. And it's important to show that these women had allies within NASA – their supervisors and bosses making sure, for example, that they were able to use the same restrooms as the same men and women who were doing less work than them."

She was anxious about working with Taraji P Henson who has been in the business for more than 15 years and Octavia Spencer who has been acting professionally for more than two decades. "I was the new actor coming on set and I was excited but also nervous at the same time. You're working with two brilliant ladies but they made me feel like a little sister."

Referring to their bond as "a life-long sisterhood", the trio would hang out and cook for each other ("Well, Taraji cooked for us," Janelle laughs), there were lots of giggles between heavy scenes and the newbie gushes about her co-stars as "warm, smart, funny and at the top of their class".

She sees them as role models and given her chart success and the acclaim she's been getting for both *Hidden Figures* and *Moonlight*, she knows she's one herself. "When you're a


public figure, it comes with the territory," says Janelle, who nonetheless manages to keep her private life private to preserve an air of mystery. "I've never strived to be perfect because I think perfection is often the enemy of greatness.

"Life is full of highs and lows and, hopefully, the people who look at you can strive to be better than you. They can look at you and go, 'You know Janelle didn't do so great at this so I'm gonna do better.' I encourage people who look up to me to be better than me." She laughs.

Now based in Atlanta, Janelle was born in Kansas City. Her mum was a janitor and her dad a truck driver but Janelle – whose childhood hero Dorothy from *The Wizard Of Oz* gets whisked from Kansas to a magical new land – dreamed of being a performer and followed that dream to New York, where she studied drama. Relocating to Georgia, she got into music – releasing her first EP in 2003, cultivating a strong image of tuxedos and futuristic hairdos and claiming that's not her on stage at all. "It's actually not me, it's a clone," she quips. "I'm one of the first people to own a clone and I use her all the time."

Performing, she feels is "my destiny and my DNA" and as the head of her own record label and a model for CoverGirl, she says, "I don't look at myself as a singer or an actor but more a storyteller. I thrive off connecting with audiences and making them think and feel."





Voicing a vet named Dr Monae in *Rio 2* was fun but she sees *Moonlight* – in which she plays a neighbour who gives a young black gay boy the TLC his drug-addicted mother can't provide – as very meaningful indeed. "I'm so proud of that film," she says of the Golden Globe winner and Oscar contender. "I'm beyond proud. I always love when the underdog becomes the hero."

The message of *Hidden Figures* was a big draw but, on a lighter note, she also loved the 1960s outfits. "I hate the politics and the segregation of that era but I *love* the fashions. I had a fun time trying on the outfits and hairstyles."

In the film, mother-of-two Mary is striving to get the perfect work/life balance and Janelle, who has fingers in so many professional pies, admits, "I'm just figuring that out myself and I haven't even had children yet. This woman had a family, she was a mum, she was also a career woman and she did it all excellently. I hope that when I become a mother, I can do it all as great as she did." At the minute, she'd settle for more downtime. "Right now, I'm looking for more quiet moments, just to be able to sit and read a book."

As the boss of Wondaland Records, she shares Mary's skill with numbers. "I have to be good at maths when I'm running a business," says the gifted student who did a lot of research into the women at NASA's Langley headquarters and their work on the space race. Sounding very knowledgeable, she mentions "equilateral equations" and "low apogee" and "perigee" and explains, "I challenged myself to learn how these women's minds were working every day. They solved equations and came up with the numbers and the projections and calculations to get our men into space.

I also learned all the jargon and I enjoyed thinking like a mathematician and a scientist."

Which prompts the question: would Janelle like to venture into space herself? "Absolutely," she exclaims, adding that she's looked into the Mars Initiative, which aims to send people to the Red Planet to start humanity there. "But they won't be returning and that's the only thing that puts me off — I want to have the option of coming back."

That said, Janelle still has her sights on the stars. "When I was young, I wanted to be an astronaut. I wanted to defy gravity and go to different planets." As someone who doesn't believe in limitations, she adds, "I don't think it's too late for me to be an astronaut."

Hidden Figures and Moonlight are in cinemas now.



Family affair

Stumped for a fun child-friendly destination? Our writers find holidays everyone will love

Cornwall

If I didn't have to write this review, I wouldn't be telling anyone about St Mawes. It's one of those little gems you never want to leave and don't want anyone else knowing about.

It's a fishing village tucked away at the end of the Roseland Peninsula on Cornwall's south coast. Compared to the rest of the county, it seems to escape the levels of tourism that towns such as Padstow and St Ives get, so it feels as though you've stumbled upon something special.

