# How to ...

# patch stitching onto a card

# 1 Once you've finished

stitching your design, cut it out using a pair of sharp fabric scissors. Make sure to leave three squares of aida all the way around the edge of your piece of stitching. Then, carefully fray two blocks of the aida all the way around, using tweezers, to make the fringe – take your time with this, so that it looks nice and neat.

2 Using double-sided tape, attach a slightly smaller piece of white paper to the back of the aida. This will prevent the card colour from showing through the holes on the aida.

3 Finally, stick your patch to the centre of your pretty card blank. Then, all that's left for you to do is write a personal message inside and send your sweet stitched creation to a lucky loved one!







# How to ...

# add sequins

- 1 The chart is marked with dots to show where you'll stitch on a sequin. Start by using a matching thread.
- 2 Sequins are best held firm with either a French knot worked through the sequin hole, or by working a couple of stitches out from the centre hole over to the edge of the sequin, like spokes, as we did with ours.



- Zweigart\* 14-count white aida measuring 30x35cm (11¾x13¾in)
- Stranded cotton as listed in the key
- Seguins from Josy Rose\* as listed in the key
- Size 24 tapestry needle
- Frame of your choice with a minimum aperture of 20x25cm (73/4x10in)

There aren't kits, sadly, but there's a number of masterpiece-inspired cross stitch patterns. Unfortunately, 'Rain Steam and Speed' isn't in the current selection, but you may like 'The Grand Canal' instead, as a 33-page PDF download chart for US\$4.72 (approx. £3.78).

# Seeking vintage inspiration

I was recently reading your issue 243, and I love the 'Vintage Glamour' project. It's by Elliot Bennett and the article also mentioned his greeting card designs. # Stopping eye strain

I don't wear glasses, but my optician has suggested I use a magnifier as my eyes often get tired and sore when I stitch. I tried a stitching magnifier which I had to wear around my neck, but I just couldn't get on with it. Have you got any recommendations?

A John says: It sounds like our illuminated magnifier glasses here at Foresight LED\* could be a good option for you, Eleana. Available in x1, x2 or x3 magnification, our high-quality glasses will be handy to help with reducing your eye strain. We specifically recommend them for crafters, not least because they have built-in LED lights on

the sides of the lenses, to provide naturally white light. Look out for the stylish finishes in black, tortoise-shell, glitzy pink and dusky pink, priced £14.99. Each pair has its own storage case and batteries are included – plus a spare set of batteries worth £3.99. And if your prescription changes, we also have a clip-on LED light option to attach to prescribed glasses.

Q I want to stitch 'Colourful Christmas' by Durene Jones, from your issue 235 (Christmas 2015), but I can't locate a frame in the size or colour shown. Can you help me find a source for it before I start my project? Thank you!

We take care to choose the perfect A Katie says: We take care to choose the personal finishing touches for our projects, so it's good to hear they're appreciated! For any specific frames (or fabrics etc), that are readily available on the high street or online, we'll feature those details in our project Shopping Lists, but often, a professional picture framer will custom-make frames for us.

This was certainly the case for this design. Hopefully your local framer can help with a wide variety of frame mouldings and colours, so you can choose the perfect finishes you need for any project. Also, watch out for pictures in charity shops and at car boot sales – it doesn't matter what the picture is as you can easily repurpose, and even paint, the frame to suit!

# Copyright conundrum

Would it be breaking copyright to convert designs from your mag into bags or cards and then sell them at craft fairs? Michaela Newman, via email

A Ruth says: We know lots of stitchers enjoy making projects to sell for themselves or for charity fund-raising, so we've agreed with the designers (the copyright holders) that you can do this. It has to be on a small scale only - no mass production – and with appropriate credit given with the items sold. So, you could credit on the back of the item, or on a labelled tag: 'Hand stitched by Michaela, with kind permission of XXXXX <insert designer name> on behalf of The World of Cross Stitching magazine, Immediate Media Co'. Hope this helps!



I'm worried my fluffy Rainbow Gallery Wisper thread will get damaged if I wash it - have you got any advice?

A Gallery Wisper thread is 70% kid mohair and 30% nylon, and is designed to be hand washable, but we advise washing a small test piece first, prior to your finished stitching. Use a gentle or no-rinse detergent and leave to dry flat on a fluffy towel.

# QWICK Q&A

L oved the Christmas chart book (issue 248), and the metallic threads! How many strands does the Madeira thread divide into?