We stayed in Penolva, a beautiful house overlooking the water with four bedrooms and four bathrooms, making it an ideal family home-from-home getaway. The expansive garden leads to its own private jetty and from here we went kayaking and even spotted a starfish.

The house was built in the 1960s by Dick Wilkins, a friend of the Queen Mother. She and other members of the Royal Family visited Wilkins at Penolva, arriving by HMY Britannia and using the very same slipway.

Beautiful setting and amazing house aside, our stay was made complete by the detail and thoughtfulness of St Mawes Retreats, which manages Penolva. We arrived to find a huge pile of home-made scones, complete with clotted cream and jam, in the fridge. The children were delighted to find a bucket and spade and a Cornish teddy bear on their beds to welcome them and a circus tent full of toys in a corner of the enormous living room. We were staying there with our 16-month-old daughter and were impressed to find everything we could have needed for her, including a travel cot, baby monitor and even a babysitting service.

The concierge service available is second to

none and is the reason so many guests return. One of our favourites was the in-house spa treatment where a qualified therapist comes to the house to give therapies – ideal for busy mums or grandparents who need a bit of time out from the mayhem of excited children.

We also couldn't resist trying out the private chef service. Our personal cook for the night arrived with crates of locally sourced, mouthwatering produce, including scallops and venison plus blackberries from her own back garden. She cooked a delicious three-course meal and served each with a carefully chosen wine. The kitchen was left immaculately clean, so you can enjoy the relaxation of eating in, but with none of the bore of clearing up.

To burn off the treats, there's plenty to see on foot, mooching around the village and crabbing from the harbour. On Penolva's doorstep is St Mawes Castle, Henry VIII's coastal artillery fortress built in the 1500s, and you can visit Falmouth, less than a mile away, with a short ferry hop. After taking in the sights, the Hotel Tresanton terrace is perfect for a G&T sundowner.

We'll definitely return and having experienced the service from St Mawes Retreats, I can't imagine visiting in any other way.

Bad Hofgastein, Austria


It's an obvious winter sport destination, but Austria in summer is an underrated treat. This time we visited the small but beautifully elegant spa town of Bad Hofgastein in the Gastein Valley and stayed at the family-run Hotel Österreichischer Hof. Our recently refurbished apartment-style room (complete with kitchenette) was the perfect place for the family to unwind after a day exploring in the mountains. In addition, all guests have free access to the Alpentherme, a magnificent spa resort, and a Gastein Card, which offers discounts on attractions and public transport.

In the morning we decided to take advantage of the Wanderschaukeltag, the network of ski lifts and cable cars, which allowed us to "commute" from Bad Hofgastein to the neighbouring town of Bad Gastein across several peaks and valleys. Needless to say the scenery was stunning. At the top of one mountain we walked (rather unsteadily) across Europe's highest suspension bridge to the Glocknerblick viewing platform, from where on a clear day you can see across to several peaks, including Austria's highest mountain, Grossglockner, which stands at more than 3,700 metres.

We'd promised our horse-mad daughter Ezmé a riding lesson or two at Islandpferdehof, a short bike ride from our hotel. Ezmé was looked after by fully trained instructors as she helped to get the horses ready before riding Littla and Venus, two gorgeous Icelandic ponies, around the sand school and then out into the valley.

A summer visit to the Alps wouldn't be complete without a hike, so with boots laced and walking sticks in hand we headed up Graukogel peak, which towers above Bad Gastein. After a short bus journey and chair lift ride, we tackled the rest by foot – we loved spotting the distant church steeple now miles down in the valley that had greeted us with its chiming bells on our first morning.

We didn't have time to try all the activities





on offer, but we managed archery, fishing, gold panning, cheese tasting and bread making.

For a slight change of scenery, we visited the Kitzsteinhorn mountain, ascending above 3,000 metres by cable car. The outlook from the top is literally breathtaking as you can occasionally feel the lack of oxygen while drinking in the views across the National Park Hohe Tauern. You can also discover the history of the mountain, both geological and human, by entering the 360 metre-long mineshaft, carved through part of this magnificent peak.

For our final day, we hired some two-wheeled steeds and a guide called Daniel, who took us on a truly beautiful cycle ride. We passed alongside a river with vast cliff faces to one side, bright blue skies to the other and the majesty of the mountain range ahead. It was the perfect way to say auf wiedersehen to Austria... for now.

Côte D'Azur, France

It will come as no surprise to learn the Côte d'Azur shouts money. As you step into arrivals at Nice airport, companies implore you to fly to your campsite by helicopter and you can hire any number of amazing sports cars – Lamborghinis, Porsches and Ferraris are all available.

Rightly shunning the shallow trappings of the wealthy, we hired a sensible Seat estate for a comfortable 90-minute journey to Domaine des Naïades, a medium-sized hillside campsite at Port Grimaud, to our Al Fresco mobile home.

Al Fresco's friendly reps took us to our three-bedroom accommodation nestling among fragrant pine, cypress, olive and eucalyptus trees and just a five-minute saunter from the pool and restaurant.

The warm sea breeze wafting through our deck area was immediately relaxing and after a skim of the English papers from the campsite shop it was off to explore. Turning right towards Saint Tropez on the busy D559 road is not generally to be recommended but it will bring you within five minutes to the Géant Casino, a 24/7 supermarket in arguably the best food region in the world where you can feast the senses on about two acres of cheese, fish and meats and the enormous ready-to-eat fresh paellas.

For a late evening walk, head directly south through the Les Prairies de la Mer campsite, an Al Fresco partner, that offers a direct route to the sea, in this case, the playground of the Golfe de Saint-Tropez. As the sun sets, count the private yachts moored there and dream of a lottery win.

With temperatures around 30°C most days in summer, only a fool would stray too far from either the mobile air conditioning or the excellent swimming pool – but get there early for a sunlounger. I thought it was a Brexit conspiracy when only a few English people appeared to have nabbed one, until a countryman generously offered me his.

The following day we drove to nearby Port Grimaud, said to be the Venice of the Riviera, but more importantly the home of our own national treasure Joan Collins. She wasn't in when we visited, so instead we walked the pretty lanes dotted with multicoloured houses.

The pristine, hilltop village of Gassin, five kilometres away and with a stunning, all-encompassing view of the gulf of St Tropez below, is also worth a visit.

The following day, we headed for Sylvabelle Beach about 15km away. You arrive along an incredible cliff sidewalk, which snakes its way to a relatively unpopulated sandy beach. After a dip in the Med, treat yourself at the local patisserie to tarte tropézienne, a cake filled with cream which was once demanded by resident actress Brigitte Bardot. Beach and cake – the Saint-Tropez experience in a day.

For a visit to Saint-Tropez itself, get there before 9am. Park at the old port, take in the delightful Saint-Tropez museum with its pictures by Bonnard and Matisse and if you're feeling flush, breakfast at the Christian Dior brasserie or drift into Roberto Cavalli's cafe.

With beautiful colours, smells, climate and food, the Côte d'Azur is better than its billing – and need not break the bank. But give the helicopter a swerve.

Challenging grief together

After losing seven family members to cancer, Craig and Gemma needed a sense of purpose

Gemma Scott, 30, is an accountant from Scunthorpe in North Lincolnshire and lives with her husband Craig, 35, a mechanic. She says:

"I was just two miles into the Toronto Marathon when I got a stitch across my chest and back. I'd developed a chest infection on the flight over and had nose bleeds earlier that day, which was a sign I shouldn't be running. It was sweltering, 90 per cent humidity and my lungs felt so tight, I couldn't breathe. But I thought, 'I'm not coming all this way and not doing a full marathon.'

I never used to be a runner. I was a size 20 when I was a teenager and not fit in the slightest. Craig and I got together in 2004 and he wasn't sporty either. He was a mechanic and did a lot of lifting at work, but wasn't into fitness.

When I was 18, I started going to the gym and I couldn't stay on the treadmill for a minute without being out of breath. But gradually, it got easier and I started to lose some weight.

Then in 2008, Craig lost three of his grandparents to stomach cancer. It was a devastating time for him as he was really close to them, so we wanted to do something for cancer research and signed up for Race For Life.


Running wasn't my favourite thing. I could do 5k on the treadmill, but neither of us had run outside before. We didn't even have proper kit. We ran around the block, but I could barely make it to the end of the road. Craig was way ahead, but he couldn't run very far either.

But I loved being out in the fresh air – it cleared my head and gave me such a boost. I thought, 'Wow, this is so much better than a sweaty gym.' Craig felt better, too. He really missed his grandparents and running helped give him a different focus.

We did the 5k, then a 10k and built up to the Great North Run half marathon. It was 13.1 miles and at one point, we ran past Frank Bruno!

In 2009, tragically I lost my grandad to skin cancer and in 2011, we lost Craig's aunt who had been battling breast cancer and bone cancer. Then in 2013, my aunt lost her battle with leukaemia.