## Avril Spence, via Facebook

Ruth says: It's great to hear you're enjoying making a head start on this year's festive projects!

I love using those threads – give the end of your thread length a gentle 'untwist' between your fingertips and it'll start by dividing into four strands. Just use one of these to stitch. Each one of those threads can untwist and fray, and will do so with wear-and-tear, so keep your lengths short to minimise that fraying!



Stitching with metallics Leave a slightly longer tail than usual as metallic threads are more likely to slip and break free

ow do you go about washing projects? I've never washed any of mine but I have heard it's a good idea to do so! Lindsey Walton, via Facebook

Katriel says: We always recommending giving your finished cross stitching a wash to freshen it up and remove any stains, including natural oils from your hands. Plus, softening the fibres will help to shift any creases from your hoop or stitching frame. Visit www.cross-stitching.com/faq/washing for tips for washing your stitching!

# **TECHNIQUE FOCUS**

# Baffled about blending

In the pattern I'm following, the key shows two thread numbers listed together next to each other. Do I have to do two stitches in the same aida block? Or is it one part of the stitch in one colour and one in the other colour? I've never seen this before and there aren't any instructions. **Kerry-mae Jacksonville, West Yorkshire** 

A Fiona says: Don't worry Kerry-mae, this is not as tricky as you'd think! The technique the designer wants you to use is called blending (sometimes called tweeding). Rather than the solutions you've suggested, it's actually the case that you thread one strand of each colour in the needle at the same time. So, instead of the usual two strands of a single colour (when stitching on a 14-count aida fabric), you use one of each of the different shades. Then you just stitch in the same way as usual.

The result is a subtly mottled effect of the two colours combined. It's useful for creating a naturally blended look, say for an animal's fur or maybe for foliage, to give a more varied effect to the stitches. Or, another widely used option is to blend together one length of stranded cotton, and one of a metallic thread (or blending filament) for a delicate shimmer.

The only thing you won't be able to do, of course, is to use the loop start method for starting off the colour, as there's no loop! Instead, just run the end of your thread securely at the back of a few other nearby stitches. This will secure the tail neatly before starting off with stitches corresponding to that blended symbol. Good luck with the design!


# mount an aperture card

1 Trim the fabric so that it's a little smaller than the card and place the aperture over the aida to position the design. Mark where the aperture edges will be on the aida with pins. 2 Turn the card over and stick double-sided tape around the aperture. Using the pins as a guide, place the card back over your fabric and attach. 3 Insert a piece of white paper behind the aida, and then fix down the card flap with double-sided tape.

Durene says: Thanks for your request, Doreen. We've also had several other Staffie design requests. including from Natascha and her faithful friend Molly, and also from Dee Hunt. I must say I've always had a bit of a soft spot for Staffies myself - they can be so friendly and affectionate, can't they? And thanks for sending in such a gorgeous photo. It was really helpful in capturing this cute canine's cheeky little face.

I designed this chart using mainly whole cross stitches, with some backstitch to add definition to the dog's outline and to the grass in the foreground. You could mount your finished design onto some patterned green paper, as we've shown here, and then patch it onto a card, or you could put it in a simple wooden frame.

I hope your daughter is pleased with this sweet design - and happy stitching!



# Stitching where the poppies blow

Francophile Jean wowed friends and fellow volunteers with her impressive stitched masterpiece

e all love the sense of achievement that comes with completing a big project, but for stitcher Jean Cosgrove it felt extra-special as she finished the final stitch on her five-vear WIP (Work-In-Progress), 'In Flanders Field'.

"This pattern was designed and sold exclusively in aid of The Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal - and when I saw it I knew I just had to do it," says Jean. "My maternal grandfather survived both the Boer War and World War I, and my father was in the RAF at the start of World War II and lost a leg in France."

In the five years it took Jean to stitch 'In Flanders Field', she also completed an impressive 21 other projects, as well as lots of cards, "I love stitching presents for special occasions," she says. "My fave thing about cross stitching is starting a new project and seeing it grow - and the most challenging thing is knowing when to stop and take a break!"

But cross stitching wasn't the only thing keeping Jean busy during those five years - she and her husband, Chris, are volunteers for The War

Graves Photographic Project, which records photographs of war graves and memorials around the world, so that there is a visual record of the final resting places of soldiers. Jean and Chris go on holiday to France twice a year, where they take photos of individual named gravestones in cemeteries near to where they stay.