I was really close to her. She lived in Canada but came over for our wedding



in 2012. We had a cake featuring a bride and groom in running vests and the tables named after the route of the London Marathon. At the time, my aunt didn't tell us she had leukaemia because she didn't want to upset us. She had always encouraged me, so a few months later I rang her to tell her I'd got into the London Marathon and I was doing it for her. But my uncle gave me the tragic news that she had just died.

My world crashed. I knew she'd had treatment, but I didn't realise she was so ill and didn't expect it to happen so soon. It was really horrible. She was the biggest inspiration to me – she just got on with life, she never moaned and has inspired me on every marathon I've done.

The following year, my uncle also lost his battle with stomach cancer and passed away.

Although we continued to fundraise and had done a couple of marathons, I thought, 'We need to do something big and give people a bigger reason to sponsor us.' So I came up with the idea of running 11 marathons across two continents in 14 months, followed by a 69-mile ultra marathon along Hadrian's Wall. The aim was to raise £10,000 for Worldwide Cancer Research.

Craig wasn't sure. He kept saying, 'It's a lot of money, it's a lot of time.' But I quietly started signing him up. He kept getting emails saying he was entered into a race and eventually agreed to do it.

We started in 2016 with the Manchester Marathon in April, followed by Liverpool in May and the Ladybower Trail Marathon in the Peak District in June. Then, out of the blue, my mum phoned and said she had been diagnosed with lung cancer.

That just broke me. It felt like everyone I loved was being affected by this horrible disease and it was all happening at once. It was difficult to stay positive when we'd both had so many setbacks, but if anything it made me more determined.

In September, we did the Robin Hood Marathon in Nottingham. It was so warm, I really struggled, but I thought about my mum and it gave me the motivation to carry on.

Then in October, we flew to Toronto. Our flight was cancelled and we only had 36 hours to get acclimatised. I'd also developed a chest infection and nearly pulled out of the race, then at 23 miles I saw a sign saying, 'If Trump can run for president, you can run this marathon.' It made me smile and was the pick-up I needed. The last mile was the fastest mile I've ever run.

As soon as I saw Craig waiting at the finish line, I collapsed into his arms and started crying. That was the marathon that had been really special to me because it was where my aunt had lived and I know that if she had been there, she would have been proud. It was the toughest marathon I have done.

Three weeks later, we flew to Las Vegas. It was the first time we had done a night marathon, but it was like an 80s disco with neon flashing lights. It was amazing.

A month later, we did Leeds. We're doing Barcelona in March, Manchester in April and Milton Keynes and Liverpool in May. Then the ultra marathon, The Wall, in June. That will be the biggest challenge, as we have to run for 24 hours. It's going to hurt.

It's hard getting up at 4.30am when it's gale-force winds, rain and freezing cold, but I love training with Craig. It feels special because we're working towards the same goal. We can identify when each other is struggling and support each other without even talking. When you've seen someone at rock bottom, it brings you closer.

Craig has also been injured. He got to 10 miles in one race and felt his IT band on the outside of his leg go bang. He said he'd never felt pain like it, but kept going even though he was in absolute agony. He didn't run for the best part of five weeks after that.

We've saved hard to fund our challenge and missed out on parties and nights out. Our friends think we're crazy, but support us and understand why we're doing it.

Meanwhile, my mum is waiting to see if she is in remission. She appreciates what I'm doing, but always worries and she has never seen me

run. But that's not a bad thing because if she saw me at the end of a race, she'd probably stop me from doing it! I think my dad is secretly proud, as he used to run when he was younger and appreciates what goes into the training.

There is not a day that goes by when we don't miss the relatives we have lost, but if I can prevent one person from suffering like my family has, it will be worth it."

Loaded words like "ordeal" are not helpful because you have no way of knowing how their relationship really works. It may help your mother to speak to her GP or a relationship counsellor.

My vitamin B12 injections have been stopped. When my blood was checked my B12 level was high, as I had been taking extra in the form of a spray, but without the injections I am becoming tired and depressed. I was diagnosed with anaemia four or five years ago.


The most common reason for vitamin B12 deficiency is a condition known as pernicious anaemia. Vitamin B12 cannot be absorbed by the body in tablet form so it must be given by injection. Similarly, B12 in a mouth spray won't help either and won't increase the levels in the blood. In the past, vitamin B12 injections were given every two months but it is known now that once every three months is sufficient for most people.







Serves: 4

Cooking time: 10 minutes **Preparation time: 15 minutes**

 $150g (5\frac{1}{4}oz)$ plain flour

- 1 heaped tsp baking powder
- 2 tbsps golden caster sugar
- 1 large egg
- 140ml (5fl oz) milk
- 25g (1oz) melted butter,
- plus extra for cooking

- Ladle 50ml (1¾oz) of the batter at a time into the pan and cook for 2 minutes on each side.
- Serve with maple syrup, blueberries and Greek yoghurt.

Avocado crush

8 bacon rashers

100g (3½0z) cherry tomatoes

2 avocados

A squeeze of lemon juice

A pinch of chilli flakes

200g (7oz) young spinach

- 4 slices of sourdough toast
- Preheat the oven to 180°C/ 350°F/gas mark 4.
- Lay the bacon in a baking tray and scatter around the cherry tomatoes. Roast for 10 minutes until the bacon is crispy and the tomatoes are just starting to pop.



- Stir in the rice then pour over the boiling water. Cover with a lid and bring to a rolling simmer for 10 minutes. Remove from the heat and leave covered for 5 minutes.
- Place the haddock in a frying pan skin side up then cover with the milk and add the bay leaves. Simmer for 5 minutes then cover, remove from the heat and allow the fish to poach for a further 5 minutes.
- Place the eggs in a pan of water and bring to a boil. Turn down and simmer for $4\frac{1}{2}$ minutes then run under cold water to stop them cooking any more. Once cooled, peel and chop into quarters.
- Remove the skin then flake the haddock and stir into the rice with a squeeze of lemon juice, cream, a small ladle of the poaching milk, eggs and coriander. §

pain's flagship wine region is Rioja, which produces its world-famous oakv wines. But it also has another top wine region that's lesser known, yet capable of making full and flavoursome wines. The region is Ribera de Duero, which is roughly in the middle of the country, towards the north. Here, a continental climate results in hot summers and cold winters, and ideal conditions for ripening red grapes, yet retaining some freshness. These wines will please Rioja lovers, but they also have their own personality.

"One" Ribera del Duero Reserva 2012, Spain £13.25, Oddbins, 14.5% alcohol I love this wine, which is supple and detailed with ripe blackberry fruits and some raspberry flavours. There's also a tasty savoury edge to the fruit.

Cillar de Silos Crianza 2012. Ribera del Duero, Spain

£16.99, Majestic, 14.5% alcohol This has a pretty floral nose with tarry-edged blackcurrant fruit and some sweet blackberries. There are also notes of chocolate, coffee and vanilla adding interest.

Avaniel Ribera Del Duero Tempranillo 2015, Spain

£7.50, thewinesociety (01438 741177), 13.5% alcohol Here's a delightful wine showing a spicy peppery edge to the vivid cherry and berry fruit. It's sweet, mellow and perfectly balanced.

Aldi Exquisite Minarete 2015. Ribera del Duero, Spain £5.99, Aldi. 13.5% alcohol

Choose dwarf bulbs for minimum fuss and maximum impact, says Alan

pring bulbs are the undisputed stars of the season, but it's usually the everyday species that you see in beds and borders and creating colourful drifts in the lawn.

Their dwarf relatives are ideal for growing in raised beds, tubs and sink gardens, and grown in pots in a greenhouse they make brilliant displays as they bloom early.

Serious dwarf bulb fanciers will have their names on the mailing lists of several specialist nurseries so they can buy choice species as dry, dormant bulbs in autumn. But if you visit a nursery now (including alpine nurseries), you can buy pot-grown plants as they are bursting into bloom. If you visit an early spring flower show you'll see dozens of delectable dwarf bulbs in nursery displays and you can stock up from the sales tables.

The collectors' specimens aren't as cheap as the spring bulbs sold for bedding in garden centres, but a few potfuls make a brilliant display for a tub on your patio or a table in an unheated conservatory – even a shelf in a porch or a lean-to.

They are good value, too. With basic care, they last for years and by planting them while they are still growing, you stand a better chance of establishing them than dry bulbs.

Miniature daffodils are little

crackers. Narcissus cyclamineus has small reflex-petalled flowers – something like a bright-yellow cyclamen seen in close-up – and Narcissus bulbocodium is often nicknamed hooped petticoats, because its flowers look like crinoline skirts with a tiny bodice on top. The individual bulbs are minute compared to those of the big trumpet daffs grown in borders – five plants in a four-inch pot makes a good show.