It was during a holiday in northern France, very close to the Flanders Fields area of Belgium, that Jean

> finally finished her big project. "Once I started stitching the poem, I couldn't stop until I'd finished!" she says. "My shoulders were





aching but it was definitely worth it." One of the best bits was other people's reactions to the piece. Jean's framer was so impressed with her



project that she displayed it in her shop until Jean came to collect it! Her friends were also amazed - and as for the Project Coordinator of The War Graves Photographic Project, he was utterly delighted and it's now hanging in pride of place in his office.

So what's next for this intrepid stitcher? Between all the volunteering and card-making, at the moment Jean is finishing off a classic-style map of France stitched on evenweave. "I've no other definite projects in mind – but I have a fave cross stitch shop in Bruges. so if we go there I may find something which shouts out. 'Stitch me!'"

Then, slip it all off the card and form the 'knot' of the tassel by tightly wrapping more stranded cotton around the top. Secure by tying the ends, and weaving the thread ends neatly into the knot itself, before trimming closely.



**3** Use sharp scissors to snip through the bottom loops of all the stranded cotton threads. Trim, and make sure there are no loose threads, for a neat finish.

# TOP TIP Take your time over the backstitch, not pulling the stitches overly tight, to ensure the neatness and accuracy of the finished design

## How to ...

## add backstitch to your design

When you've finished all the cross stitches, load your needle with one strand of dark grey thread. Following the backstitch line on the chart, make your stitches as in this diagram. Bring your needle up at 1, down at 2 then back up at 3, stitching in a two-stepsforward, one-step-back motion. Keep it neat by using short lengths, to prevent them fuzzing up with wear.







# How to...

Beginner? Follow Fiona's guide to instant stitching success!



#### **CHOOSE YOUR** ESSENTIALS...

Start with these must-have items

Begin with either aida or evenweave. Aida is best for beginners, with regular woven blocks and obvious holes. It's stiffer than evenweave, but will soften slightly as you work. 14-count aida is the most common. It's harder to work fractional stitches on aida, as you'll need to make an extra hole in the fabric, in the centre of the aida block.

Evenweave is a lovely fabric to work on when you have a little more experience. The fibres aren't woven in blocks as with aida, so it's softer and the fine weave has more threads-per-inch - the most commonly used is 28-count. One stitch is usually worked over two threads of the fabric so it has an equivalent design size of 14-count aida. Cross stitching fractional stitches is easier on evenweave, as there's a central hole spare so you don't need to split a block as for aida.



#### 2. THREADS

at www.cross-stitching.com

You'll need stranded cotton - this coloured thread comes in 8m skeins and is made up of six strands. The count of your fabric will determine the number of strands you use in your needle. Typically for 14-count aida you'll use two strands for cross stitch and just one strand for backstitch. This is indicated in the key or instructions for your project. There are three main brands - DMC. Anchor and Madeira - which are all smooth and easy





to stitch with, and are colourfast to 95°C. Cheaper brands are available, but they're less durable and may not be colourfast.

#### 3. NEEDLES

To cross stitch, use a tapestry needle. which has a blunt tip and larger eye than a regular sewing needle. It easily passes through the fibres of aida and evenweave. Different needle sizes are available, with varying lengths and widths, so choose the best for your fabric - see our handy guide. Other needles are useful too... try a fine beading needle for adding bead accents. You may also prefer a sharp-tipped embroidery (or crewel) needle to split aida blocks when stitching fractional stitches.

#### START CROSS STITCHING...

Make sure you hit the mark first time, every time with our top tips!

X Choose your project... With our Factbox guide in every one of our projects, you can make sure you choose the right level for you. Absolute beginners should aim for a design without fractional stitches.

Buy your materials... To make sure your design looks great, use our Shopping List for each project, which specifies everything needed, like size of fabric and finishing materials. Using another fabric with different HPI, will give a different finished size of design. Calculate your fabric requirements like this: Stitch count divided by HPI of 'new' fabric choice = new size in inches. Add at least 10cm (4in) on each dimension to allow for mounting, or less for cards.

Get ready... We always recommend starting in the centre of a design and working outwards. Our charts are marked with two centre arrows so find a symbol close to the centre and begin there.

**# Get set...** Find the corresponding centre of your fabric by folding in half and half again. The point where the folds cross corresponds to the centre so this is where your central stitch should go.

**Get stitching...** Begin your stitches in two strands of thread with a loop start for the neatest way to get going. It uses one double-length (80cm) strand with both ends threaded together. See our diagrams for how to stitch. Finish threads by weaving the leftover 'tail' under a few stitches at the back.