Spring-flowering hardy cyclamen are great favourites for growing in pots. Go for named varieties such as cyclamen "Apollo", which has white-marbled leaves. Several cyclamens that aren't quite reliably hardy outdoors are favourites for growing in unheated glasshouses. Look for Cyclamen libanoticum, which has large faintly scented pink flowers and heart-shaped leaves, and Cyclamen pseudibericum, which has strongly fragrant flowers in purplish-carmine. Cyclamen such as these are nearly always sold as growing plants in flower or as dormant but fully rooted tubers in their pots. Avoid buying bare, withered tubers without any roots since they rarely regrow and may well have been plundered from the wild.

Miniature tulip species come in a fascinating range; they make wonderful eye-catchers for a raised bed or rock garden, but they need









harvesting every summer as they rot easily if they are left in the ground, and soil pests find them way too tasty for comfort. Once the leaves die down naturally dig the bulbs up, sort out the small ones that won't flower next year to grow on separately, and save the biggest ones to store in the shed and replant next year.

The smallest, choicest varieties are best grown in pots, so when the plants die down for the summer stand the dormant pots in a sunny place to "bake" during the hot weather. This treatment reminds them of conditions in their Turkish homelands and coaxes them back into bloom next year.

Tecophilaea, a rare find until a few years ago, is a great feather in a dwarf bulb collector's cap. Think of bright blue crocuses, flowering in April or May. Some people risk this prized plant outside in a raised bed, but since it isn't really hardy it's far better to keep it in pots in a cold or frost-free greenhouse. As least that way you can bring it into the porch or conservatory to admire.

One of my favourite dwarf bulbs is Iris "Katharine Hodgkin". She looks like a normal Iris histrioides in shape and size, but with extraordinary sea-green, cream and yellow flowers with navy blue spots and stripes. Being vigorous, the same bulbs will flower year after year if you plant them outside now.

But some of the most riveting little plants are fritillaria species - or "frits" as they are known to their friends. The dwarf sorts are incredible, with tufts of short, fragile, glassy foliage and nodding bell-like flowers in shades of ochre-yellow, green or brown come April or early May. They

may not be too spectacular, and they are a challenge to grow well, but they are worth a close look when you do pull it off, so put them in pots where you can give each one attention.

However you accommodate them, miniature bulbs are a delight. But be warned, they are very collectable - you'll soon be hooked. §

Caring for dwarf bulbs

- Pot up groups of drv bulbs in wide, shallow pots (ideally terracotta) in late summer or autumn, according to species, keeping one variety per container. Note any special cultivation instructions on the back of the label for future reference.
- If you buy growing plants now, keep them inside a cold frame, greenhouse, bright airy carport, or a very sheltered spot outside.
- Water sparingly and feed with weak doses of heavily diluted liquid tomato every two weeks until the foliage starts dying down naturally. In summer, stand dry pots of daffs, hardy and semi-hardy cyclamen species and tecophilaea in a cool, shady, safe spot down the garden. exposed to light summer showers (but in a wet year protect them from repeated soakings). Put tulips in a place that gets gentle sun - if possible sink the pots to their rims in sand in a sunny cold frame
- and keep them bone dry.
- Repot pot-grown miniature bulbs every year in late summer while bulbs are totally dormant. Gently remove all the old compost and any dead roots (but leave any live roots, which are often found on cyclamen that don't go entirely dormant). Put a handful of coarse drainage material such as gravel in the bottom and replant the bulbs in a mixture of 50 per cent John Innes No3 and 50 per cent coarse potting grit or pea shingle. Very good drainage is essential for most of these species. For cyclamen, use 33 per cent each John Innes No3, grit and peat-free multipurpose compost. Start daffs and cyclamen back
- to life with gentle watering from late summer onwards. Don't start tulips or dwarf Iris up until mid-October.

by Joanna Trollope (out Feb 23) (Mantle, £18.99)

Joanna Trollope's novels address the issues and emotional journeys that face women today. In this, her 20th novel, she turns a sharp and reflective eye upon four friends in their workplaces.

When high-flying Stacey asks for flexible hours in her city job, she is immediately made redundant. Facing life without work, with a preoccupied husband and a mother whose mind is rapidly disintegrating, the future looks bleak. She retreats from the world.

Meanwhile, Melissa, a single mother and high-achieving business consultant, must deal with her son's growing allegiance to his father and his father's new family.

Beth is a successful academic but her world is overturned when her partner Claire walks out.

Finally, Gaby juggles her family of three children with a job as an investment banker. Complications arise when Gaby hires Sarah, the new wife of Melissa's ex-husband, without mentioning it to her friends.

As the novel progresses, each woman is forced to question herself and to ask what really matters. How important is work? How much more do women have to put up with in the workplace than men? What price transparency, especially among friends? The author addresses all these questions with her customary insight and wisdom, depicting the characters with warmth and psychological veracity, drawing the reader deep into their lives.

The Chilbury Ladies' Choir ****

Six months into the Second World War, the face of rural England is changing. In the Kent village of Chilbury, where most of the menfolk have enlisted, the choir is disbanded when the vicar decrees there can be no choir without men. But no one has bargained for Miss Primrose Trent, aka Prim, who proposes a women-only choir. Gradually, even the doubters come round and the choir brings the women of all ages together.

The story is told mostly through the letters and journals of various villagers: widowed nurse Mrs Tilling; flirtatious Venetia Winthrop who gets herself into deep water with a secret liaison; her younger sister Kitty who has the singing voice of an angel; scheming midwife Edwina Paltry who will do anything to pay off her debts; and Sylvie, a young Czechoslovakian refugee. Through them, the secrets and deceits of village life are revealed, bringing some people together and tearing others apart. Courageous or fearful, loving or cunning, their voices build a wonderfully idiosyncratic and gripping picture of a small community which will be turned upside down by the encroaching war.

Basing the book on stories her grandmother told her, the author sets a number of hares running through the novel from a baby swap to a mystery incomer. Ryan also goes on to evoke vividly the shock and – in many cases – the delight of women who discover not only how to stand up for each other but for themselves.

Before The Rains

by Dinah Jefferies (out on February 23) (Viking, £12.99)

However, there are many opposed to their growing closeness and eventually they must choose between the traditions binding Jay or whether to follow their feelings. Packed with colour, history,

atmosphere and plenty of twists and turns, this is a lush, escapist read.



This Is How It Always Is by Laurie Frankel (Headline Review, £16.99)

This heart-warming novel explores life with a transgender child. Rosie Walsh, a doctor, and writer Penn Adams have five sons but long for a daughter. Then their

But when Poppy goes out into the world, the family's journey takes unexpected and difficult turns. 

walk to the graveyard was always a treat. When we were first married, Jon used to make a joke of it. "Wow, your family really know how to enjoy themselves. Graveyard in the morning, probably a funeral in the afternoon, then Songs Of Praise in the evening," he'd joke.

But even Jon grew to enjoy the ritual. The walk over the downs, stopping by the pond for sandwiches and tea from a flask, the turning into the lane where the trees met overhead and where – in spring – the banks would foam with glorious daffodils, then the silent church, the creaking gate and the walk through the graves.

It had been a proper village once, with farm-workers' cottages - even a small school. But the farm went out of business and the new road bypassed the village, leaving only a rutted track that was impassable in the winter. One by one, the residents left the cottages and there were no children for the school. Only the church remained, but even that was now closed. It was a silent place, and when a sheep once wandered into the graveyard from the fields, its bleating seemed shockingly loud, as if it could raise the dead.


We used to say that our children, Lily and Tom, learnt to read in that graveyard, spelling out the difficult Victorian names. Thomasina, Violet, Herbert, Archibald. It was a handy maths lesson, too.

"If Elsie Maynard was born in 1852 and died in 1855, how old was she?" I'd ask.

"Three," Lily would say, and pick daisies to put on Elsie's grave.

The most impressive grave was a stone cross near the church porch.

"Sacred to the memory of the Rev Martin Amshore, vicar of the parish, 1870-1940. Also his beloved wife Verity 1875-1952," it read.

Martin must have been the last vicar, as the church closed in 1932.

A small white stone by the lych-gate read: "Private Thomas Amshore 1897-1915. Too dearly loved to be forgotten."

The church was always locked, but on one visit, just before Christmas 2014, we were surprised to find the door open and an elderly couple arranging holly in the porch.

"There's going to be a carol service," they told us. "It's to commemorate the First World War. We're cleaning the place up a bit."

They showed us round. The building smelt of damp, but there was still that faint "holy" aroma that I remembered from the infrequent church services of my youth: candles, incense and flowers.

Lily and Tom were 13 and 15. They hadn't wanted to come, but I'd insisted. We'd had Sunday lunch at my mum's and everyone had eaten and drunk too much.

"A brisk walk over the downs is just what we need," I said.

Jon was stuck into a football match and Mum wasn't feeling too good that day, so it was just me and the kids. They'd been bored at first, but I was glad to see that they were interested in the old church, asking questions and taking photographs on their phones.

"That's the leper window," the man was telling them. "Lepers weren't allowed inside, so they would queue by the window to be given Holy Communion."

"How old is the church?" I asked.

"Anglo-Saxon, originally," said the woman. "It was abandoned after the Reformation. They smashed all the lovely stained glass. That window up there," she pointed above the altar, "used to show the Archangel Michael with his fiery sword. The church wasn't opened again until the 19th century."

"You know a lot about the local history," I said.

"Well, I used to spend a lot of time here, dear," she told me, as she went back to her flower arranging.

On the way out I tried, rather awkwardly, to make a donation.

"No need," said the man. He had a deep voice and it echoed against the vaulted ceiling. "Just your presence is enough. Nice to see young people here, too."

Tom, who was beside me, looked embarrassed.

"God bless you," she said, turning to me. "Keep them close, dear. They're gone before you know it."

"Yes," I said brightly. "It won't be long before they're at university." The woman smiled but didn't answer. As we walked away, I saw her standing in the porch. I waved, but she didn't respond.

When we got home, Jon said, "Maybe they were the ghosts of Martin and Verity. Didn't the woman say she used to spend a lot of time there? Well, the place has been closed since the 30s."

"They were called Margaret and Henry Sutton," I said. "I asked. They belong to the Church Preservation Society. I thought I might go along to the carol service. It's next Saturday, apparently."

But I never did get to go. That night, Mum had a heart attack in her sleep and died. The ramifications of selling the house went on until spring and, when we drove away for the last time, I had no real sense that my childhood had gone forever. I never went back to the silent village and the graveyard.

When Tom was doing A-level art, he printed out some of his photos of the church. They showed the empty nave and aisle, the birds' nests in the beams, a middle-aged woman, red-faced from the walk and too much lunch, two bored-looking teenagers. They also showed an elderly couple, grey-haired and slightly sad and, behind them, a tall youth in the uniform of the First World War, his face glowing in the light from a window which had once shown St Michael, the patron saint of soldiers.



"LOSING Rick is still a shock. He had been a part of my story for 50 years. Rick was the archetypal rock star, one

of the originals. He never lost his joy, his mischievous edge and his penchant for living life at high speed, high volume, high risk. His life was never boring and he was louder and faster and more carefree than the rest of us.

This is us in 1994, at a fundraising gig for The Prince's Trust, and ours was without doubt the longest relationship of my life. We spent years on the road, on the stage and in the studio, rarely far from each other, honing what we did. And from the early days, we worked together to create the Quo sound, look and hits.

When myself and Alan Lancaster started the band in 1962 with fellow classmate Jess Jaworski we were called The Scorpions for about a week, then we became The Spectres when John Coghlan joined us.

We rehearsed in our manager's gas showroom in Lambeth Walk, in the basement, and because it was an old building it vibrated so much that all the cookers ended up in the middle of the room and we had to push them all back against the walls before we left.

I met Rick, who was in a band called The Highlights, a couple of years later. We were performing at a so-called rock'n'roll ballroom and I remember seeing him stood in the middle of the floor with this attitude and stance.

He told me subsequently that he was looking at us and thinking, 'That's what I want to do.' Anyway, we became friends and eventually Alan Lancaster and our manager said they were thinking of asking Rick to join 'because the band needs a voice'. Since I was the singer I was like, 'Hello?' – but to be fair I never had much of a voice, more a monotone.

By 1967 we'd renamed ourselves Status Quo and the following year *Pictures Of Matchstick Men* made the top 10. And I'll admit that success made me a mouthy big head. Plus, you think you've won when success comes, but that's when the work starts because you have to sustain it.

But I loved being in a band and there have been many highlights, like landing our first record contract – which meant we could put 'recording artists' on posters and charge more for admission – and hearing our first hit on the radio.

Live Aid in 1985 was, of course, a milestone. It's funny because no one wanted to go on first but we didn't care, not realising that there'd be so much media in front of the stage that footage of us opening the show went all around the world.

Low points? We got put in prison in Austria for a couple of days after a security scuffle went pear-shaped and Alan Lancaster hit a police officer. Rick learning that his daughter Heidi had drowned [at the age of two] was really upsetting and he went through all

sorts of torment. And I was a heavy drinker, which then led me to cocaine, but I've been clean for something like 29 years now.

Rick and I never really argued, apart from maybe one big shouting match in Munich. I think I threw a towel at him and he threw it back – it was vicious. We were a team, a double act, a partnership and yet also two very different people handling the pressures of growing older, constant touring, dealing with success. We didn't have rows, we'd just go quiet."
